**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole space in the hamlet of Walton and township of Aylesbury, in the county of Buckingham, lying between the Tring-road, the Walton-road, Walton-street, and Exchange-street, and also the whole of the said Walton-road, and so much of the said Walton-street as leads from the said Walton-road to the said Exchange-street,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fourth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Note from the Chargé d'Affaires of Austria-Hungary, intimating that the quarantine of observation of ten days imposed in that country on arrivals from ports of the Ottoman Empire is now maintained only against arrivals from Egypt and Turkish Arabia, and that the quarantine against other Ottoman ports of Asia and Africa has been reduced to twenty-four hours.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translations of Maritime Sanitary Ordinances issued by the Government of Italy :—

#### 1883.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH. No. 14.

THE Ministry of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20th, 1865, cap. C., on Public Health, and to the Ministerial Instructions of December 26th, 1871, since it has been confirmed by official information that the sanitary conditions of the Islands of Malta and Cyprus, the city of Smyrna, and the whole of Syria, are in a satisfactory state, decrees :—

ART. 1. The quarantine of observation now in force for ships arriving from the above places with a clean bill of health during the voyage, whatever may have been its duration, is reduced from to-day to 24 hours, during which time the sanitary measures prescribed by Art. 133 of the Ministerial Instructions must be fulfilled, with the exception of the unloading of the cargo.

The same treatment will be also applied to the vessels from those places which are at present anchored in quarantine in our ports.

ART. 2. Until further orders, the importation of scraps, rags, and unwashed old clothes from the above-mentioned places continues to be forbidden.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

#### 1883.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH. No. 15.

THE Minister of the Interior, with reference to the law of March 20th, 1865, chapter C., on Public Health, and to the Ministerial Instructions of December 26th, 1871, since it has been confirmed

by official information that the sanitary condition of Egypt, and all the ports situated beyond the Suez Canal is notably bettered, decrees :—

ART 1. The quarantine on ships arriving from ports and harbours on the Suez Canal, or beyond it, shall from this day be fixed at ten days whatever the length of the voyage, so long as they arrive without having had a case of sickness.

ART. 2. No change is made for these arrivals in the dispositions relative to the treatment of cargo, as laid down in the Ordinance, No. 9, of the 3rd of July last.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man to Wit.

**W**HEREAS by Section 2 of "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of any two members of the Council, by an Order, in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among the cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle.

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called the foot-and-mouth disease prevails amongst animals in certain places beyond this Isle.

And whereas by Order dated the 20th day of August, 1883, in order to prevent the introduction of the said disease amongst Animals in this Isle, the importation of certain animals from the Port of Liverpool, was prohibited until the 1st day of October next, ensuing, and it is deemed advisable to extend such prohibition as regards importation from places beyond this Isle other than those hereinafter mentioned.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do, therefore, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of the powers given by the said Act, hereby order that no bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, swine, or goat shall be imported into this Isle from and after the 1st day of October next, from any place beyond the same, other than Scotland; Silloth and Whitehaven in England; and Belfast, Dundrum, and Greenore, in Ireland.
