WHEREAS by an Act passed in the forty-fifth and forty-sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "The Militia Act, 1882," it is

amongst other things enacted that Her Majesty may, with the advice of Her Privy Council, order the calling out of all or any part of the Militia to be dispensed with :

And whereas it has seemed fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to dispense with the calling out of the 3rd (Militia) Battalion, Berkshire Regiment, and to direct that there shall be no training and exercising thereof in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four :

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth hereby dispense with the calling out of the 3rd Battalion, Berkshire Regiment, and doth order and direct that there shall be no training and exercise thereof in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and this Order be published in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Honourable Thomas Henry William Pelham, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as Commissioner for the purpose of determining the boundaries of the Wards of the Borough of Scarborough, and of apportioning the Councillors thereto, transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, his determination and apportionment in the following terms :—

" MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1882.

" (45 and 46 Vict. c. 50.)

" Borough of Scarborough.

" WHEREAS Her Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Scarborough shall be divided, and to order and direct that the said Borough shall be divided into six wards, which order was made on the second day of February, 1884.

" And whereas on the twenty-fifth day of March, 1884, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the 30th section of the said Act, did duly appoint the Honourable Thomas Henry William Pelham, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of such Wards, and for apportioning the Councillors of the said Borough among such Wards as in the said Act mentioned.

" Now I the said Thomas Henry William Pelham, do hereby in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act, determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the six Wards into which the said Borough is to be divided, which Wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows, that is to say :—

" Ward No. 1 otherwise the North Ward,]

" Ward No. 2 otherwise the North-West Ward.

" Ward No. 3 otherwise the Central Ward.

" Ward No. 4 otherwise the East Ward.

" Ward No. 5 otherwise the West Ward.

" Ward No. 6 otherwise the South Ward.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 1, otherwise the North Ward, shall comprise so much of the Borough of Scarborough as is contained within a line commencing at a

point in the Borough boundary on the foreshore opposite the northern extremity of the Castle, and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the north-western boundary of the Castle Yard to a point in the centre of Castle-road in the main entrance of the Castle, and thence in a westerly or south-westerly direction along the centre of Castle-road to the junction of Castle-road with Cemetery-road, and thence along the centre of Cemetery-road to the point where the said road crosses the Borough boundary, and thence in a north-easterly and easterly direction along the northern boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement before described.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 2, otherwise the North-West Ward, shall comprise so much of the Borough of Scarborough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the Borough boundary in the centre of Cemetery-road, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Cemetery-road to the junction of Cemetery-road with Castle-road and thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Castle-road and Victoria-road to the junction of Victoria-road with Falsgrave-road, and thence along the centre of Falsgrave-road to a point in the centre of the said last-mentioned road immediately over the centre of the Scarborough and Whitby Railway line, and thence in a north-westerly direction above or along the centre of the said railway line to where the said railway line crosses the Borough boundary, and thence in a north-easterly direction along the Borough boundary to the point of commencement above described.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 3, otherwise the Central Ward, shall comprise so much of the Borough of Scarborough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the Borough boundary on the foreshore opposite the centre of the road known as Bland's Cliff, and proceeding thence up the centre of the said Bland's Cliff, St. Helen's-square, Cross-street and Auborough-street to the junction of Auborough-street with Castle-road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Castle-road and Victoria-road to the junction of Victoria-road with Falsgrave-road, and thence along the centre of Falsgrave-road to a point in the centre of the road known as Belgrave-terrace, thence in a south easterly direction along the centre of Belgrave-terrace and across the railway bridge to the centre of Westwood-road, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Westwood-road, to a point opposite the centre of the Park Entrance, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the north roadway of the Park to a point in the centre of the Ramsdale Valley-road and thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the Ramsdale Valley-road and of the roadway over the Aquarium to a point in the Borough boundary on the foreshore opposite to the centre of the said last-mentioned roadway, and thence in a northerly direction along the Borough boundary to the point of commencement before described.

" And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 4, otherwise the East Ward, shall comprise so much of the Borough of Scarborough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the Borough boundary on the foreshore opposite to the centre of the road known as Bland's Cliff, and proceeding thence up the centre of the said Bland's Cliff, St. Helen's-square, Cross-street, and Auborough-street to the junction of Auborough-street with Castle-road, and thence in

an easterly direction along the centre of Castle-road to a point in the centre of the said road in the main entrance to the Castle, and thence in a north-easterly direction along the north-western boundary of the Castle Yard to a point in the Borough boundary on the foreshore opposite the northern extremity of the Castle, and thence in a generally southerly direction along the Borough boundary to the point of commencement before described.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 5, otherwise the West Ward, shall comprise so much of the Borough of Scarborough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the Borough boundary in the centre of the Scarborough and Whitby Railway line, and proceeding thence in a south-easterly direction along or above the centre of the said railway line to a point in the centre of the Falsgrave-road immediately over the centre of the said railway line, and thence eastward along the centre of Falsgrave-road to its junction with the road known as Belgrave-terrace, and thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Belgrave-terrace to a point in the centre of the bridge over the North-Eastern Railway line, and thence in a south-westerly and southerly direction along the centre of the said railway line to the point where the said line crosses the Borough boundary, and thence along the said Borough boundary in a north-westerly, northerly, and north-easterly direction to the point of commencement before described.

"And I do hereby determine that the said Ward No. 6, otherwise the South Ward, shall comprise so much of the Borough of Scarborough as is contained within a line commencing at a point in the Borough boundary on the foreshore opposite the centre of the roadway passing over the Aquarium, and proceeding thence in a westerly direction along the centre of the said roadway and the Ramsdale Valley-road to a point in the centre of the said last-mentioned road opposite the centre of the north roadway of the Park, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the said north roadway to the centre of Westwood-road, and thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Westwood-road to a point opposite the centre of the Bridge over the North Eastern Railway, and thence to the centre of the said railway line under the said Bridge, and thence in a south-westerly and southerly direction along the centre of the said railway line to the point where the said railway line crosses the Borough boundary, and thence first in an easterly and then in a northerly direction along the Borough boundary to the point of commencement before described.

"And I, the said Thomas Henry William Pelham do hereby in further pursuance of the said Act and of the powers given me under the same by virtue of the said appointment, assign and apportion three Councillors to each and every of the said several Wards as follows, that is to say:—

"To Ward No. 1:—Samuel Woodhouse.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such enquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as herein-after directed, cause with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be

"lawful for Her Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the patrons, if there be more than one patron, shall present or nominate to such united benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant."

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Christopher Lord Bishop of Lincoln as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Toft and the rectory of Newton by Toft both in the county of Lincoln having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice. We inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Right Honourable Roundell Earl Selborne Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain acting for and on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria is the patron of the said rectory of Toft and is entitled to present to the said rectory the same being now vacant and Percival Spearman Wilkinson of Mount Oswald in the county of Durham Esquire is the patron or person entitled to present to the said rectory of Newton by Toft if the same were now vacant and that they consent to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln our inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only and for declaring that the patronage of such united benefice shall be exercised by the respective patrons in an alternate course or succession and that the first turn of presentation to the said united benefice shall belong to and be exercised by the patron for the time being of the said rectory of Newton by Toft.

"As witness our hand this twenty-eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four. "Edw. Cantuar."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Toft situate in the county and diocese of Lincoln, and the rectory of Newton by Toft situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice, with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to direct that the patronage of such united benefice shall be exercised by the respective patrons in an alternate course or succession, and that the first turn of presentation to the said united benefice shall belong to, and be exercised by, the patron, for the time being, of the said rectory of Newton by Toft.
