## ENGLAND AND WALES AND SCOTLAND, MOVEMENT INTO DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1883, AMENDMENT.

**THE** Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this

behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 3 (*Regulations by Local Authorities in England and Wales and Scotland*) of THE ENGLAND AND WALES AND SCOTLAND, MOVEMENT INTO DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1883 is hereby revoked; and the following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of that Article, and shall be deemed to be Article 3 of that Order (namely):

*Regulations by Local Authorities in England and Wales and Scotland.*

3.—(a.) Notwithstanding anything in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, any Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland may, with the view of preventing the introduction of foot-and-mouth disease into their District, make, from time to time, Regulations for prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of animals, or any specified kind of animals, into their District from the District of any other Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland or Ireland:

(b.) Provided, as follows:

(i.) This Order does not authorize a Local Authority to make a Regulation affecting movement of animals into an Infected Place or an Infected Circle or an Infected Area; and

(ii.) Any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Order shall not restrict movement of animals by Railway through the District of that Local Authority.

2. Notwithstanding anything in Article 5 (*Interpretation*) of THE ENGLAND AND WALES AND SCOTLAND, MOVEMENT INTO DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1883, the term Animals shall for the purposes of that Order include cattle (that is, bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, and calves), and sheep, and goats, and swine.

3. This Order may be cited as THE ENGLAND AND WALES AND SCOTLAND, MOVEMENT INTO DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1883, AMENDMENT.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Movement of Breeding Rams into Place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.*

1. Notwithstanding anything in Article 18 (*Place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease*) of The Animals Order, Rams not affected with foot-and-mouth disease may be moved into a place infected with foot-and-mouth disease for the purpose of the breeding of sheep, but for no other purpose, in accordance with the following Regulations and not otherwise:

(i.) For the movement into the infected place there must be a Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the infected place is situate.

(ii.) The Rams so moved shall be moved into the infected place under the direction and in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority.

*Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.*

2.—(1.) Every person in charge of a Ram being moved under this Order, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a Constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or Constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Offences.*

3.—(1.) If a Ram is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the Ram, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the Ram, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a Ram being moved under this Order, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

*Interpretation.*

4. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

*Commencement.*

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

#### (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

**Anglesey.**—In the parish of Holyhead, in the county of Anglesey, bounded on the south by the road leading from Towyn Penrhos towards Llanfawr, on the south-west by the road leading from the Llanfawr-road to Black Bridge where the same joins the Turkey Shore road, on the north partly by the Turkey Shore-road and partly by the sea, and on the east by the sea.

**Bedfordshire.**—(1.) The parishes of Potsgrove, Battlesden, Milton Bryant, Eversholt, Hockliffe, Tilsworth, Toddington, Houghton Regis, Tingrith, and Chalgrave, in the county of Bedford.

(2.) The parishes of Aspley Guise, Husbayne-Crawley, Ridgmount, Steppingley, Liddington, Marston Moretaine, Wootton, Kempston, Stagsden, Woburn, Bromham, Oakley, Biddenham, Stevington, Hulcote, and Flitwick, in the county of Bedford.

(3.) The parishes of Melchbourne, Yelden, and Dean, in the county of Bedford.

(4.) The parishes of Streatley, and Sundon, in the county of Bedford.

(5.) The parishes of Pertenhall, and Keysoe, in the county of Bedford.

(6.) The parishes of Poddington, Wymington, and Farndish, in the county of Bedford.

(7.) The parish of Maulden, in the county of Bedford.

(8.) The parish of Ravensden, in the county of Bedford.

**Berkshire.**—The whole of the parish of Sunninghill, in the county of Berks, and that portion of the parish of Old Windsor, in the said county, lying between Sunninghill parish on the south-east and the boundary of the county of Surrey so far as the Bridge at Virginia Water, thence north-west along the Green Ride, by Drill Shed, to the Spring, thence to Woods Pond, thence south-west to the Crispin, and along the Ascot-road to the boundary of Sunninghill parish at the north-west corner.

**Buckinghamshire.**—(1.) So much of the county of Buckingham as is situate on the northward and eastward of the main-road commencing in and leading through part of the town of Newport Pagnell and thence on to Northampton, and so much of the same county as is situate on the northward of the road commencing in and leading through part of the town of Newport Pagnell and from thence through the village of North Crawley to Cranfield Gate in the county of Bedford.

(2.) In the county of Buckingham comprising the whole of the parishes of Leckhamstead, Foscott, and Thornton, and so much of the parish of Thornborough as lies to the northward and north-westward of the river Ouse.

**Cambridgeshire.**—(1.) The whole of the parish of Caxton, in the county of Cambridge.

(2.) The whole of that portion of the borough of Cambridge lying and being on the south side of the river Cam.

(3.) The whole of the parishes of Swavesey, and Fen Drayton, in the county of Cambridge.

(4.) The whole of the parish of Cherry Hinton, in the county of Cambridge.

(5.) So much of the parish of Foxton, in the county of Cambridge, as is bounded by the high-road to Cambridge towards the north, by the Offa brook towards the east, by the village-street of Foxton towards the south, and by the highway leading from Foxton village to the Railway-station towards the west.

**Liberty of the Isle of Ely.**—The whole of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely.

**Cheshire.**—(1.) In the petty sessional division of Nantwich, in the county of Chester, commencing at the junction of the boundary of the borough of Crewe with the Chester and Crewe Railway, by the Chester and Crewe Railway to the Nantwich and Middlewich high-road, by road past Marshfield Bank, Beam Bridge, Henhull, to The Bank, Chester and Shropshire Union Canal, by the said Canal to the junction of the road leading to Baddiley, thence by road to Ravensmoor Bank, Haddington Bank to Shrew Bridge, by the river Weaver and Artle brook to Howbeck Bridge, thence by road leading through Walgherton by Woore-road to Cliff, thence by Ellesmere to Chorlton, by the London and North-Western Railway to the boundary of Crewe borough, and by the said boundary to the junction of the same with the Chester and Crewe Railway aforesaid.

(2.)
