ORDERS for the Court's going into Mourning on Sunday next, the 30th instant, for His late Royal Highness The Prince Leopold. Duke of Albany, fourth son of Her Majesty The Queen; viz.:—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, white Gloves, black or white Shoes, Feathers, and Fans, Pearls, Diamonds, or plain gold or silver Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to wear black Court Dress, with black Swords and Buckles.

The Court to change the Mourning on Sunday, the 20th of April next, viz.:—

The Ladies to wear black Dresses, with coloured Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments, or grey or white Dresses, with black Ribbons, Flowers, Feathers, and Ornaments.

The Gentlemen to continue the same Mourning.

And on Sunday, the 11th of May next, the Court to go out of Mourning.

IN pursuance of Her Majesty's commands, these are to give public notice, that upon the melancholy occasion of the death of His late Royal Highness The Prince Leopold, Duke of Albany, fourth son of Her Majesty The Queen, it is expected that all persons do put themselves into Mourning for three weeks, to commence on Sunday the 30th instant.

in uniform, a band of black crape round the left arm, as prescribed by the regulations.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty have received Her Majesty's commands to direct, on the present melancholy occasion of the death of His Royal Highness the Prince Leopold, Dake of Albany, K.G., fourth son of Her Majesty the Queen, that the Officers of the Royal Nevy and Royal Marines be required to wear black crape round the left arm when in uniform.

The Mourning will commence from the 30th March, and be continued until the 11th May next.
