AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 10th day of October, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—in the petty sessional division of Hyde, in the county of Chester, commencing at the Bridge at Mossley Bottom, along the river bank to Dark-lane, along Dark-lane to the Manchester and Huddersfield high-road, along this road to Henshall-lane Corner, thence along the boundary of Stalybridge borough to the river Tame, and along the river bank to Mossley Bottom Bridge aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising so much of the parishes of Radipole, Fleet, Buckland Ripers, Chickereil, Portisham, Langton Herring, Broadway, Upway, Bincombe, Preston and Sutton Pointz, Melcombe Regis, Weymouth, and Wyke Regis, and other adjacent parishes in the county of Dorset, and in the borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis in the said county, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the coast at Fleet aforesaid continuing in a direct line to the highway at East Fleet, and from thence the road direct to Chickereil by the Well passing near Morn Villa and Rose Cottage in a direct route to Portisham, then the road branching out of the last-mentioned road on the right before the turning to Roddon, and continuing to Kellaways farm, Shilvinghampton, then taking the right hand turning to and through Coryates, thence the road passing by Friar Waddon farm direct to Upway and into the main-road from Weymouth to Dorchester by the Royal Oak Inn, from thence along the said main-road to a point where the road to Bincombe branches off, from thence the direct road to Bincombe village, then the Altar path from Bincombe to Toadmoor farm Cottages into, and along the direct-road to Sutton Pointz, and continuing from the last-mentioned road until the junction with the main-road from Warmwell Cross to Weymouth at or near the Ship Inn at Preston, and from the Ship Inn aforesaid in a direct line to the sea, the coast from this point to the point at East Fleet aforesaid completing the boundary of the Area.

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council dated the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincoln-

shire,—is, except such portions thereof as are included in the Areas described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the whole of the parishes of Addlethorpe, Burgh-le-Marsh, Bratoft, Croft, Ingoldmells, Irby, Orby, Skegness, Thorpe, Winthorpe, and Wainfleet, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire; (2.) the whole of the parishes of Brinkhill, and Driby, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire; (3.) the whole of the parishes of Bolingbroke, Hagnaby, East Kirkby, West Keal, and Stickford, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire; (4.) the whole of the parishes of East Ville, and Sibsey, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire; (5.) the whole of the parishes of Spilsby, and Toynton, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire; and (6.) the whole of the parishes of Great Steeping, and Little Steeping, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire,—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of London as a Foreign Animals Wharf:

All that space known as the Foreign Cattle Market belonging to the Corporation of London, situate on the Banks of the River Thames at Deptford, occupying an area of twenty-six acres

or thereabouts, formerly part of the Royal Dock Yard at Deptford, bounded, northward by a wall extending from the Victoria-road to the River Thames and separating such Market from the Royal Victualling Yard, eastward by the River Thames, southward by a wall extending from the River Thames to Dock-street, and separating such Market from Old King-street, Orchard-place, and Dock-street, south-eastward by a wall separating such Market from Dock-street and Princes-street, and westward by a wall extending from Princes-street to the Victoria-road before-mentioned and separating such Market from lands and premises belonging to William John Evelyn, Esquire, together with the three Piers projecting therefrom into the River Thames; which space is edged pink on the plan of the Foreign Cattle Market deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the City of London.

The following Area declared by Order of Council dated the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the lands lying within the Pevensey, Willington, and Westham Levels, the whole of that portion of the parish of Hailsham lying within the Liberty of Pevensey, and all that part of the parish of Herstmonceux, including the whole of the Hobney's, which lies within the said Liberty of Pevensey, in the county of Sussex,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Area (namely),—so much of the county of Sussex as is comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the White Ditch by Broad Wall to Horseye Bridge, from Horseye Bridge by the highroad to Rickney, from Rickney by the highroad to Chilly, from Chilly by the highroad to Broadwater in Pevensey, thence by the Haven to Does Corner, thence by the Haven to Wartling Hill, thence by the boundary of the Pevensey Marsh to Herstmonceux, thence by the road to Newbridge, thence by the road known as the Marshfoot Wall to the boundary of the said Marsh, and thence by the boundary of the said Marsh to White Ditch aforesaid,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

NAVAL UNIFORM.

THE following is the description of the Uniform Great Coat, which, in pursuance of Her Majesty's pleasure, may be worn by Officers of the Royal Navy over Full Dress and other Uniform, and which is substituted for the Great Coat hitherto authorised:—

Blue Milled Cloth. Length—to come to 14 inches from the ground. Double breasted, six uniform Buttons on each side, the bottom button not to come below the level of the hip, two pockets with flaps across the skirt in front of the hip. A plait down the back with an opening at the bottom 18 inches long with a fly, and four small plain buttons. A cloth strap behind with a button hole at each end, eight inches apart, and two corresponding Uniform Buttons to confine the waist to required size. Stand and fall collar, with hook and eye in collar seam. Edges of coat to be double stitched.
