

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 10th day of *December, 1883*.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

SCHEDULE.

An Area at Epping Upland, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Boldings brook on the Epping Green road on the west, thence along the Garden fence on the right of the Epping Green-road to the fence adjoining Mr. Cripps, thence along the top of Ellis field to Great Hanplead field on the north, thence to the right by Gibbons spring to Boldings brook on the east, and from thence along the brook to the Epping Green-road aforesaid.

The following Area (namely),—the parish of Willoughby-with-Sloothby, in the petty sessional division of Calceworth, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

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1. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, with the exception of the parishes of Haddenham, Wilburton, Stretham,

Thetford, Witchford, Wentworth, and Grunty Fen,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, with the exception of the parishes of Haddenham, Wilburton, Stretham, Sutton, Thetford, Witchford, Wentworth, and Grunty Fen,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the parish of Keysoe, in the county of Bedford; (2.) the parish of Bletsoe, in the county of Bedford; and (3.) the parish of Hockliffe, in the county of Bedford,—which were declared by Orders of Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the parishes of Kempston, Stagsden, and Bromham, in the county of Bedford,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 4 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described in this Article, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the parishes of Husborne-Crawley, and Woburn, in the county of Bedford,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 5 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described in this Article, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

4. The following Area (namely),—the parishes of Kempston, and Stagsden, in the county of Bedford,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

5. The following Area (namely),—the parish of Husborne-Crawley, in the county of Bedford,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

6. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
