## THE ADMIRALTY FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARVES ORDER OF 1884.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of May, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### *Special Provisions for Admiralty Wharves.*

1.—(1.) The provisions of Chapter II (FOREIGN ANIMALS SUBJECT TO SLAUGHTER) of The Foreign Animals Order of 1884 shall not, as from the commencement of this Order, apply to an Admiralty Wharf, and in lieu thereof the special provisions of this Order shall apply thereto.

(2.) All other provisions of The Foreign Animals Order of 1884 shall, so far as the same are applicable, continue to extend to an Admiralty Wharf.

### *Ports having Admiralty Wharves.*

2. The following are the ports at which parts are at the date of this Order, by Special Orders of the Privy Council, defined as Foreign Animals Wharves for Naval purposes only:

Plymouth.  
Portsmouth.

### *Charge of Animals on Landing.*

3. Animals landed in an Admiralty Wharf shall, when landed, be placed under the charge of an Inspector of the Privy Council; and, until his arrival, they shall remain under the charge of the Commissioners of Customs.

### *Time for Slaughter.*

4.—(1.) Animals landed in an Admiralty Wharf shall be slaughtered within fourteen days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing.

(2.) The slaughter of the animals may be commenced at any time after the landing thereof, with the permission of an Inspector of the Privy Council.

(3.) The slaughter of the animals shall be commenced at such time after the landing thereof as the Privy Council in any case direct, and when commenced shall be completed as soon as practicable.

### *Movement of Carcases, &c.*

5.—(1.) No carcase, fodder, litter, or dung shall be removed from an Admiralty Wharf, except with the permission of an Inspector of the Privy Council.

(2.) If the Inspector of the Privy Council is of opinion that any such carcase or thing as aforesaid may introduce disease the same shall be destroyed or otherwise dealt with in accordance with instructions from time to time given by the Privy Council.

### *Disinfection of Dung and Manure.*

6. Dung and manure shall, before being removed from an Admiralty Wharf, be disinfected to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Privy Council.

### *Disinfection of Admiralty Wharf.*

7. Where an animal in an Admiralty Wharf is affected with disease, the portion of the Wharf where the diseased animal is or has been, shall not be used for animals unless and until that portion has been cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Privy Council.

### *Animals other than Foreign in Admiralty Wharf.*

8. Any animal being in an Admiralty Wharf shall be deemed to be a foreign animal, and the Regulations relating to the Wharf shall apply to such animal.

### *Interpretation.*

9. In this Order—

Admiralty Wharf means a part of a port defined by Special Order of the Privy Council as a Foreign Animals Wharf for Naval purposes only.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order of 1884.

### *Short Title.*

10. This Order may be cited as THE ADMIRALTY FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARVES ORDER OF 1884.

### *Commencement.*

11. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.
