THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Telegram, dated 25th instant, from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Egypt:—

"Board of Health has decided that pilgrims returning this year from Mecca for countries beyond Egypt shall be allowed to pass through Canal in quarantine, without undergoing quarantine at the Egyptian quarantine stations in the Red Sea, but no trans-shipment of pilgrims will be allowed in Egyptian ports. The Egyptian pilgrims for Egypt will have to undergo quarantine at Moses Well before entering the country."
