THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Lima, enclosing copies and translations of two Decrees signed by the Peruvian Minister of the Interior (1) revoking the Decree of the 4th November last, providing that all customs duties levied in Peru should be remitted to the Callao Custom House, and (2) fixing the export duties to be levied on silver. THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Athens enclosing the following copy of Quarantine Regulations issued by the Greek Government:—

1. Quarantine for ships, &c., coming from Egypt is reduced to a five days quarantine of observation.

2. Passengers and ships from Egypt which are now in Greek lazarettoes undergo the same five days quarantine of observation, unless their quarantine of eleven days finishes within that interval.

3. Everything from Bombay, whether or no it has touched in Egypt, will be subject to a quarantine of eleven days, from which shall be deducted the period of quarantine undergone either in Egypt or elsewhere.

4. Ships which have passed through the Suez

Canal, not coming from Bombay, will be subjected to a five days quarantine of observation.

5. Wool and rags coming from Egypt will not be admitted into any port of the Kingdom. Cotton coming direct from the mills will not be refused.

6. The inspection of the ships and steamers ordered by the Circular of the 1st of July is put an end to.
