THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

An Area comprising the whole of the Rotherham District of the Upper Strathforth and Tickhill petty sessional division in the West Riding of the county of York.

1. The limits of the following Places which are declared by orders of the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Bedford to be Places infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—(1.) Bull's Close, Inn farm, (2.) the field called Crow Slade, Crow Field farm, (3.) Crow Field farm buildings, and (4.) Grange farm, all in the occupation of James West Scorer, in the parish of Melchbourne,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately

after the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
