Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented; must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

#### THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (SLAUGHTER) ORDER OF 1884.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of February, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

PRESENT:  
Lord President.  
Mr. Dodson.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1878,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

##### *Slaughter by Special Authority of Privy Council.*

1. Where a Local Authority is authorized by the Privy Council to put in operation the provisions of this Order, but not otherwise, such Local Authority may—

(a.) Cause any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine affected with foot-and-mouth disease to be slaughtered; or

(b.) Cause any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine being or having been in the same shed or herd or flock or pig-sty, or in contact, with any animal affected with foot-and-mouth disease to be slaughtered.

(c.) Provided, that if the owner of an animal gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or their Inspector or other officer, that he objects to the animal being slaughtered, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to slaughter that animal except with the further special authority of the Privy Council first obtained.

##### *Compensation.*

2. The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for cattle, sheep, goats, and swine slaughtered under the authority of this Order:

(a.) Where the animal slaughtered was affected with foot-and-mouth disease, the compensation shall be its value immediately before it became so affected:

(b.) In every other case the compensation shall be the value of the animal immediately before it was slaughtered.

##### *Application of General Provisions.*

3. The provisions of Section 30 of the Act of 1878, (*General provisions relative to slaughter and compensation*.) shall apply to the case of an animal slaughtered under the provisions of this Order.

##### *Movement of Diseased or suspected Animals for Slaughter.*

4. Where the slaughter under the authority of this Order of diseased or suspected animals in Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Places in the District of a Local Authority is impracticable or would be highly inconvenient, animals affected with or suspected of foot-and-mouth disease may, notwithstanding anything in The Animals Order of 1884, be moved out of a Foot-and-Mouth

Disease Infected Place and Circle and Area on a highway or thoroughfare for the purpose of being slaughtered in manner and under the conditions following, and not otherwise:

(a.) The diseased or suspected animals shall be moved with a Licence of the Local Authority, to a slaughter-house in a float or cattle-van properly constructed so as to prevent contact of the diseased or suspected animals with other animals during the movement.

(b.) The diseased or suspected animals shall be moved to the slaughter-house in charge of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority; and the same officer shall enforce and superintend the immediate slaughter there of the animals, and shall forthwith report the fact of the slaughter to the Local Authority.

(c.) The float or cattle-van shall immediately after each occasion of use be cleansed and disinfected, by or under the superintendence of the same officer, in manner provided respecting vans by Article 103 of The Animals Order of 1884.

Nothing in this Article shall authorize the movement of an animal affected with or suspected of foot-and-mouth disease into the District of another Local Authority, without the previous consent in writing of that other Local Authority or a Licence in that behalf of the Privy Council.

##### *Extent.*

5. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.

##### *Interpretation.*

6. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1884.

##### *Short Title.*

7. This Order may be cited as THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (SLAUGHTER) ORDER OF 1884.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The England and Wales Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1883 (in this Order referred to as the Markets Order) is hereby amended as follows:

##### *Exclusion of certain Districts from Markets Order.*

The provisions of the Markets Order shall not apply to the following Districts (namely),—

County of Cambridge,  
Borough of Cambridge,  
County of Gloucester,  
Borough of Bristol,  
Borough of Cheltenham,  
Borough of Gloucester,  
Borough of Tewkesbury,  
Parts of Holland (Lincolnshire),  
Borough of Boston,  
Borough of Stamford,

and the Markets Order shall be read and have effect as if those Districts were included in the Schedule to that Order.

2. This Order may be cited as The England and Wales Markets and Fairs Temporary Order of 1883, Amendment No. 11.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Odessa, a copy of the following Quarantine Regulations issued by the Russian Government:—

#### QUARANTINE REGULATIONS.

1. Vessels with clean bills of health arriving from Egyptian, Arabian, Indian, and Chinese ports, or which have during the voyage been in communication with these ports, are to be subjected to five days' quarantine of observation, excluding the time they took to perform the voyage.

2. Vessels of war, merchant ships, and passenger vessels employed in the coasting trade and with foreign ports furnished with clean bills of health, are to be subjected to the regulations and measures laid down by the quarantine statutes.

3. The five days observation and other measures relative to vessels with clean bills of health are to be carried out at all quarantine stations, as also at the Eupatoria and Sevastopol Quarantine Sub-stations.

4. Vessels with foul cholera bills of health are, without exception, to be subjected as heretofore

to fourteen days' quarantine at the Odessa, Theodosia, and Kertch head stations.

#### EXCHEQUER BILLS.

Metropolitan Board of Works.

AT a Meeting of the Board at their Office, Spring-gardens, Charing Cross, this 21st day of December, 1883, amongst the Orders is as follows:—Metropolis Management Act, 1855; Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862; Division of the Parish of Fulham into Wards.

WHEREAS by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, Section 41, it is enacted: "That when at any time upon any account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament, any of the parishes within the Metropolis not now divided into wards for the purpose of electing vestrymen, shall be found to contain more than 2,000 rated householders, it shall be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application in writing of the vestry or of not less than 500 rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine, and set out the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than 500 rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall, in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward, have regard as far as in

their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three." And whereas the parish of Fulham is within the limits of the Metropolis, as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and is one of the parishes in Part I. of Schedule B of that Act, and at the passing of the same Act the parish was not divided into wards, and the Vestry of the parish of Fulham having now applied to us, the Metropolitan Board of Works, to divide the said parish into wards pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862; and whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament that the said parish contains five thousand two hundred and eight rated householders, and that the number of inhabited houses in the parish is returned at five thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and the rateable annual value of property at one hundred and ninety-eight thousand three hundred and thirty-two pounds. Now the Metropolitan Board of Works, having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament as contained in the census return for the year 1881, that the number of rated householders for the parish of Fulham is five thousand two hundred and eight, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the same parish and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of Fulham be divided into three wards to be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the under-mentioned schedule, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said schedule.

**GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker.**

**Aberystwith Union.**

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Aberystwith Union, in the County of Cardigan:—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Aberystwith Union, it is required that certain accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

**ARTICLE I.**—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Aberystwith Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

**ARTICLE II.**—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Union for the time being.

**ARTICLE III.**—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as the Local Government Board shall from time to time direct or approve.

**ARTICLE IV.**—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians subject to the consent of the Local Government Board, or be removed by the Local Government Board, or be proved to be insane by evidence which that Board shall deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to the Local Government Board of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with the assent of the Local Government Board, appoint a person or persons, to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker, for a limited period only.

**ARTICLE V.**—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing

Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

**ARTICLE VI.**—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"as regards the quantities of stock remaining in

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

**ARTICLE VII.**—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the Stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE VIII.**—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians, at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE IX.**—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Order dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
