AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 17th day of November, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Snelland, in the petty sessional division of Wragby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

The following Area declared by Order of Council dated the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the petty sessional division of Calceworth, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the petty sessional division of Calceworth, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, with the exception of the parishes of Huttoft, Anderby, Cumberworth, Farlthorpe, and Mumby (the hamlet of Chapel excepted),—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
