Brown, Adams, and Gurnell, on the south by lands occupied by Mr. W. Allis (including his farmstead) and the road leading from West Torrington to Wragby, on the east by lands occupied by Messrs. Sharpley, Epton, Rowson, Gurnell, and Gregson, and on the west by lands occupied by Mr. Bennard; including such parts of all the roads as intercept the before-named lands, or any of them.

THE FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE No. 2 TEMPORARY ORDER OF 1884.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Temporary Order of 1884.

Extent.

2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland only.

Commencement and Duration.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and shall continue in force until the Privy Council otherwise order.

Interpretation.

4. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Temporary Order of 1884.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement of Persons or Disinfection of Clothes.

5.—(1.) A Local Authority may, from time to time, make such Regulations as they think fit for the following purposes, or either of them:

(i.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement of persons into, in, or out of any Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place within their District or of so much as is within their District.

(ii.) For prescribing and regulating the disinfection of the clothes of persons coming in
