WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is (among other things) enacted that where the Board of Trade upon the application of any Local Authority from time to time represent to Her Majesty that it would be expedient to alter the fees taken in respect of the verification and stamping of weights and measures by the Inspectors of such authority under the said Act (whether specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act, or in any Order previously made under the 47th section of the said Act), or for the purpose of adapting those fees to the local standards provided by such authority, to add to the said fees, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, from time to time to alter or add to the said fees:

And whereas the Board of Trade have, upon the application of the Local Authority for the place named in Schedule A hereto annexed, represented to Her Majesty that it would be expedient to alter and add to the scale of fees taken in respect of such verification and stamping of weights and measures by the Inspectors of such Local Authority in the manner set forth in Schedule B hereto annexed:

And whereas it has been made to appear that the alterations and additions contained in the last-mentioned schedule are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to alter and add to the fees heretofore taken by the Inspectors of the Local Authority for the place named in Schedule A hereto annexed in the manner set forth in Schedule B hereto annexed; and the fees specified in the last-mentioned schedule shall be taken accordingly in lieu of the fees specified in the Fifth Schedule to the said Act.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the four hundred and tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that upon the completion of any new lighthouse (in which term are included floating and other lights exhibited for the guidance of ships) Her Majesty may by Order in Council fix such dues in respect thereof to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount thereof, and that such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions, in by and subject to which the light dues, authorised to be levied by the said Act, are paid and collected.

And whereas the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond have placed a Light-vessel at the Long Sand, near the entrance to the River Thames, and a light is already exhibited therefrom.

Now therefore Her Majesty in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the date of the present Order, there shall be paid in respect of the said Light-vessel for every ship, whether British or foreign, as aforesaid, the toll of two-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burden of every such ship for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an oversea voyage, and one-sixteenth of a penny per ton if on a coasting voyage.

The said toll shall be levied by the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond, subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the New Consolidated Tables of Light Dues sanctioned by Orders in Council dated respectively, the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in an Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and also in the special section of the Consolidated Tables sanctioned by Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned, and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of sixty per centum mentioned in such last-named Order in Council of the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being be in force.

And whereas the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond are about to place a new light vessel off the Point of Air, at the entrance to the River Dee, to be used in the place of the present lighthouse on the said Point, the light whereof is to be extinguished when the light of the new light vessel is exhibited:

Now therefore Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that upon the exhibition of the light of the aforesaid new light vessel, and the consequent extinction of the light at present shown from the Point of Air Lighthouse, the present toll of 2d. per ton oversea and  $\frac{4}{16}$  per ton coasting leviable on all vessels passing over Chester Bar, or between the south-west part of Hoyle Sands and the mainland of Wales, shall cease; and that instead thereof there shall be leviable in respect of the new lightship and the Dee Buoys a toll of 4d. per ton oversea and 1d. per ton coasting upon all vessels whether British or foreign, entering or departing from the River Dee, excepting open boats, or sloops under 40 tons laden only with limestone, pebble stones for pavements, dung, or manure.

The said toll shall be levied by the Corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the new Consolidated Tables of Light Duties, sanctioned by Orders in Council dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in an Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and also in the special section of the Consolidated Tables sanctioned by Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other regulations and exemptions as may from time to time be duly sanctioned, and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of sixty per centum mentioned in such last-named Order in Council of the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, or to such other abatement or discount as may for the time being be in force.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirty-first day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the parish of Llandaff in the county of Glamorgan and now vested in us.

“Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the fifth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four and made or expressed to be made between the Reverend Hely Hutchinson Keating Rickards of Landough Rectory in the county of Glamorgan Clerk and the Reverend John Thomas Cyril Stacey of Whitchurch in the county of Glamorgan aforesaid Clerk of the first part Eliza Robe of Clifton in the county of Gloucester Widow and Caroline Susan Richards of Clifton aforesaid Widow of the second part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereto annexed became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us.

“And whereas the said lands and hereditaments are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

“And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

“Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorised and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent-charges tenements or

hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.”

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.”

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter forty-one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter forty-one, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for setting out and constituting a district for spiritual purposes, and annexing such district to the consecrated church of Saint Edmund situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime a district under the above-mentioned Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter forty-one otherwise known as the Parish of Manchester Division Act 1850) of Saint Margaret Whalley Range in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district for spiritual purposes should be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Edmund situate within the limits

of the new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range aforesaid, which church was not consecrated under the provisions of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, testified by his having signed and sealed this scheme, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be severed and disannexed from such new parish and shall be set out and constituted for and annexed to the said church of Saint Edmund situate within the limits of the same new parish as aforesaid and shall become and be a district for spiritual purposes and shall be named 'The District of Saint Edmund Whalley Range.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Edmund, Whalley Range, being:—

"All that portion of the new parish of Saint Margaret, Whalley Range within the original limits of the parish of Manchester in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester which is bounded on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint Bride Stretford within the original limits of the said parish of Manchester from the new parish of Saint Margaret, Whalley Range aforesaid at the point where the road called or known as Moss-lane West is joined by Heywood-street and extending thence southward along the middle of the said street for a distance of five hundred and eighty-three yards or thereabouts to its junction with Greame-street and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of seventy-two yards or thereabouts to its junction with Alexandra-road and with Yarburgh-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of two hundred and thirty-nine yards or thereabouts to a point near its junction with Upper Hulton-street and opposite to the middle of the northern end of a certain passage which leads between the houses numbered respectively 48 Yarburgh-street and 50 Yarburgh-street and extending thence that is from Yarburgh-street aforesaid south-eastward for a distance of forty-four yards or thereabouts to and along the middle of the said passage to its junction with the passage which runs in rear of the houses situate on the south-eastern side of Yarburgh-street aforesaid the said point of junction being opposite to the northern end of the wall forming the eastern boundary of the grounds attached to Range House, and extending thence southward to and along the said wall for a distance of eighty-seven yards or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Range-road opposite to the middle of the northern end of Albert-road and continuing thence that is from the said wall still southward across

the said Range-road and along the middle of the said Albert-road for a distance of half-a-mile or thereabouts to the southern end of such road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range from the new parish of the Holy Innocents Fallowfield also within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described portion of the new parish of Saint Margaret Whalley Range aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the west as aforesaid that is to say upon the south, upon the east, and upon the north as follows upon the south and upon the east by the new parish of the Holy Innocents Fallowfield aforesaid and upon the north partly by the new parish of Christ Church Moss Side partly by the new parish of Saint Clement Greenheys partly by the new parish of Saint Mary Hulme, and partly by the new parish of Saint Bride, Stretford aforesaid, all within the original limits of the parish of Manchester aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas situate in the parish of Hove in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Barnabas situate in the parish of Hove aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Hove which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Barnabas situate in the parish of Hove as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas Hove.'

"And with the like consent of the said Richard Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Barnabas situate in the parish of Hove as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend Thomas Peacey now vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Hove shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication solemnization or performance at the said church of Saint Barnabas situate as aforesaid shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Thomas Peacey, and provided also that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas Hove being:—

"All that part of the parish of Hove in the county of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester, which is bounded on the south and on the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary dividing the said parish of Hove from the parish of Aldington in the county and diocese aforesaid crosses the middle of Clarendon Villas-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 13½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sackville-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Shirley-street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which passes in front of the houses called or known as Goldstone-villas and extending thence northward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the open space or yard on the

southern side of the West Brighton Station of the West Branch Line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway and continuing thence still northward and in a direct line for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts across the said open space or yard and across the said West Brighton Station and across the open space or yard on the northern side of the same station to a point in the middle of the southern end of West Brighton-road and continuing thence still northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the present northern end of the same road, which boundary divides the said parish of Hove from the parish of Preston in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described part of the parish of Hove aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides, other than upon the south and east as aforesaid, that is to say upon the north and upon the west as follows upon the north partly by the said parish of Preston, and partly by the parish of West Blatchington in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the west by the parish of Aldington aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the eighth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of Swancombe in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Swancombe which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated

church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain deed bearing date on or about the second day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three and made or expressed to be made under the authority of "The New Parishes Acts 1843 1844 and 1856" or some or one of them between Leedham White of No. 2 Lime Street-square in the city of London Esquire of the first part, Frederick Anthony White and John Bazley White the younger both of No. 2 Lime Street-square aforesaid Esquires of the second part and us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part (which deed or indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of Your Majesty's High Court of Justice) the said parties of the first and second parts did grant unto the minister of the said proposed district (intended as is mentioned in the said deed or indenture to be named 'The District of All Saints Swanscombe') so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed thereto and so soon as such district shall under the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act have become a new parish then to the incumbent of such new parish and to their successors the ministers or incumbents of the said district or new parish for the time being certain pieces or parcels of land situate in and fronting to Barry-road, East Dulwich, in the parish of Saint Giles Camberwell in the county of Surrey together with fourteen messuages or dwelling-houses and buildings erected thereon which are particularly described in the schedule annexed to the said deed and are also delineated upon a map or plan drawn upon and forming part of the same deed subject nevertheless to the several indentures of lease the particulars whereof and the yearly rents amounting together to ninety-eight pounds or thereabouts which are reserved thereby are set forth in the said schedule, the said yearly rents so reserved as aforesaid to be to the use of the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish for ever.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an additional endowment for the said proposed district or new parish the same parties who have made the aforesaid grant have contributed and transferred to our account and into our name in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England a capital sum of sixty-six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities for the benefit of the said minister or incumbent, and we have agreed and undertaken to pay to the said minister or incumbent when duly licensed as aforesaid, the dividends which may from time to time accrue due and become payable in respect of such capital sum, so long as the same sum shall remain in our name in the books of the said Governor and Company.

"And whereas the said lands houses and buildings hereinbefore mentioned have been so granted and secured as aforesaid and the said capital sum of sixty-six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence three pounds per centum Consolidated Bank Annuities have also been so contributed and transferred as aforesaid upon the understanding that we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England should out of our common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act pay to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district when he shall have been duly licensed as aforesaid or (as the case may be) of the said new parish a grant of fifty pounds per annum, and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient)

we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to make such grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Swanscombe which is described in the schedule hereunder written (all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints Swanscombe.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised jointly by the said Leedham White, the said Frederick Anthony White, the said John Bazley White, Tyndale White, of Twysdens, Foots Cray, in the said county of Kent Esquire, and the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Thorold Doctor in Divinity (now Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester as above mentioned) and their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints Swanscombe being:—

"All that part of the parish of Swanscombe in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Greenhithe in the said county and diocese from the parish of Swanscombe aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries the road leading from Ingress Hill to Knockholt Farm over the North Kent Line of the South-Eastern Railway and extending thence that is, from the said boundary eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which



carries the same line of railway over the road leading from the Portland Cement Works to Milton-street and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction at Milton-street aforesaid with the road leading towards Galley Hill and extending thence that is from the last-described point of junction first north-eastward and then generally eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Swanscombe to Galley Hill and extending thence that is, from the last-described point of junction in a direction a little to the north of east and in a straight line for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the line of railway aforesaid over the public footpath leading from Swanscombe to Stone Bridge and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last-described public footway for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Swanscombe from the parish of Northfleet in the county and diocese aforesaid all which said hereinbefore-described part of the parish of Swanscombe aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the south as aforesaid that is to say upon the east upon the north upon the north-west and upon the west as follows, upon the east by the parish of Northfleet aforesaid upon the north and upon the north-west by the county boundary in the middle of the River Thames and upon the west by the new parish of Greenhithe aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William

the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Your Majesty (session 2) chapter twenty-six, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain alterations and improvements at the episcopal residence belonging to the See of Oxford which is situate at Cuddesdon in the county of Oxford and is known as Cuddesdon Palace.

Whereas the Right Reverend John Fielder Bishop of Oxford is desirous that certain alterations and improvements should be made at the said episcopal residence known as Cuddesdon Palace, and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed alterations and improvements and we have approved the same. And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed alterations and improvements a sum of one thousand pounds should be provided by borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments or endowments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the See of Oxford.

"And whereas under the authority of two several Orders of Your Majesty in Council, dated respectively the seventeenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven and the thirty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, and duly gazetted, the sum of one thousand six hundred and sixty-nine pounds, and the sum of three hundred and fifty pounds were respectively borrowed upon the security of the lands tenements and hereditaments belonging to the said See of Oxford.

And whereas the sums (if any) now remaining due or repayable in respect of the said two sums so borrowed as aforesaid, together with the said sum of one thousand pounds now proposed to be borrowed, do not exceed two years income of the said See of Oxford.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Fielder Bishop of Oxford (testified by his having signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts the sum of one thousand pounds; and that as a security for the same, the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of thirty-five years or until the said sum of one thousand pounds, with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in manner following, that is to say: during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term of thirty-five years computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable, but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one thirtieth part of the said principal sum of one thousand pounds until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds

per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid and if and when it shall happen that the principal and interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale; and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us and shall bind not only the said John Fielder now Bishop of Oxford, but also all his successors in the said See of Oxford, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England further recommend and propose that the said sum of one thousand pounds shall be paid to us, and that the receipt of our joint Treasurers for the time being endorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum of one thousand pounds the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed alterations and improvements at the episcopal residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein-named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas under an Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty's reign intituled 'An Act to carry into effect with certain modifications the fourth report of the Commissioners of Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues' and another Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty's reign intituled 'An Act to explain and amend two several Acts relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England' and another Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty's reign intituled 'An Act for regulating the Cathedral Churches of Wales' and by virtue of an Order of Your Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the same Acts bearing date the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and duly published in the London Gazette on the eighteenth day of the same month all the property which then belonged to the said Dean and Chapter of Saint David's excepting any right of ecclesiastical patronage the said cathedral church and the precincts thereof was transferred to and became absolutely vested in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the property aforesaid consists to a considerable extent of reversions expectant upon grants and leases for lives and years and produces during the subsistence of such grants and leases only small annual revenues and on that account and in some instances on account of its character or situation is unsuitable or inconvenient to be assigned as an endowment for the said Dean and Chapter or to be held or applied for the other purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

consent of the respective holders (if any) to be testified by their being made parties to such instruments all or any part of the said property heretofore belonging to the said Dean and Chapter of Saint David's and so transferred to and vested in us as aforesaid with its appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his her or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he she or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sales from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be assigned as the endowment for the said Dean and Chapter or to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts ; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the "burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, burials in any part or parts of the Metropolis, or in any burial grounds or places of burial in the Metropolis, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that from and after a time mentioned in the Order burials in such part or parts of the Metropolis, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of the parishes in which any burial grounds or places of burial affected by such representation shall be situate, or on some other conspicuous places within the part or parts of the Metropolis affected by such representation, one calendar month at the least before such representation is so considered; provided always, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time, to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has made a representation, stating that, he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the twenty-seventh August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, with respect to interments in the churchyard of St. Mary's, Fulham, in the county of

Middlesex, should be varied so as to admit of the burial in the churchyard of the coffins now lying in the vaults under the church.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-sixth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

The following Areas (namely),—(1.) an Area in the township of Pickering, in the petty sessional division of Pickering Lythe West, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Bull Ing drain on the north, by Toft-lane to Toft farmhouse (but not including the Toft farmhouse and buildings) on the east, by a quickwood fence on the north side of Toft farmhouse running to the Toft drain on the south, and by the Toft drain on the west, and (2.) an Area in the townships of Thornton, Farmanby, and Wilton, in the petty sessional division of Pickering Lythe West, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Thornton Beck near the Railway-station in the township of Thornton and including all the land lying on the south side of the North-Eastern Railway in the townships of Thornton, and Farmanby, thence by the North-Eastern Railway to the township boundary of Wilton, thence by Wilton township boundary to the Thornton and Wilton high-road, thence by the said high-road through the village of Wilton to Allerston township boundary, thence by Allerston township boundary to the Marishes Low-road, thence by Marishes Low-road to Tong Bridge across Thornton Beck and thence by Thornton Beck to Thornton Railway-station,—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

#### THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

#### (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or re-

quired for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

**Anglesey.**—(1.) In the parish of Llangadwaladr, in the county of Anglesey, bounded on the north by the road leading from Penlon towards Hermon village, on the east by the road leading from the last-mentioned road past Penrhyn Halen farm, on the south by the road leading from the last-mentioned road past Tyddyn Tailwriard towards Aberffraw, and on the west by the western boundary of the said parish between the point at which it is intersected by the first and third before-mentioned roads.

(2.) In the parish of Llanfaethlu, in the county of Anglesey, bounded on the north by a road leading from the sea shore at Borthwen to Llanfaethlu Church, on the east by a road leading from the last-mentioned road past the Rectory, on the south by a road leading from the last-mentioned road near Rhosddu to the sea near Penterfin, and on the west by the sea.

**Bedfordshire.**—(1.) The parish of Ravensden, in the county of Bedford.

(2.) The parish of Toddington, in the county of Bedford.

(3.) The parish of Flitwick, in the county of Bedford.

(4.) The parishes of Kempston, and Stagsden, in the county of Bedford.

(5.) The parish of Husborne-Crawley, in the county of Bedford.

**Buckinghamshire.**—So much of the county of Buckingham as is situate on the northward and eastward of the main-road commencing in and leading through part of the town of Newport Pagnell and thence on to Northampton, and so much of the same county as is situate on the northward of the road commencing in and leading through part of the town of Newport Pagnell and from thence through the village of North Crawley to Cranfield Gate in the county of Bedford.

**Cambridgeshire.**—(1.) The whole of the parish of Cherry Hinton, in the county of Cambridge.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Fen Drayton, in the county of Cambridge.

**Liberty of the Isle of Ely.**—The whole of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, with the exception of the parishes of Haddenham, Wilburton, Stretham, Sutton, Thetford, Witchford, Wentworth, and Grunty Fen.

**Cheshire.**—In the petty sessional divisions of Eddisbury, and Nantwich, in the county of Chester, around the premises of George Charlesworth in the township of Wettehall, commencing at the junction of the Middlewich Branch Canal with the Worleston and Church Minshull-road, along the said road through Wades Green, Church Minshull, Lea Green, to Ash Brook, by Ash Brook through Wettehall Wood to Wettehall-road, by Wettehall-road through Cholmondeston to the Chester and Crewe Railway, and by the said Railway and the Middlewich Branch Canal to the junction aforesaid with the Worleston and Church Minshull-road.

**Denbighshire.**—So much of the petty sessional division of the hundred of Bromfield, in the county of Denbigh, as lies to the south of the main-road between Holt and Wrexham, and to the east of the Great Western Railway.

**Derbyshire.**—The whole of Hadfield Ward (Municipal), in the borough of Glossop, in the county of Derby, with the exception of the township of Dinting.

**Dorsetshire.**—So much of the parishes of Radipole, Fleet, Buckland Rippers, Chickerell, Portisham, Langton Herring, Broadway, Upway, Bincombe, Preston and Sutton Pointz, Poxwell, Osmington, Overmoigne, Broadmayne, Warmwell, Watercombe, Melcombe Regis, Weymouth, and Wyke Regis, and other adjacent parishes in the county of Dorset, and in the borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis in the said county, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the coast at Fleet aforesaid continuing in a direct line to the highway at East Fleet, and from thence the road direct to Chickerell by the Well passing near Morn Villa and Rose Cottage in a direct route to Portisham, then the road branching out of the last-mentioned road on the right before the turning to Roddon, and continuing to Kellaways farm, Shilvinghampton, then taking the right hand turning to and through Coryates, thence the road passing by Friar Waddon farm direct to Upway and into the main-road from Weymouth to Dorchester by the Royal Oak Inn, from thence along the said main-road to a point at the top of Ridgway Hill where the road leading to Came Wood branches off, from thence the said road passing by Came Wood direct to Culliford Tree, thence along the road leading direct to the junction with the main-road at Broadmayne village, thence along the said main-road to and passing Warmwell Cross to a point on the said main-road at Overmoigne village where the road leading to Holworth branches off, along the said road direct through Holworth and South Holworth, and from South Holworth aforesaid in a direct line to the sea, the coast from this point to the point at East Fleet aforesaid completing the boundary of the Area.

**Durham.**—In the borough of Darlington, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the Darlington section of the North-Eastern Railway, on the south and west by land in the occupation of Joseph Raine, and on the east by the western boundary of a Plantation in the occupation of John Colling.

**Essex.**—(1.) The whole of Claybury Park, in the parish of Chigwell, in the county of Essex.

(2.) At Chigwell Row, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Chigwell Row end of Vicarage-lane down the same to the footpath leading to Hainault-road, thence along Hainault-road to the boundary of Chigwell parish, thence along the said boundary to J. Savill's house, and from thence to the Chigwell Row end of Vicarage-lane aforesaid, including therein the main-road leading from the said Vicarage-lane to the Barking Side-road.

(3.) At Loughton, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Loughton Signal Box on the Great Eastern Railway, thence along the said Railway to the boundary of the parish of Chigwell, thence by the boundary of the parishes of Chigwell and Loughton to the Epping New-road, thence along the said road to a lane known as Mud-lane, thence along the said lane to the Upper Park-road, thence along the said road to and along the Lower Park-road and Meadow-road to the Signal Box aforesaid.

(4.) At Thoydon Mount, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of

Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Gravel Pit-lane, along Bitchett Wood to Mr. Merriday's house on the east, thence along the road towards Thoydon Garnon to Horns Green-lane on the south, thence along the said Horns Green-lane to Gaynes Park corner on the west, and thence along Gravel Pit-lane by Nobbs cottages to the Bitchett Wood aforesaid.

(5.) At Waltham Holy Cross, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the end of Wood Green-road, along the same to the Potteries, then taking the footpath by the side of the Potteries to the White House in Honey-lane, then in a straight line across the fields to the Keeper's Lodge, thence to the parish cottages and the boundary of Epping Forest following the said boundary to Wood Green-road aforesaid.

(6.) At North Weald Bassett, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Mr. Pegram's Beer-house at Weald Gullett, taking the fence on the left hand side of the high-road leading from Epping to Ongar to the Blacksmith's shop at Tylers Green Cross, thence along and including the road to the Rectory-lane near the Church, and from thence along the Church-path through Mr. Law's fields to Mr. Pegram's Beer-house aforesaid.

Ashcroft, bounded by the Fenton Drain on the east, a field in the occupation of John Setchell on the south, a field in the occupation of William Bedford on the west, and the Heath Drove-road leading from Warboys to Chatteris on the north, (not including the said road,) which said fields are included in the Area.

A field on Upwood Common, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Simpson, bounded by a field in the occupation of William Cross on the south, two fields in the occupation of John Pentelow on the north and west, and the highway leading from Upwood to Ramsey St. Mary on the east, (not including the said road,) which said fields are included in the Area.

Two adjoining grass fields belonging to the farm at Wistow, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of Thomas Cooke, bounded by a Brick Yard at Shill How Hill on the east, two fields belonging to the Manor farm in the occupation of John Rowell on the north, and the two adjoining fields part of the said farm in the occupation of the said Thomas Cooke on the south and west, which said fields are included in the Area.

(5.) The Home Close and farm-yard in Tick Fen, Warboys, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, belonging to the farm in the occupation of Hugh J. Smith, bounded on the north by a wheat stubble field, on the south by an arable field, on the east by two arable fields, and on the west by a Drove and an arable field, each of which said fields and the Drove form part of the said farm and are included in the Area.

(6.) A grass-field in the parish of Orton Longville, called the Battle field, in the petty sessional division of Norman Cross, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of James Ley Rowe, bounded on the north by the river Nene, west by the Great Northern Railway, south by the Peterborough and Oundle-road, and east by two fields in the occupation of William and Richard Jones, which said fields are included in the Area.

(7.) A grass-field in the parish of Sibson-cum-Stibbington, in the petty sessional division of Norman Cross, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Traylin, bounded on the north by the London and North-Western Railway, east by the Old North-road, south by an occupation-road, and west by fields in the occupation of the said William Traylin, which said fields are included in the Area.

(8.) A Public-house and premises in the parish of Elton, in the petty sessional division of Norman Cross, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Goodwin, and a grass field immediately adjoining in the occupation of Miss Elizabeth Hopkinson, bounded by Elton village-street on the north and north-west, Elton Back-lane on the south, and fields in the occupation of Lewis Fortescue on the east, which said described fields are included in the Area.

*Lancashire.*—In the borough of Burnley, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the Leeds and Liverpool Canal from Pheasantford Viaduct to Yorkshire-street Viaduct, on the north-west, north, and north-east to Brunshaw by the Municipal boundary, and the remainder by Brunshaw-road and Yorkshire-street to the Canal Viaduct.

*Lincolnshire (Holland).*—(1.) So much of Crowland Common, in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies to the north of Deeping High Bank leading from Deeping St. James Railway-station to the Bridge Hotel and to the west of the Common-road from the Bridge Hotel to the Forty Feet Drain; exclusive of the said boundary-roads.

(2.) In Holbeach Fen, in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Holbeach Railway-station to Hurdle Tree Bank on the west, Mr. William Bailey's arable



field on the north and east, and Mr. Martin Coward's grazing field on the south; exclusive of the said highway.

(3.)
