**W**HEREAS by the 27th section of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act 1873 it is enacted that Her Majesty in Council may from time upon any report or recommendation of the Council of Judges in the said Act mentioned with the consent of the Lord Chancellor make revoke or modify orders regulating the vacations to be observed by the High Court of Justice and the Court of Appeal and in the offices of the Supreme Court respectively, and any Order in Council made pursuant to that section shall so long as it continues in force be of the same effect as if it was contained in that Act.

And whereas at a meeting of the Judges of the Supreme Court duly assembled at Her Majesty's Royal Courts of Justice on the 6th day of December 1883 pursuant to the Supreme Court of Judicature Act 1873 section 75.

It was resolved :

That a report be humbly made and submitted to Her Majesty by this Council of Judges pursuant to the Supreme Court of Judicature Act 1873 section 27 to the following effect :—

A. That this Council of Judges is willing in accordance with the proposition of the Lord Chancellor to recommend that the Trinity Sittings of the Court of Appeal, and in London and Middlesex of the High Court of Justice, shall for the future be extended till the 12th of August inclusive, and that the Long Vacation in the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes commence on the 13th of August.

B. That this Council of Judges is willing in accordance with the proposition of the Lord Chancellor to recommend that the Michaelmas Sittings of the same Courts respectively shall for the future commence on the 24th of October, and that the Long Vacation in the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes terminate on the 23rd of October.

C. That it be humbly recommended by this Council of Judges to Her Majesty, that an Order in Council be made by Her Majesty, if Her Majesty shall so please, for the purpose of carrying this Report, and the recommendations therein contained into effect in the manner provided by the Supreme Court of Judicature Act 1873 section 27.

And whereas it has seemed fit to Her Majesty,

by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the said Report, and the recommendations therein contained, be carried into effect.

Now therefore Her Majesty by and with the advice aforesaid is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

That the Trinity Sittings of the Court of Appeal, and in London and Middlesex of the High Court of Justice, shall for the future be extended till the 12th of August inclusive, and that the Long Vacation in the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes commence on the 13th of August.

That the Michaelmas Sittings of the same Courts respectively shall for the future commence on the 24th of October, and that the Long Vacation in the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes terminate on the 23rd of October.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words following, viz :—

“ Whereas by the 4th section of an Act passed in the 47th year of Your Majesty's reign, cap. 32, entitled An Act to make further provision respecting the application of the Revenues of Greenwich Hospital, and for other purposes, it is enacted that regulations made by the Admiralty under this Act shall not have effect unless and until approved by Your Majesty in Council. We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the several provisions of the said Act, viz. :

**SECTION II OF ACT.**

“ Regulations for the grant of Pensions to Widows, and allowances to Children, and of gratuities to Parents and other Relatives of Seamen, Marines, and other Seafaring Persons.

“ 1. The Admiralty may out of the funds of Greenwich Hospital from time to time grant pensions to widows and allowances to children of :—

“ (a.) Non-commissioned officers and petty officers and men of the Royal Navy and

Marines killed or drowned in the service of the Crown, or on lifeboat service; and of  
 “(b.) Men of the Royal Naval Volunteers (i.e. Royal Naval Reserve), killed or drowned in the service of the Crown; and of

“(c.) Men killed or drowned in the service of the Crown while serving in the Seamen Pensioners’ Reserve; and of

“(d.) Men of the Royal Naval Artillery Volunteer Force killed or drowned in the service of the Crown.

“2. These pensions and allowances are granted only in cases where men have been killed or drowned on duty in Her Majesty’s service, or when it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Admiralty, that they died from the effects of injuries or diseases caused by accident, extraordinary exposure, or exertion on service, within twelve months after being first certified to be ill, and not being due to their own culpable action nor to negligence.

“3. Scale of Pensions and Allowances—

Rank.	Widows’ Pension per week, dependent on age and other circumstances.	Allowance for each child dependent on the mother, per week.
(1.) Able seamen and other persons in the same category, including Marines and Marine Artillery	3 <i>s.</i> 6 <i>d.</i> to 4 <i>s.</i> 6 <i>d.</i>	1 <i>s.</i> 6 <i>d.</i>
(2.) 2nd class petty officers, corporals of Marines and Marine Artillery	4 <i>s.</i> to 5 <i>s.</i>	1 <i>s.</i> 6 <i>d.</i>
(3.) 1st class petty officers, serjeants of Marines and Marine Artillery	4 <i>s.</i> 6 <i>d.</i> to 6 <i>s.</i>	2 <i>s.</i>
(4.) Chief petty officers, colour and staff serjeants of the Marines and Marine Artillery	5 <i>s.</i> to 6 <i>s.</i> 6 <i>d.</i>	2 <i>s.</i>

“Rates in excess of the foregoing scale may, at the discretion of the Admiralty, be awarded in cases needing special relief.

“4. If a Widow re-marries, her Pension will be suspended, but the allowances to the children may be continued.

“5. If she again becomes a Widow, she may revert to the Pension she previously enjoyed. Should she become eligible for a Pension on account of the death of her second husband she may either revert to her original Pension or be granted the Pension for which her second marriage rendered her eligible, whichever is most to her advantage.

“6. Pensions and allowances are tenable subject to good behaviour, and are granted at the discretion of the Admiralty. Any assignment, sale, or contract, relating to a pension or allowance out of Greenwich Hospital Funds is void.

“7. If in receipt of parish relief, in respect either of herself or her family, the payment of the Pension and allowance will be suspended; and in no case will the Pension or allowance be paid to the parish authorities.

“8. The Widow will be required to make a declaration monthly, or whenever it may be

considered necessary, before a duly authorized person, as to her continued widowhood, and of any particulars required in reference to her family.

“9. Boys above 14, and girls above 16 will, as a rule, be ineligible for allowances.

“10. Applications should be made at the proper age for placing children in Orphanages or other institutions at the expense of Greenwich Hospital Funds.

“11. Should the opportunity of so placing a child be declined, or should a child be withdrawn from a school, home, or charitable institution where it is being maintained such child will in ordinary circumstances be ineligible for an allowance.

“12. If the claim of a Widow to a Pension be not established before her death, the amount of the pension to which she would have been entitled, if living, will not be allowed to her representatives.

“13. These regulations apply only from the 4th June, 1880.

“14. In the event of men specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 not leaving Widows or Children, but leaving Parents or other relatives dependent upon them, gratuities not exceeding one year’s full wages may be given at the discretion of the Admiralty to such parents or relatives, provided the total expenditure in such gratuities shall not exceed in any one year the sum of five hundred pounds.

“SECTION III. OF ACT.

“Regulations for the Admission of Boys into Orphanages, Schools, or other Institutions, at the expense of Greenwich Hospital Funds.

“I. Sons of deceased or incapacitated warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, petty officers, and men of the Royal Navy and Marines (and of men of the Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Artillery Volunteer Force, killed or drowned in the service of the Crown), may be educated and maintained at the expense of the funds of Greenwich Hospital subject to the expenditure in any one year being restricted to £4,000.

“II. Claims for admission will be judged by a committee of selection appointed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in the following order of precedence, special consideration being given to the length, nature, and merit of the father’s services.

“Class A. Orphans. Both parents dead.

“Class B. Orphans. Father killed or drowned on duty in Her Majesty’s service (including the Royal Naval Volunteer Forces), or who has died from the effects of injury or disease caused by extraordinary exposure or exertion on service within twelve months after being first certified to be ill; mother unable to look after the children.

“Class C. Exceptional cases not included in the foregoing classes.

“III. Boys are eligible for selection at 8 years of age.

“And whereas by the 20th section of an Act passed in the 29th year of Your Majesty’s reign, cap. 89, entitled ‘An Act to provide for the better government of Greenwich Hospital,’ it is among other things enacted, that the regulations for the admission of children into Greenwich Hospital School shall be vested exclusively in the Admiralty, but any such regulations shall not have effect unless and until they are approved by Your Majesty in Council.

“And whereas Your Majesty has been pleased, by Your Order in Council of 27th November, 1878, embodied in the Regulations for the Govern-

ment of Your Majesty's Naval Service, to approve of certain regulations for the admission of boys into Greenwich Hospital School.

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the Regulations for admission to Greenwich Hospital School. We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be pleased to sanction the following regulations in lieu of those previously authorised:—

"Regulations for the Admission of Boys to Greenwich Hospital School.

I. The complement of the school will not exceed 1,000 boys, sons of:—

(a.) Warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, petty officers, and men of the Royal Navy and Marines.

(b.) Men of the Royal Naval Volunteers.

(c.) Men of the Royal Naval Artillery Volunteer Force killed, drowned, or disabled in the service of the Crown.

(d.) Other seafaring persons and men drowned on Lifeboat service.

"II. Claims for admission to the school will be judged by a committee of selection appointed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in the following order of precedence, special consideration being given to the length, nature, and merits of the father's services.

"Class 1. Orphans. Both parents dead.

"Class 2. Orphans. Father killed or drowned on duty in the service of the Crown, or on Lifeboat service, or who has died from the effects of injury or disease caused by extraordinary exposure or exertion on service within twelve months after being first certified to be ill. Mother living.

"Class 3. Orphans. Father dead. Mother living.

"Class 4. Orphans. Mother dead. Father serving, or in receipt of a Life pension.

"Class 5. Sons of men now serving. Both parents living.

"Class 6. Sons of Life pensioners; and of men entitled to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital. Both parents living.

"Class 7. Sons of persons included under Clause I. whose claims may be considered exceptional, although not coming within the foregoing classes.

"III. Boys are eligible for admission between 11 and 14 years of age.

"And whereas we are of opinion that it would be of advantage to admit boys for special instruction in Navigation, Nautical Astronomy, and Seamanship, we beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to authorize the admission of Boys, ultimately destined for Sea Service, either in Your Majesty's Navy or in the Mercantile Marine, under such conditions as may seem to us desirable and on payment of fees, the amount whereof shall be decided by us from time to time.

"And whereas Your Majesty has been pleased by Your Order in Council on the 20th day of April 1880 to authorize the Establishment and Scale of Salaries of Officers, Clerks, and others employed in duties connected with the administration of the Funds of Greenwich Hospital and for the purposes of Greenwich Hospital School.

"We now beg leave to submit, in order to meet the increased clerical duties arising from the administration of Greenwich Hospital Funds, that Your Majesty will be pleased to sanction such additions to the Clerical Staff of the Greenwich Hospital Branch at the Admiralty, as from time to time we may deem necessary, on the scale of

Salary and Allowances in force for the Admiralty Department; and further, in consequence of the reorganization of Greenwich Hospital School, that the Salaries of the Masters may be fixed for the present appointments and for the future as follows:—

"For the present appointments.

"1 Head Master at\* £320 a year } with  
"4 Masters at\* £210 a year } residences.

"As may be requisite, Assistant Masters from £90 to £150 by £10 a year for the Upper Nautical School, and from £70 to £120 by £10 a year for the Nautical School.

"For future appointments.

"1 Head Master (with residence) at £300 a year.

"4 Masters (with residences) from £150 to £200 by £10 a year.

"As may be requisite, Assistant Masters from £90 to £150 by £10 a year for the Upper Nautical School, and from £70 to £120 by £10 a year for the Nautical School.

"1 Music Master and Organist at £120 a year.

"The yearly increase to the Assistant Masters to depend on the efficiency of their classes.

"We also beg to submit that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to authorize the salaries of the under-mentioned officers of Greenwich Hospital School being increased as follows as regards the present holders:—

"The Medical Officer, from £350 to £370† a year.

"The Cashier and Storekeeper, from £200 to £250† a year.

"We beg further to submit that Your Majesty may be pleased to authorize us to frame and establish from time to time such further detailed regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of Your Majesty's Order in Council as we may find to be necessary."

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

patronage of and presentation to a certain benefice namely the church and cure of Denton (being a rectory) in the county of Lincoln by way of exchange for the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to a certain other benefice namely the cure (being a vicarage) of Edwinstowe in the county of Nottingham which cure has three churches the parish church of Edwinstowe and the chapel of ease of Carburton and the chapel of ease of Saint Giles Ollerton.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Denton is vested in the Bishop of the diocese of Lincoln for the time being.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Edwinstowe with Carburton and Ollerton is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Lincoln and their successors.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Christopher now Bishop of the diocese of Lincoln and the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said benefices may be assigned and transferred by way of exchange in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due enquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said benefices and patronage and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty that the circumstances and present values of the said benefices respectively are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) and with the

consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln (in testimony whereof they have affixed their corporate seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Denton now vested in the said Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln as such Bishop as aforesaid shall be transferred from him the said Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln and from his successors Bishops of the said diocese and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln and their successors for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Edwinstowe with Carburton and Ollerton now vested as aforesaid in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln shall thereupon be transferred from them the said Dean and Chapter and from their successors and shall be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln and his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the measures aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-



third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-second day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the district parish of Collierley in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham, and partly out of the parochial chapelry of Tanfield in the same county and diocese.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said district parish of Collierley and of the said parochial chapelry of Tanfield which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner hereinafter set forth.

“And whereas there is not present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said district parish of Collierley have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein-mentioned Acts or of some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-mentioned Act to the minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted so soon as one shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-mentioned Act and to his successors a grant of two hundred pounds per annum and such grant will be made by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joseph Barber Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said district parish of Collierley and of the said parochial chapelry of Tanfield which are mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written and which are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint John the Evangelist Dipton.’

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of Saint John the Evangelist, Dipton, consisting of:—

“I. All that portion of the district parish of Collierley in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham wherein the present incumbent of such district parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the greater part of the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Collierley from the new parish of Burnopfield in the county and diocese aforesaid at a point in the middle of the turnpike-road from Newcastle to Durham near to boundary houses and opposite to the milestone indicating a distance of nine miles from Newcastle and of fourteen miles to Durham and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said turnpike-road for a distance of thirty-eight and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road which leads past Stob House into Fondly Set-lane and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Fondly Set-lane aforesaid at or near to the house called or known as Fondly Set and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Pontop Pike-lane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of forty-two chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said district parish of Collierley from that detached portion of the parochial chapelry of Tanfield in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the colliery called or known as East Castle Colliery is situate; all which said hereinbefore described portion of the said district parish of Collierley is bounded upon the remaining part of the south-east and upon all other sides that is to say upon the south-west upon the north-west and upon the north-east as follows upon the remaining part of the south-east by the detached portion of the parochial chapelry of Tanfield hereinbefore described upon the south-west partly by the new parish of Leadgate and partly by the parochial chapelry of Medomsley both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north-west by the last-named parochial chapelry and upon the north-east by the new parish of Burnopfield aforesaid.

“II. And also all that hereinbefore-mentioned detached portion of the said parochial chapelry of Tanfield, wherein the colliery called or known as East Castle Colliery is situate as aforesaid which said portion of such parochial chapelry is identical and co-extensive with the territory shown upon the ordnance survey map of the said county of Durham on the scale of six inches to a mile as being a portion of the civil parish of Chester-le-street (detached No. 11) and also of the township of Tanfield (detached No. 2) and as comprising an area of 65·378 acres.”

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the two cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her

Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the old churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces in the old churchyard as have never before been

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buried in, and, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.
