INSTRUMENT assigning a Particular District to the Church of Saint Barnabas, Sutton New Town, situate within the limits of the Parish of Sutton, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Rochester.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, send greeting:

WHEREAS a church has lately been built within the limits of the parish of Sutton, in the county of Surrey, and in the said diocese of Rochester, by and at the expense of certain well disposed persons, who have, with the approbation of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and of the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, secured to the said new church an endowment and a repair fund, in accordance with the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or of some of them, and particularly of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-seven.

And whereas under the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts or in some of them, and in the Act of the nincteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, by an instrument bearing date on or about the twenty-fourth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, declared that the perpetual right of patronage of, and of nominating a minister to serve, the said new church from time to time and at all times whenever it should be requisite to nominate a minister to serve the same should, from and after the consecration of such church, be vested in, and be exercised by, and belong to the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, and by his successors Bishops of that diocese for ever.

And whereas the said church has since been consecrated, and is called "The Church of Saint Barnabas, Sutton New Town."
