IT is hereby notified that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Despatch from Mr. Carew Hunt, Her Majesty's Consul at Port-au-Prince, dated the 5th of January, 1884, stating that the town of Jacmel (see Gazette of January 29, 1884), had surrendered to the troops of the President of the Republic of Haiti.

Mr. Hunt further states that Miragoâne was, at the date of his Despatch, the only place in Haiti left in the hands of the revolutionary party (see Gazettes of May 22 and July 19, 1883).

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, with the exception of the parishes of Haddenham, Wilburton, Stretham, Sutton, Thetford, Witchford, Wentworth, Mepal, Downham, Ely, Coveney, and Grunty Fen,—is, except such portions thereof as are included in the Areas described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the parishes of Benwick, Doddington, March, Wimbington, Whittlesey, and Stanground, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely; (2.) the parish of Whitcham, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely; (3.) the parish of Littleport, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely; and (4.) the parish of Elm, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely;—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Declaration described in the Schedule to this Order, made by the Local Authority for the borough of Brighton, declaring the existence of foot-and-mouth disease at the Place therein mentioned, is hereby cancelled, and the Infected Place thereby declared shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Place (namely),—so much of the borough of Brighton as is comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, starting from the point of junction of the Hastings Line of Railway with the Corporation Water Works Reservoir north of Hollingdean-road, following the western boundary of the said Reservoir to the south-west corner thereof, thence following the

southern boundary of the said Reservoir as far as the north-east corner of the sheds and premises in Freehold-terrace in the occupation of Edward Patching, thence following the eastern boundary of the said premises and an imaginary line drawn in continuation thereof to the south side of the road in front of Hollingdean-place, thence going eastward along the line of frontage of the buildings in Hollingdean-place as far as the north-east corner of the cow-shed and premises in the occupation of Charles Godden, thence following the eastern boundary of the said premises to the south-eastern corner thereof, thence following the southern boundary of the said premises and an imaginary line drawn in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of the slaughter-house premises in Hollingdean-road in the occupation of Alfred Goldsmith, thence following the eastern boundary of the said slaughter-house premises northwards to the tenement No. 21 Hollingdean-place in the occupation of Henry Mellish, thence following the southern boundary of the said tenement to the south-western corner thereof, thence following the western boundary of the said tenement to the northern boundary thereof, thence following the line of frontage of the buildings in

Hollingdean-place westwards to the north-west corner of the said slaughter-house premises in the occupation of Alfred Goldsmith, thence following the western boundary thereof to the northern boundary of the cow-shed in the occupation of James Payne, thence following the said last-mentioned boundary to the western boundary of the said slaughter-house premises in the occupation of Alfred Goldsmith, thence following the western boundary of the said slaughter-house premises and an imaginary line drawn in continuation thereof as far as the south side of Hollingdean-road, thence proceeding eastwards along the south side of Hollingdean-road to the west side of the Lewes-road, thence proceeding southwards as far as the Kemp Town Branch of Railway, thence following the said Kemp Town Branch of Railway westwards to its junction with the said Hastings Line of Railway, and thence following the said Hastings Line of Railway northwards to the point of starting,—is hereby declared to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Taganrog, stating with regard to the Customs' Regulations at that place, under which vessels arriving with cargoes are permitted to leave the port before such cargoes have been landed at the Custom House and their delivery verified, that the customs' authorities there will refuse to grant this permission in future unless the masters of vessels produce as guarantees for their responsibility in the matter persons of known respectability and position in Taganrog and such as are in every way satisfactory to the authorities. The Consul further states that he will be prepared to let masters know on application to him the names of those persons who are likely to be objected to if nominated as guarantees in such cases.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the Venerable Bede, Monkwearmouth, in the

county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, one yearly sum or stipend of sixty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and to be receivable in four equal portions, on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of the Venerable Bede, Monkwearmouth, shall be in addition to the yearly sum or stipend of like amount heretofore payable by us, the said Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said vicarage, subject to certain conditions under the authority of another instrument sealed by us on the second day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and published in the London Gazette on the tenth day of the same month: And provided also, that the said two yearly sums or stipends of sixty pounds each shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after each of the four above-mentioned days in each and every year of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Durham, that two Assistant-Curates, duly licensed by such Bishop, have been employed within the parish of the Venerable Bede, Monkwearmouth aforesaid, during the quarter of the year then ended, and that each of such Curates is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said parish and vicarage of the Venerable Bede, Monkwearmouth.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this twenty-fourth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of certain land, comprising two roods (or thereabouts), which has been permanently secured to the vicarage of Saint John, Horninglow, in the county of Stafford, and in the diocese of Lichfield, and in consideration also of a further benefaction, consisting of a sum of one hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the same vicarage, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Saint John, Horninglow, to meet the aforesaid benefactions, one capital sum of six hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint John, Horninglow.
