The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Glasbury in the diocese of Saint Davids between that benefice and the benefice (being a vicarage) of All Saints, Glasbury, in the same diocese.

"Whereas the parish of Glasbury, being the parish in respect of which the vicar of the said benefice of Glasbury has cure of souls is situate partly in the county of Radnor, in the Principality of Wales, and partly in the county of Brecknock, in the same Principality, and wholly in the said diocese of Saint Davids.

"And whereas the new parish of All Saints, Glasbury, being the new parish in respect of which the vicar of the said benefice of All Saints, Glasbury, has cure of souls, was created by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and published in the London Gazette on the day following and the same new parish was created a district chapelry and was taken wholly out of the parish of Glasbury aforesaid and out of that part of the same parish which is situate on the northern side of the River Wye.

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Davids is in right of his See the patron of the said benefice of Glasbury and also of the said benefice of All Saints, Glasbury.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of All Saints, Glasbury, is at present insufficiently endowed and that the endowments of the said benefice of Glasbury when supplemented by certain augmentation grants which we have undertaken to make to the said benefice out of our common fund after the apportionment of the same endowments which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall have been effected and shall have come into operation will notwithstanding such apportionment be of adequate amount.

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Basil now Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Davids is of opinion and we also are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of All Saints, Glasbury aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Glasbury which is hereinafter mentioned and is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Glasbury is now vacant.

"And whereas it is intended that the apportionment hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect immediately.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Archbishop of Canterbury the Archbishop of the Province within which the said diocese of Saint Davids is situate and with the consent of the Right Reverend William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Davids acting as patron as aforesaid of the said benefice of Glasbury and of the said benefice of All Saints Glasbury and also acting as Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Davids (in testimony of which consent they the said Archbishop and Bishop have respectively signed this scheme and sealed the same with their episcopal seals) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the following apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Glasbury shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and such duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same as aforesaid take place that is to say First All those the apportioned tithe rent-charges belonging to the said benefice of Glasbury which arise within the limits of the said new parish of All Saints Glasbury shall be severed from the said benefice of Glasbury and shall be annexed to and belong to the said benefice of All Saints, Glasbury, which said apportioned tithe rent-charges amount in all to one hundred and fifty-seven pounds six shillings per annum or thereabouts and the particulars of which said apportioned tithe rent-charges are set out in the first part of the schedule to this scheme appended and Secondly All that messuage or dwelling-house being the old vicarage house of the said benefice of Glasbury situate within the said new parish of All Saints Glasbury, which is more particularly described in the second part of the said schedule to this scheme appended shall in like manner be severed from the said benefice of Glasbury and shall be annexed to and belong to the said benefice of All Saints, Glasbury, as part of the endowments of the same benefice and not as the vicarage house thereof All which said endowments of the said benefice of Glasbury so proposed to be transferred and annexed to the said benefice of All Saints Glasbury as aforesaid that is to say the said tithe rent-charges mentioned in the first part of the said schedule with the lands out of which they issue or arise and the said messuage or dwelling-house as the same is described in the second part of the same schedule are delineated on the plan to this scheme also appended which plan as well as this scheme is sealed with our common seal.

"And we further recommend and propose that the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of All Saints Glasbury shall as to all the tithe rent-charges land, and hereditaments to be annexed to his benefice as hereinbefore mentioned have all such rights and powers of ownership in respect of the same as are now enjoyed by the incumbent of the said benefice of Glasbury.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Poor Law Conferences.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions in England and Wales for the time being;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Section 2 of the Poor Law Conferences Act, 1883, contains the following enactment;

"The Guardians of any Union may, when empowered by and subject to any regulations made by the Local Government Board (which regulations the said Board is hereby authorised from time to time to make, vary, or rescind), pay the reasonable expenses of any Guardian or Guardians, or Clerk to the Guardians, incurred in attending any conference of Guardians held for the purpose of discussing any matter which is connected with the duties which devolve on them, and any reasonable expenses incurred in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such conference, and may charge the amount to their Common Fund, or, if they have no Common Fund, to the Fund under their control."

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board do, by this Our Order, empower the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions in England and Wales to pay the reasonable expenses incurred in attending any such conference as is mentioned in the above-recited Section, and in purchasing reports of the proceedings of any such conference, subject to the following regulations:

- (1.) The expenses incurred in attending a conference shall only be paid in respect of attendance at the Central Conference held in London, or at a Conference convened for a

District including the Union from which the persons attending as representatives are sent, and held at a place distant not more than one hundred miles from such Union.

- (2.) The attendance at any conference of a Guardian, or Guardians, or the Clerk to the Guardians of any Union, shall be expressly authorised by a resolution passed at a meeting of the Guardians of such Union, a written or printed notice that the proposal is to be considered at that meeting having been sent, by post or otherwise, to each Guardian not less than four days prior to the date of the meeting; and where the attendance of more than one Guardian is authorised, the number of Guardians authorised to attend shall be specified in the resolution.
- (3.) The maximum number of Guardians authorised to attend any conference shall be three, and in the case of the Central Conference held in London only one Guardian shall be authorised to attend from any Union which is at a distance of more than fifty miles from the place of meeting.
- (4.) The number of copies which may be purchased by the Guardians of any Union of the Report of the Central Conference, or of any conference for a District including the Union, shall be such as the Guardians of the Union may, by resolution, determine.

In this Order—

The expression "Union" means a union of Parishes under a General or Local Act with a separate Board of Guardians, and includes a parish for which there is a separate Board of Guardians.

The expression "Guardians" means Guardians appointed under the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834, and the Acts amending the same, and includes Guardians or other body of persons performing under any Local Act the like functions as Guardians under the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834.
