**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Croft, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, —which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

so much of the parish of Stoneleigh, in the said county, as lies on the east of the public highway from Gibbet Hill to Worsley Bridge, and on the south of the public highway running from the last-mentioned road through Hill to or towards Baginton,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

(No. 351).—ENGLAND—EAST COAST.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 293 (1 and 3), of 2nd October, 1883, on intended alterations in the buoyage of Leman and Outer Dowsing Shoals.

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 9th November, 1883, that the following alterations have been made:—

(1.) Leman Shoal.—The North Leman 8 ft. buoy has been replaced by a 13 ft. conical buoy, chequered black and white, and surmounted with

staff and cage; the present buoy is moored just westward of the position of the old one, and lies in 7 fathoms at low water spring tides.

(2.) Outer Dowsing Shoal.—An 8 ft. can buoy, painted black and white in rings, named S.E. Dowsing has been placed on the south end of Outer Dowsing Shoal.

The buoy lies in 6 $\frac{3}{4}$  fathoms at low water spring tides, with Outer Dowsing Light-vessel bearing N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

NOTE.—There is a patch of 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  fathoms N. by  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. distant 1 $\frac{3}{10}$ th miles from S.E. Dowsing Buoy, and another of 3 fathoms on the same bearing, distant 1 $\frac{1}{10}$ th miles.

SOUTH-WEST COAST.

(1.) *Extent of Reef off Manna Point.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, that the reef off Manna Point, south-east of Benkoelen, extends seaward 3 miles from the shore.

##### CHINA SEA—CARIMATA STRAIT.

(2.) *Particulars of Florence Adelaide Reef.*

Also, on the authority of the Commander of H.N.M. Surveying-vessel "Hydrograaf," of the following description and position of Florence Adelaide Reef, Carimata Strait:—

This reef, composed of coral and stones, with 10 to 12 feet on it at low water, extends 3 $\frac{1}{4}$  cables in a north-east and south-west direction, with a breadth of 1 $\frac{3}{4}$  cables. To the northward it is steep-to, with depths of 17 and 20 fathoms over mud, at the distance of 1 $\frac{3}{4}$  cables; to the eastward at the distance of half a cable, there is a small detached sand patch with 6 fathoms on it; and farther eastward at the distance of 2 miles, depths of 13 and 15 fathoms over sand, were obtained, with 20 fathoms, mud bottom, close to; on the south side, it is steep-to, with 17 to 20 fathoms, sand and mud, at the distance of one mile.

## Brentford Local Board.

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Board under the powers conferred on them by "The Tramways Act, 1870."

1. *Bye-Laws—Extent of.*

The bye-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the West Metropolitan Tramways Company within the district of the said Board.

2. *Speed of Carriages.*

No carriage shall be driven at a less rate than four miles nor more than eight miles in the hour.

3. *Distance from the Carriages.*

No carriage shall be driven so as to follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than thirty yards along any portion of the line of tramway.

4. *Stopping for Passengers.*

Every driver or conductor of a carriage shall stop the same when required so to do by any passenger desirous of leaving the carriage, or by any person legally entitled to travel by the carriage, and for whom there is room.

5. *Stopping of Carriages.*

No carriage shall stop, except at passing places or terminal stations, or when necessary to preserve the distance required by the bye-law, No. 3, or when changing horses, or when required to take up or set down a passenger, and then no longer than is absolutely necessary.

6. *Interference with Traffic.*

No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the said tramway.

7. *Penalty.*

Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the above bye-laws or regulations, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence.

8. *Copy of Bye-laws.*

The conductor of each carriage shall carry with him a copy of these bye-laws, and shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to, and shall permit the same to be perused by, such passenger during the passage of the carriage, but shall not stop the carriage for such purpose. A printed copy of these bye-laws shall be affixed and kept affixed in the office of the Company, and in every waiting-room and other building of the Company, situate within the district of the said Board.

These bye-laws shall come into force on the 20th February, 1884.
