

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of January, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Places (namely),—(1.) the cow-shed and two fold-yards on the premises of John Jewitt, situate at Marston, in the West Riding of the county of York, together with the grass-field called Barnfield two grass fields known as Bottoms in the occupation of the said John Jewitt, and one grass field and two arable fields in the occupation of William Dumvill, and (2.) the grassfield called Oxfield, in the occupation of Thomas Coates, situate at Marston, in the West Riding of the county of York, and the field immediately adjoining thereto on each said thereof, together with the grassfields called White Firths or Powells Fields and the several farm buildings and premises at Glebe farm and adjoining Oxfield Pasture in the occupation of the said Thomas Coates at Marston aforesaid,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the seventh and eighth days of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be Places infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

The following Place (namely),—a grass field called Tadcaster Ings (in which several of the parishioners have a common right of pasturage), and the two grass fields adjoining thereto on the north side called the Surgeons fields, the two latter occupied respectively by William Smith and John Dyson, and the grass field also adjoining thereto on the north-west side occupied by Matthew Kidd, situate in Tadcaster West, in the West Riding of the county of York,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Place (namely),—the Home-stead at the farm at Burdon village, near Sunderland, in the county of Durham, in the occupation of George Mallam, together with a grass field and other premises, bounded by a road from Burdon village to Ryhope and thence to Thristley House on the east and south, and lands in the occupation of Miss Gregson on the west,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE ENGLAND AND WALES MARKETS AND FAIRS TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1883, AMENDMENT No. 3.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The England and Wales Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1883 (in this Order referred to as the Markets Order) is hereby amended as follows :

Exclusion of certain Districts from Markets Order.

The provisions of the Markets Order shall not apply to the following Districts (namely),—

County of Somerset,
Borough of Bath,
Borough of Bridgwater,
Borough of Chard,
Borough of Glastonbury,
Borough of Taunton,
Borough of Wells,
Borough of Yeovil,
County of Denbigh,
Borough of Denbigh,
Borough of Ruthin,
Borough of Wrexham,
County of Montgomery,
Borough of Llanidloes,
Borough of Welshpool,

and The Markets Order shall be read and have effect as if those Districts were included in the Schedule to that Order.

2. This Order may be cited as The England and Wales Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1883, Amendment No. 3.
