The QUEEN's Most Excellent Mujesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-

four, in the words following; that is to say:—
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for
England in pursuance of the Act of the fiftyninth year of His Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four, of the Act of the first and second years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and seven of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty chapter forty nine, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul situate at Grange-over-Sands in the parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Carlisle.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Paul situate at Grange-over-Sands as aforesaid.

" Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Harvey, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that portion of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel together with all that extra-parochial territory in the said county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Carlisle aforesaid which is called or known as 'Holme Island' all which por.ion of the said parish or parochial chapelry and all which said extra-parochial territory are described in the schedule hereunder written and together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and

T the Court at Windsor, the 14th day of | set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Paul situate at Grangeover-Sands as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul Grange-over-Sands.'

"And with the like consent of the said Harvey Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Paul situate at Grange-over-Sands as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul Grangeover-Sands being :-

"All that portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Carlisle wherein the present incumbent of such parish or parochial chapelry now possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded on the north-west and on the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Cartinel from the new parish of Saint Mary Allithwaite within the original limits of the same parish or parochial chapelry at the point near High Fell Gate where Cart-lane, Wart Barrow-lane, Haggs-lane and the road leading from Cartmel to Grange-over-Sands all meet and extending thence north-eastward and in a direct line for a distance of slightly more than a mile over the summit of Fell End Beacon to the southern angle of the new parish of Saint Peter Field Broughton also within the original limits of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel aforesaid at the Hospice of Hampsfell being, the summit of Hampsfeld Fell and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of nearly. a mile and a quarter to the eastern boundary of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel afore-

said at a point on the shore of Morecambe Bay 1" appears to him that the alteration may best be in the middle of the channel of the River Winster on the western side of Castle Head Marsh which said last-mentioned boundary also divides the said county of Lancaster from the county of Westmorland. All which said hereinbefore described portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than upon the north-west, and the north as aforesaid that is to say upon the east upon the south-east and upon the south-west as follows upon the east and south-east by the seashore in More-- cambe Bay aforesaid and upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Mary Allithwaite aforesaid. And also all that extra-parochial territory in the said county of Lancaster and in the diocese - of Carlisle aforesaid which is called or known as Holme Island and which is situate in that part of Morecambe Bay aforesaid which forms the eastern boundary of the above-described portion - of the parish or parochial chapelry of Cartmel."

And whereas the said representation has been sapproved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in » law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese - of Carlisle. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the : first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding "of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that " Whereas in some instances tithings, " hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts " may be separated from the parishes or mother "" churches to which they belong, with great " advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial "" may in some instances with advantage be · d annexed to parishes or districts to which they are "contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes "for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted. "That when with respect to "his own diocese it shall appear to the Arch-" bishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of "any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-"" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place or district within the diocese of such Arch-" bishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the "case may be, may be advantageously separated "from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be "united to any other parish to which it may be " "more conveniently annexed, or to any other "adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to "form a separate parish or benefice, or that "any extra-parochial place may with advantage "be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate " parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said "Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme "in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his

-" consideration) describing the mode in which it

" effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-"diction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and "other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, "and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, "may be made with justice to all parties "interested; and if the patron or patrons of the "benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or "their hands to such scheme, or to such modifica-"tion thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full " consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any "such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall " certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, " by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall "be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make "an Order for carrying such scheme, or modifica-"tion thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas Anthony Wilson, Bishop of

Rochester hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated 5th February 1884 to the Right Honourable Edward White, Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:

"1. There is in the county of Kent in my diocese of Rochester the vicarage of Gillingham and Upberry with the ville or hamlet of Lydging the ecclesiastical portion of the parish whereof including the hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing contains a population of 135 or thereabouts. The chapel of Lydging having become dilapidated for many years past and incapable of being again rendered fit for Divine service and having become dangerous has lately been taken down. The net dangerous has lately been taken down. The net annual value of the benefice of Gillingham and Upberry with the chapel of Lydging is four hundred and fifty pounds.

"2. In the same county and in your Grace's diocese of Canterbury is the vicarage of Bred-hurst the parish whereof (including a portion of the ancient parish of Boxley which has been separated therefrom and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Bredhurst) lies adjoining to the hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing aforesaid and contains according to the census of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one a population of three hundred. The net annual value of the benefice of Bredhurst is two hundred and sixty pounds and the rent arising from nine acres of glebe of the annual value of twenty pounds.

"3. A certain district of the said hamlet of Lydg- ... ing otherwise Lidsing in which said district the site of the said chapel of Lydging is situate and which immediately adjoins the said parish of Bredhurst and contains a population of thirty-five persons or thereabouts lies at the distance of between four and five miles by the nearest road from the parish church of Gillingham but is within the distance of three-quarters of a mile or thereabouts from the parish church of Bredhurst.

"4. It appears to me that the said district may under the provisions of the said Act of the 1st and 2nd Vic. cap. 106 and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign cap. 49 be advantageously separated from the said parish of Gillingham and united to the said parish of Bredhurst.

"5. Charles Leopold Samson of 31 Boothstreet Manchester Esquire Joseph Standley of Bury Lancashire Gentleman and John William Haslam of Stubbins Ramsbottom Lancashire Esquire are the patrons of the benefice of Gillingham and Upberry with the chapel of Lydging. The benefice of Bredhurst is in the patronage of the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

"6. The Reverend William Henry Robins is the

present incumbent of the benefice of Gillingham and Upberry with the chapel of Lydging and the Reverend John Durst is the present incumbent of the benefice of Bredhurst.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the district of the hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the parish of Bredhurst and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charge and other. ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consent in writing of the said Charles Leopold Samson Joseph Standley and John William Haslam the patrons of the said-vicarage of Gillingham and Upberry with the chapel of Lydging and of the said William Henry Robins and John Durst and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consent of the respective patrons thereto by your report to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme, drawn by the said Bishop of Rochester, is in the words and figures following:—

The SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Representation.

"It is proposed to separate a district of the hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing from the parish of Gillingham to which it now belongs and to unite such district for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of Bredhurst. That such district shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said vicarage of Bredhurst. It is further proposed that the boundaries of the said district shall be as follows an imaginary line commencing from the south-eastern angle of the field nod. 59 on the map annexed to the apportionment of rent-charge in lieu of tithes within the ville or

hamlet of Lidsing aforesaid and proceeding in a north-westerly direction to the south-eastern corner of the field nod. 62 on the said map thence along the north-eastern sides of the last-mentioned field and of the fields nod. 63 and 64 on the same map. to the road leading from Boxley to Chatham thence along that road in a south-westerly direction until it reaches the south-western corner of the field nod. 65 on the same map thence in a westerly direction along an imaginary line drawn across the said road and the fields nod. 38 and 15 on the same map to the south-eastern corner of the inter mixed fields nod, 4 and 5 on the samemap thence along the north-western side of the field nod. 12 on the said map to its western corner thence in a south-westerly direction along an imaginary line crossing the field nod. 11 on the same map to the boundary of Lidsing aforesaid at the junction of the lane leading to Westfield Sole with the road leading from Chatham to Bredhurst thence in an easterly direction along the boundary of the ville or hamlet of Lidsing. to the point at which the boundary of the district commenced. Such district will accordingly consist of the lands which on the map annexed to the apportionment of rent-charge in lieu of tithes within the ville or hamlet of Lidsing. aforesaid are marked with the numbers 11 (part). 12 13 14 15 (part) 38 (part) 39 to 58 (both inclusive) and 62 63 and 64 the said lands are delineated and coloured pink in the map heretoannexed.

"That the said vicarage of Gillingham and Upberry with the chapel of Lydging shall henceforth be styled 'The Vicarage of Gillingham and Upberry' only.

"That there shall be assigned and attached to the Vicarage of Bredhurst the yearly sum of twenty-two pounds eighteen shillings part of the rent-charge of ninety-nine pounds eight shillings per annum given in lieu of the ordinary tithes of; the land within the ville or hamlet of Lidsing under the provisions of the Act for the commutation of tithes in England and Wales such yearly sum of twenty-two pounds eighteen shillings being composed of the several sums assessed upon the lands specified in the schedule hereunder written vizt.:—

SCHEDULE of Part of Lidsing Rent-charge.

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but that any extraordinary tithe on the said lands shall continue to belong to the vicar of Gillingham and Upberry. That the vicar of the vicarage of Bredhurst shall have exclusive cure of souls within the said district as well as within the said parish of Bredhurst and that all the fees for churchings marriages and burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed at the church or churchyard of Bredhurst aforesaid in respect of the inhabitants of the said district shall henceforth belong and be received by the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Bredhurst aforesaid.

"That the inhabitants of the said district shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the church of Gillingham aforesaid except in the case of any person or persons (if such there be) who now possess a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings within the said church and who may not

be willing to relinquish the same.

"That nothing in this scheme shall be so construed as to limit the right hitherto exercised by any of the inhabitants of the said district of burial in the churchyard of Gillingham.

"That the parishioners of such district shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Gillingham but shall be liable to the repairs of the parish church of Bredhurst."

And whereas the said Archbishop, and Charles Leopold Samson, Joseph Standley and John William Haslam, as patrons, and the Reverend William Henry Robins and the Reverend John Durst, as Incumbents of the said respective benefices, have signed the consent following:—

" CONSENT.

"I the Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury being the patron or the person entitled to present to the benefice of Bredhurst in the county of Kent and my diocese of Canterbury in case the same were now vacant and we Charles Leopold Samson of 31 Boothstreet Manchester Esquire Joseph Standley of Bury Lancashire Gentleman and John William Haslam of Stubbins Ramsbottom Lancashire Esquire being the patrons or the persons entitled to present to the benefice of Gillingham with Upberry with the chapel of Lydging in the said county of Kent and diocese of Rochester in case the same were now vacant and we the Reverend William Henry Robins and the Reverend John Durst the incumbents of the said respective benefices do hereby respectively signify our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating a district from the parish of Gillingham and Upberry with the chapel of Lydging and annexing the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Bredhurst.

And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration, and whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same, and the consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, by his report dated the 19th day of February, 1834, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Lord Bishop of Rochester has represented unto

us (amongst other things)

"That there is in the county of Kent and diocese of Rochester the vicarage of Gillingham and Upberry with the ville or hamlet of Lydging the ecclesiastical portion of the parish whereof including the hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing contains a population of one hundred and thirty-five or thereabouts. The chapel of Lydging having become dilapidated for many years past and incapable of being again rendered fit for Divine service and having become dangerous has lately been taken down.

"That in the same county and in our diocese of Canterbury is the vicarage of Bredhurst the parish whereof (including a portion of the ancient parish of Boxley which has been separated therefrom and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Bredhurst) lies adjoining to the hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing aforesaid and contains a population of three hundred.

"That a certain district of the said hamlet of Lydging otherwise Lidsing in which said district the site of the said chapel of Lydging is situate and which immediately adjoins the said parish of Bredhurst and containing a population of thirty-five persons or thereabouts lies at the distance of between four and five miles by the nearest road from the parish church of Gillingham but is within the distance of three quarters of a mile or thereabouts from the parish church of Bredhurst.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said district may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Gillingham and united to

the said parish of Bredhurst.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges or other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and of the incumbents of the said benefices has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

"As witness our hand the nineteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said scheme be carried into effect. C. L. Peel.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth

and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyards hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyards be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the churchyard of Ripton-Abbotts, in the county of Huntingdon, to the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty four.

In the churchyard of Edmonton, Middlesex, to the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

In the churchyard of Coningsby, in the county of Lincoln, to the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

In the churchyard of St. John's, Moulsham, in the parish of Chelmsford, in the county of Essex, to the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty four.

In the parish churchyard of Hornsea, in the county of York, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four. C. L. Peel.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act; 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely), -in the parish of West Torrington, in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, bounded on the north by lands occupied by Messrs. Brown, Adams, and Gurnell, on the south by lands occupied by Mr. W. Allis (including his farmstead) and the road leading from West Torrington to Wragby, on the east by lands occupied by Messrs. Sharpley, Epton, Rowson, Gurnell, and Gregson, and on the west by lands occupied by Mr. Bennard; including such parts of all the roads as intercept the before-named lands, or any of them,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eightyfour, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from footand-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
