**THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES  
(ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.**

**(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)**

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

*Bedfordshire.*—(1.) The parish of Toddington, in the county of Bedford.

(2.) The parish of Kempston, in the county of Bedford.

*Buckinghamshire.*—So much of the county of Buckingham as is situate on the northward and eastward of the main-road commencing in and leading through part of the town of Newport Pagnell and thence on to Northampton, and so much of the same county as is situate on the northward of the road commencing in and leading through part of the town of Newport Pagnell and from thence through the village of North Crawley to Cranfield Gate in the county of Bedford.

*Liberty of the Isle of Ely.*—The whole of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, with the exception of the parishes of Haddenham, Wilburton, Stretham, Sutton, Thetford, Witchford, Wentworth, Mepal, Downham, and Grunty Fen.

*Denbighshire.*—So much of the petty sessional division of the hundred of Bromfield, in the county of Denbigh, as lies to the south of the main-road between Holt and Wrexham, and to the east of the Great Western Railway.

*Derbyshire.*—The whole of Hadfield Ward (Municipal), in the borough of Glossop, in the county of Derby, with the exception of the township of Dinting.

*Dorsetshire.*—So much of the parishes of Radipole, Fleet, Buckland Ripers, Chickerell, Portisham, Langton Herring, Broadway, Upway,

Bincombe, Preston and Sutton Pointz, Poole, well, Osmington, Owermoigne, Broadmayne, Warmwell, Watercombe, Melcombe Regis, Weymouth, and Wyke Regis, and other adjacent parishes in the county of Dorset, and in the borough of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis in the said county, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the coast at Fleet aforesaid continuing in a direct line to the highway at East Fleet, and from thence the road direct to Chickerell by the Well passing near Morn Villa and Rose Cottage in a direct route to Portisham, then the road branching out of the last-mentioned road on the right before the turning to Roddon, and continuing to Kellaways farm, Shilvinghampton, then taking the right hand turning to and through Coryates, thence the road passing by Friar Waddon farm direct to Upway and into the main-road from Weymouth to Dorchester by the Royal Oak Inn, from thence along the said main-road to a point at the top of Ridgway Hill where the road leading to Came Wood branches off, from thence the said road passing by Came Wood direct to Culliford Tree, thence along the road leading direct to the junction with the main-road at Broadmayne village, thence along the said main-road to and passing Warmwell Cross to a point on the said main-road at Owermoigne village where the road leading to Holworth branches off, along the said road direct through Holworth and South Holworth, and from South Holworth aforesaid in a direct line to the sea, the coast from this point to the point at East Fleet aforesaid completing the boundary of the Area.

*Durham.*—In the borough of Darlington, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the Darlington section of the North-Eastern Railway, on the south and west by land in the occupation of Joseph Raine, and on the east by the western boundary of a Plantation in the occupation of John Colling.

*Essex.*—(1.) The whole of Claybury Park, in the parish of Chigwell, in the county of Essex.

(2.) At Chigwell Row, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Chigwell Row end of Vicarage-lane down the same to the footpath leading to Hainault-road, thence along Hainault-road to the boundary of Chigwell parish, thence along the said boundary to J. Savill's house, and from thence to the Chigwell Row end of Vicarage-lane aforesaid, including therein the main-road leading from the said Vicarage-lane to the Barking Side-road.

(3.) At Loughton, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Loughton Signal Box on the Great Eastern Railway, thence along the said Railway to the boundary of the parish of Chigwell, thence by the boundary of the parishes of Chigwell and Loughton to the Epping New-road, thence along the said road to a lane known as Mud-lane, thence along the said lane to the Upper Park-road, thence along the said road to and along the Lower Park-road and Meadow-road to the Signal Box aforesaid.

(4.) At Thoydon Mount, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Gravel Pit-lane, along Bitchett Wood to Mr. Merriday's house

on the east, thence along the road towards Thoydon Garnon to Horns Green-lane on the south, thence along the said Horns Green-lane to Gaynes Park corner on the west, and thence along Gravel Pit-lane by Nobbs cottages to the Bitchett Wood aforesaid.

(5.) At Waltham Holy Cross, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the end of Wood Green-road, along the same to the Potteries, then taking the footpath by the side of the Potteries to the White House in Honey-lane, then in a straight line across the fields to the Keeper's Lodge, thence to the parish cottages and the boundary of Epping Forest following the said boundary to Wood Green-road aforesaid.

(6.) At North Weald Bassett, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Mr. Pegram's Beer-house at Weald Gullett, taking the fence on the left hand side of the high-road leading from Epping to Ongar to the Blacksmith's shop at Tylers Green Cross, thence along and including the road to the Rectory-lane near the Church, and from thence along the Church-path through Mr. Law's fields to Mr. Pegram's Beer-house aforesaid.

(7.) At Epping Upland, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Boldings brook on the Epping Green-road on the west, thence along the Garden fence on the right of the Epping Green-road to the fence adjoining Mr. Cripps, thence along the top of Ellis field to Great Hanplead field on the north, thence to the right by Gibbons spring to Boldings brook on the east, and from thence along the brook to the Epping Green-road aforesaid.

(8.) In the parish of Nazeing, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the side of the navigable river Lea, thence on the right hand side of the occupation-road there, along the same over the private-road leading to Broxbourne Gate, thence continuing the said occupation-road along the right hand side to the point where a cart-way joins, thence along the right hand side of the said cart-way to the said river Lea, thence along the side of the said river to the commencing point aforesaid.

(9.) In the parish of Loughton, in the petty sessional division of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at the Lamp Post at Church Hill, along Church-lane to the fields, thence in a straight line across the same to Chigwell-lane, along the west side of the same to Mr. Maitland's gate, through the old-road to the old Church, thence down the lane by Mr. Bottle's farm in a line to England lane, along the same to the high-road and the east side of the same to Church Hill aforesaid.

*Huntingdonshire.*—(1.) The Big Close in Warboys Fen, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of Thomas C. Ashcroft, bounded by the Fenton Drain on the east, a field in the occupation of John Setchell on the south, a field in the occupation of William Bedford on the west, and the Heath Drove-road leading from Warboys to Chatteris on the north, (not includ-

ing the said road,) which said fields are included in the Area.

(2.) A field on Upwood Common, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Simpson, bounded by a field in the occupation of William Cross on the south, two fields in the occupation of John Pentelow on the north and west, and the highway leading from Upwood to Ramsey St. Mary on the east, (not including the said road,) which said fields are included in the Area.

(3.) Two adjoining grass fields belonging to the farm at Wistow, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of Thomas Cooke, bounded by a Brick Yard at Shill How Hill on the east, two fields belonging to the Manor farm in the occupation of John Rowell on the north, and the two adjoining fields part of the said farm in the occupation of the said Thomas Cooke on the south and west, which said fields are included in the Area.

(4.) The farm yard and two grass fields in Warboys, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Blake, bounded on the north and east by two grass fields in the occupation of Thomas Ekins, on the south by an arable field in the occupation of Girling Saunder's Representatives, and on the west by a grass field in the occupation of the Reverend C. G. Hill, which said fields are included in the Area.

(5.) The Home Close and farm-yard in Tick Fen, Warboys, in the petty sessional division of Ramsey, in the county of Huntingdon, belonging to the farm in the occupation of Hugh J. Smith, bounded on the north by a wheat stubble field, on the south by an arable field on the east by two arable fields, and on the west by a Drove and an arable field, each of which said fields and the Drove form part of the said farm and are included in the Area.

(6.) A grass-field in the parish of Orton Longville, called the Battle field, in the petty sessional division of Norman Cross, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of James Ley Rowe, bounded on the north by the river Nene, west by the Great Northern Railway, south by the Peterborough and Oundle-road, and east by two fields in the occupation of William and Richard Jones, which said fields are included in the Area.

(7.) A grass-field in the parish of Sibson-cum-Stibbington, in the petty sessional division of Norman Cross, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Traylin, bounded on the north by the London and North-Western Railway, east by the Old North-road, south by an occupation-road, and west by fields in the occupation of the said William Traylin, which said fields are included in the Area.

(8.) A Public house and premises in the parish of Elton, in the petty sessional division of Norman Cross, in the county of Huntingdon, in the occupation of William Goodwin, and a grass field immediately adjoining in the occupation of Miss Elizabeth Hopkinson, bounded by Elton village-street on the north and north-west, Elton Back-lane on the south, and fields in the occupation of Lewis Portescue on the east, which said described fields are included in the Area.

*Lancashire.*—In the borough of Burnley, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the

following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the Leeds and Liverpool Canal from Pheasantford Viaduct to Yorkshire-street Viaduct, on the north-west, north, and north-east to Brunshaw by the Municipal boundary, and the remainder by Brunshaw-road and Yorkshire-street to the Canal Viaduct.

**Lincolnshire (Kesteven).—**(1.) The whole of the parish of Harrowby, in the petty sessional division of Spittlegate, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire.

(2.) The hundreds of Aveland, and Beltisloe, in the petty sessional division of Bourn, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire.

(3.) The whole of the parish of Barkston, in the petty sessional division of Spittlegate, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire.

**Lincolnshire (Lindsey).—**(1.) The whole of the parish of Newton-on-Trent, in the petty sessional division of Lincoln, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire.

(2.) The whole of the parish of Stickford, in the petty sessional division of Spilsby, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire.

(3.) The parish of Saleby-with-Thorethorpe, in the petty sessional division of Calceworth, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire.

**Soke of Peterborough.**—The whole of the Soke of Peterborough, with the exception of the parishes of Pilgate, Wittering, Ufford, Barnack, Ashton, Bainton, Southorpe, St. Martins (Stamford Baron), and Wothorpe.

**Rutland.**—The whole of the parish of Tickencote, in the county of Rutland.

**Shropshire.**—All that portion of the county of Salop comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the main-road from Shipley to Bridgnorth commencing at the boundary of the counties of Stafford and Salop near Shipley Common so far as Roughton, thence to the river Worfe, thence along the river Worfe to the junction with the river Severn, thence by the river Severn to Coalport Bridge, thence to the Coalport and Wellington Branch Railway, thence by the said Railway to the Watling Street-road near the London and North-Western Railway-station at Oakengates, and thence along the Watling-Street-road to the county boundary near Weston.

**Sussex.**—All that part of the parish of Willingdon, in the borough of Eastbourne, situate on the north side of the high-road leading from Eastbourne to Pevensay, in the county of Sussex.

**Warwickshire.**—So much of the parish of Kenilworth, in the county of Warwick, as lies on the east side of the public highway (late turnpike-road) leading from Coventry through Kenilworth to Leamington, and so much of the parish of Stoneleigh, in the said county, as lies on the east of the public highway from Gibbet Hill to Worsley Bridge, and on the south of the public highway running from the last-mentioned road through Hill to or towards Baginton.

**Wigtownshire.**—(1.) In the county of Wigtown, comprising the whole of the farms of Culgavie and the adjoining farms of Kildarroch occupied by Alexander McGill and Francis McGuffie, Culbae occupied by Andrew McCandlish, Cairnfield occupied by the heirs of the late Daniel McWilliam, Kirkland occupied by David Gordon, Blairshinnoch east of the public-road to Kirk of Mochrum occupied by Mrs. Margaret Jardine, that part of Carsduchan

occupied by John Neilson and the said Mrs. Margaret Jardine, and the farm of Philgown of Barrachan occupied by Peter McGill.

(2.) So much of the county of Wigtown and of the burgh of Wigtown as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Bladnoch on the south, Wigtown Bay on the east, the Bishop Burn on the north, the public road to near Carsegowan dwelling-house, hence by the old road, by Cairnhouse, Glenturk, &c., to the public road leading from Wigtown to Spittal Bridge, thence the last-mentioned public road to the March of New Mills, and thence to the river Bladnoch on the west.

**Yorkshire (North Riding).—**(1.) At Helmsley, in the petty sessional division of Ryedale, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point at Harom-lane End nearest to a certain field in the parish of Helmsley, in the occupation of Mr. Thomas Carr, called Riccal Field, on the west, and thence along the same lane to a quickwood fence which divides the lands occupied by Messrs. Coverdale and Mr. Joseph Snowden respectively as far as Riccal Beck, and thence by a quickwood fence from Riccal Beck to Harom Heads on the east, thence by the highway which leads to Pockley to a quickwood fence on the north which divides the lands in the occupation of Messrs. Barker and Mr. George Seoby respectively, crossing Riccal Beck near the Plantation bottom, and thence by a quickwood fence on the north to a quickwood fence on the west which leads to and ends at the first-mentioned point.

(2.) At Helmsley, in the petty sessional division of Ryedale, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at a point from a quickwood fence at the Railway Bridge near Harom-lane End and along by this fence to Druids Dale Wood End on the north, from thence by the fence of the said Wood to a fence in a line with the Old Quarry, and thence across Carlton Highway, thence by a fence to Ashdale Wood, thence by Ashdale Wood fence westward to Beckdale Pasture top to Scorkill-lane on the west, thence by Scorkill-lane to Rivaulx highway, crossing the same to a quickwood fence dividing the lands respectively occupied by Mr. Isaac Cooper and Mr. George Sigsworth and continuing by this fence to the Park wall and by the Park wall to the river Rye near the Park Lodge, and by the river Rye to Sparndale Beck on the south, thence by the said Beck to Harom-lane, and thence by this lane to the before-mentioned quickwood fence near the Railway Bridge.

(3.) In the township of Pickering, in the petty sessional division of Pickering Lythe West, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Bull Ing drain on the north, by Toft-lane to Toft farmhouse (but not including the Toft farmhouse and buildings) on the east, by a quickwood fence on the north side of Toft farmhouse running to the Toft drain on the south, and by the Toft drain on the west.

(4.) In the townships of Thornton, Farmanby, and Wilton, in the petty sessional division of Pickering Lythe West, in the North Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing at Thornton Beck near the Railway-station in the township of Thornton and includ-

ing all the land lying on the south side of the North-Eastern Railway in the townships of Thornton, and Farmanby, thence by the North-Eastern Railway to the township boundary of Wilton, thence by Wilton township boundary to the Thornton and Wilton high-road, thence by the said high-road through the village of Wilton to Allerston township boundary, thence by Allerston township boundary to the Marishes Low-road, thence by Marishes Low-road to Tong Bridge across Thornton Beck and thence by Thornton Beck to Thornton Railway-station.

*Yorkshire (West Riding).*—(1.) The whole of the Rotherham District of the Upper Strathforth and Tickhill petty sessional division in the West Riding of the county of York.

(No. 365.)—BORNEO—NORTH-EAST COAST.

THE following information, resulting from a recent examination made in H.M. Surveying-vessel "Magpie," relative to certain dangers lying between Sandakan Harbour and Tambisan Island, north-east coast of Borneo, has been received from Commander the Honourable F. C. Vereker:—

##### (1.) Particulars of Nymphe Reef.

Nymphe Reef, consisting of coral and sand, with several heads on which the least water is 3 feet, extends in a N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. and S. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. direction for a distance of  $1\frac{3}{10}$  miles, with a breadth of 7 cables; the shoalest part is situated in lat.  $5^{\circ} 44' 12''$  N., long.  $118^{\circ} 40' 36''$  E. From this position Mount Hatton bears S.  $6^{\circ}$  E., distant 29 miles.

##### (2.) Particulars of Pegasus Reef.

Pegasus Reef (reported by H.M.S. "Pegasus" in 1882, see Notice to Mariners, No. 4 of 1883),  $1\frac{1}{10}$  miles in diameter, is composed of coral and sand, with rocky patches on the eastern side, on which the depths are 3 to 4 feet; the shoalest part lies in lat.  $5^{\circ} 45' 50''$  N., long.  $118^{\circ} 50' 30''$  E. From this position Mount Hatton bears S.  $12^{\circ}$  W., distant  $31\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

NOTE.—On the position of a shoal reported by H.M.S. "Fly" in 1883, as lying north-westward of Peri Brnk, in approximately lat.  $5^{\circ} 53'$  N., long.  $118^{\circ} 47'$  E. (see Notice to Mariners, No. 200 of 1883), a depth of 33 fathoms was obtained



by the "Magpie," with 31 to 39 fathoms around, bottom generally hard. This reported shoal is therefore considered identical with Pegasus Reef, and has been removed from the Admiralty Charts.

(3.) *Particulars of Gem Reef.*

Gem Reef (originally reported by the brig "Gem"), consisting of coral and sand, extends in a N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. direction for a distance of  $3\frac{3}{10}$  miles, with a breadth of  $1\frac{7}{10}$  miles; near the centre, there are two rocks with 4 and 7 feet on them respectively; depths of 40 fathoms were found on its northern and eastern sides, and 30 fathoms on the southern and western edges. The shoalest part is situated in lat.  $5^{\circ} 35' 15''$  N., long.  $119^{\circ} 8' 24''$  E. From this position, west point of Tambisan Island bears S.  $13^{\circ}$  W., distant  $8\frac{4}{10}$  miles, and Mount Hatton S.  $49\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W., distant  $32\frac{6}{10}$  miles.

NOTE.—The shoal reported by H.M.S. "Swinger" in 1878, as being situated in lat.  $5^{\circ} 34'$  N., long.  $119^{\circ} 10'$  E., is considered to be identical with Gem Reef.

(4.) *Particulars of René Shoal.*

René Shoal, lying between Tambisan Island and Gem Reef, with a depth of 25 fathoms between the reef and the shoal, extends in a N.W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. and S.E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  E. direction for a distance of  $4\frac{7}{10}$  miles, with a breadth of  $1\frac{6}{10}$  miles, and has average depths of 5 to 7 fathoms on it. A depth of 3 fathoms was found near its south-east end, lying with the following bearings and distance:—

Eastern extreme of Tanjong Unsang, S.  $36^{\circ}$  E. distant  $4\frac{3}{10}$  miles.

Position, lat.  $5^{\circ} 29' 40''$  N., long.  $119^{\circ} 10' 20''$  E.

NOTE.—René Shoal, and Modeste Shoal which had been reported to be situated in lat.  $5^{\circ} 30'$  N., long.  $119^{\circ} 11'$  E., are identical.

POSITIONS.—Mount Hatton, 1,990 feet in height, should be placed in lat.  $5^{\circ} 15' 5''$  N., long.  $118^{\circ} 42' 30''$  E.; west point of Tambisan Island in lat.  $5^{\circ} 27' 00''$  N., long.  $119^{\circ} 6' 10''$  E.

(5.) *Unsuccessful Search for Peri Bank.*

The "Magpie" crossed the reported position of Peri Bank (lat.  $5^{\circ} 47'$  N., long.  $118^{\circ} 5' \frac{1}{2}'$  E.), obtaining 48 fathoms, and no indication of shoal water was seen; its existence therefore in the position assigned is considered doubtful.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation  $2^{\circ}$  Easterly in 1883.]

(1.) *Tignish River Entrance—Additional Light Exhibited.*
