Worcester Bromyard and Hereford Railway.

(Incorporation of Company; Construction of Railways from the Worcester, Bromyard, and Leominster Railway to Hereford, to the Worcester and Hereford, the Shrewsbury and Hereford, and the Hereford, Hay, and Brecon Railways; Running Powers over the Worcester, Bromyard, and Leominster Railway; the Worcester and Hereford Railway of the Great Western Railway Company, the Shrewsbury and Hereford Railway of the London and North Western and Great Western Railway Company, and Brecon Railway of the Midland Railway Company, and portions of the Great Western Railway; Working Arrangements with the Great Western, the London and North Western, the Midland, and the Worcester, Bromyard, and Leominster Railway Companies, or one or more of them; Amendment of Acts.)
