## UNION OF THE SEPARATE PRESIDENCIES OF SAINT CHRISTOPHER AND NEVIS.

IN virtue of an Act of the Governor and General Legislative Council of the Leeward Islands, No. 2, of 1882, the separate Presidencies of Saint Christopher and Nevis, consisting of the Islands of Saint Christopher, Nevis, and Anguilla, with their respective dependencies, now form one Presidency, called the Presidency of Saint Christopher and Nevis:

The Queen has therefore been pleased to direct Letters Patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, for amending the Letters Patent bearing date the 2nd day of December, 1881, constituting the office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Leeward Islands, and for making provision for the government of the United Presidency of Saint Christopher and Nevis.
