THE Queen has been graciously pleased to grant unto Charles Rice Parker Hodgson, of Copt Hall, in the parish of Hendon, in the county of Middlesex, Gentleman, and to Mary Nicoll, his wife, only child and heir of Thomas Nicoll, late of Copt Hall aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, Her Royal licence and authority, that they may, in compliance with an injunction contained in the last will and testament of the said Thomas Nicoll, henceforth take and use the surname of Nicoll in addition to and after that of Hodgson, and that he, the said Charles Rice Parker Hodgson, may bear the arms of Nicoll quarterly with those of Hodgson, and that such surnames and arms may, in like manner, be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And further to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding " of benefices in plurality, and to make better "provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, " hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts " may be separated from the parishes or mother "churches to which they belong, with great " advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial "may in some instances with advantage be " annexed to parishes or districts to which they are "contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to "his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of "any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place or district within the diocese of such Arch-"bishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the " case may be, may be advantageously separated

" from any parish or mother church and either be

"constituted a separate benefice by itself or be " united to any other parish to which it may be "more conveniently annexed, or to any other "adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to "form a separate parish or benefice, or that "any extra-parochial place may with advantage "be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate " parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said "Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme "in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be "transmitted to the said Archbishop for his "consideration) describing the mode in which it "appears to him that the alteration may best be " effected, and how the changes consequent on " such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-"diction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, "and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, "may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the "benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or "their hands to such scheme, or to such modifica-"tion thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full " consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any "such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall " certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, " by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall "be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make "an Order for carrying such scheme, or modifica-" tion thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to "make better provision for the assignment of "Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels "augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of "Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That when "by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as " aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical pur-"poses is constituted, the same shall, on regis-"tration thereof, and with the consent in writing " of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice "or benefices to be thereby affected, become a " perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister "thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, "and his successors, shall be a body politic and "corporate, with perpetual succession, and may " receive and take to himself and his successors " all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges,

"and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him
"or them, and such perpetual curate shall thence"forth have within the limits of the district
"parish formed under the Church Building Acts,
"for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole
"and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in
"anywise be subject to the control or interference
"of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice
"or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he
"or they shall have consented to such Order as
"aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Salisbury hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Revd. Edward White, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Salisbury do hereby represent to your Grace that to the benefice (being a vicarage) of Gillingham in the county of Dorset and my diocese of Salisbury belongs (amongst other places) the chapelry of Motcombe the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That according to the last census the population of the parish of Gillingham exclusive of the said chapelry is 3,909 and the population of the

said chapelry is 1411.

"That there is in the said chapelry the church or chapel of Motcombe, distant from the parish church of the said benefice of Gillingham $(3\frac{1}{2})$ miles or thereabouts and there is also within the said chapelry of Motcombe a church or chapel at a place called Enmore Green distant from the church or chapel of Motcombe (2) miles or thereabouts.

"That the said chapelry of Motcombe is a separate parish for civil purposes. It is separately rated for the relief of the poor and has its own churchwardens.

"That Divine service baptisms marriages churchings and burials have been from time immemorial, and are now, performed solemnized and celebrated by the vicar of the said benefice or his curate in the church or chapel of Motcombe and in the burial-ground thereto belonging and also in the church or chapel of Enmore Green since the year 1843 when it was erected.

"That the net annual value of the said benefice with the said chapelry is £1,437 or thereabouts of which £553 pounds or thereabouts arises in respect of the endowment of or within the said

chapelry.

"That the benefice of Gillingham is subject to a mortgage to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for securing the sum of £1,356 and interest.

"That there is a house of residence in course of erection at Gillingham and there is a small piece of glebe land with a cottage upon it which is unfit for the residence of a clergyman at

Motcombe.

"That the patronage of the said benefice of Gillingham belongs to me as Bishop of Salisbury in right of my See and the Reverend Edward Inman is the present incumbent of the said benefice.

"That in the event of the said chapelry being separated as hereinafter proposed from the said benefice of Gillingham and constituted a separate benefice the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England are willing to grant to such separate benefice the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum out of their common fund (or tithe rent-charge producing that sum) for the augmentation of the endowment of the said separate benefice and also to secure a capital sum of

one thousand five hundred pounds towards the provision of a parsonage-house, for the same.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the sessions holden in the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her present Majesty cap. 106 and in the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign cap. 49 the said chapelry of Motcombe may be advantageously separated from the said benefice and parish church of Gillingham and constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the 26th section of the said first mentioned Act, I have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto, of myself as patron, and the incumbent of the said benefice I do submit to your Grace, to the intent that your Grace may, if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme, certify the same and such consents, by your report to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the Scheme and Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That the said chapelry of Motcombe shall be separated from the said benefice and parish church of Gillingham and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of the perpetual curacy of Motcombe and Enmore Green, of which the church or chapel at Motcombe shall be the parish church.

"That the proposed separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefice of Gillingham and the incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits

of the same.

"That there shall be attached to the said proposed separate parish and benefice as part of the endowment thereof such portion of the vicarial tithe rent-charge belonging to the said benefice of Gillingham as is particularly described and set forth in the first schedule hereunder written and also the small piece of glebe land with the cottage upon it referred to in the above written representation particularly described in the second schedule hereunder written.

c: That all fees and other emoluments dues and payments for churchings, marriages, burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said proposed separate parish and benefice shall belong to the incumbent thereof.

"That the parishioners of the said proposed separate parish shall not be entitled to accommodation in any other church than the churches situate within the limits of the said proposed separate benefice, nor shall the parishioners of Gillingham be entitled to any accommodation in the churches or chapels situate within the said proposed separate benefice.

"That the patronage or right of nomination to the said proposed separate benefice shall be vested in the Lord Bishop of Salisbury his successors and

assigns for ever.

"That the said benefice of Gillingham and the endowments thereof shall with the consent of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne remain and be exclusively liable to and be charged with the payment of the sum of £1,356 and interest mentioned in the said representation in exoneration of the said separate benefice of Motcombe with Enmore Green and the emoluments thereof.

"That to the benefice (being a vicarage) of Gillingham in the county of Dorset and diocese of Salisbury belongs (amongst other places) the chapelry of Motcombe the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is in the said chapelry the church or chapel of Motcombe distant from the parish church of the said benefice of Gillingham three and a half miles or thereabouts and there is also within the said chapelry of Motcombe a church or chapel at a place called Enmore Green distant from the church or chapel of Motcombe two miles or thereabouts.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelry of Motcombe may be advantageously separated from the said benefice and parish church of Gillingham and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.
