

to the said intended archdeaconry as the endowment thereof and further that if and in case the said intended archdeaconry shall not within twelve calendar months from the date of this scheme have been constituted and also endowed by the annexation thereto of the said benefice or if at anytime the said benefice of Saint George Barrow shall cease to be annexed to and held with the said intended archdeaconry in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed then and in either of such cases the said sum of five thousand pounds perpetual debenture stock of the Furness Railway Company shall be repaid or re-transferred to the said William Duke of Devonshire or his executors administrators or assigns and to the representatives of the said late Walter Francis Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry in equal shares or in such manner as they or their respective executors administrators or assigns shall direct and appoint.

"And whereas it appears to us that under the circumstances hereinbefore set forth the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint George Barrow to the Bishop of Carlisle for the time being will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls within the said new parish of Saint George Barrow.

"And whereas the said Harvey Bishop of Carlisle has proposed to us and has represented to us that it is in his opinion desirable that the boundary between and the areas of the two Archdeacons of Carlisle and Westmorland within the diocese of Carlisle should be altered by the transfer of the said rural deanery of Keswick from the said Archdeaconry of Carlisle to the said Archdeaconry of Westmorland and that the said archdeaconry of Westmorland so enlarged should on account of the increase of population which has of late years taken place within the same be divided into two archdeacons and that one of such archdeacons should continue to be called 'the Archdeaconry of Westmorland' and that the other of such archdeacons should be called 'the Archdeaconry of Furness' and should comprise and consist of that portion of the existing Archdeaconry of Westmorland which is described in the third part of the schedule hereto annexed.

"And whereas it appears to us expedient that the said proposals of the said Bishop should be carried into effect in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint George Barrow is situate within the limits of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Furness and with such augmentation of endowment and income as aforesaid the same benefice appears to us to be a suitable endowment for the said proposed archdeaconry.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint George Barrow is now vacant.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Duke of Devonshire Henry William Schneider and Sir James Ramsden (in testimony whereof they have set their respective hands and seals to this scheme) and with the consent of the said Harvey Bishop of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he hath set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the whole patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said benefice of Saint George Barrow aforesaid shall upon and from the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme may be published in the London Gazette be without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order transferred from the said William Duke of Devonshire Henry William

Schneider and Sir James Ramsden and from their heirs and assigns to and shall thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Harvey Bishop of Carlisle and his successors Bishops of Carlisle for ever.

"And with the like consent of the said Harvey Bishop of Carlisle (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose that upon and from the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette as aforesaid the boundary between and the areas of the said Archdeacons of Carlisle and Westmorland shall be altered by the exclusion from the Archdeaconry of Carlisle of the said Rural Deanery of Keswick and the inclusion of the same rural deanery within the said Archdeaconry of Westmorland so that the Archdeaconry of Carlisle shall thereafter comprise and consist of only those rural deaneries the names whereof are specified and set forth in the first part of the schedule annexed to this scheme.

"And we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose that upon and from the said lastly mentioned date the said Archdeaconry of Westmorland so enlarged as aforesaid by the inclusion therein of the Rural Deanery of Keswick shall be divided into and become two separate archdeacons whereof the new archdeaconry shall be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Furness' and shall comprise and consist of the several rural deaneries the names whereof are specified and set forth in the third part of the said schedule and the other archdeaconry shall continue to be styled 'The Archdeaconry of Westmorland' and shall comprise and consist of only those rural deaneries the names whereof are specified and set forth in the second part of the same schedule.

"And we further recommend and propose that the rural deans and others the clergy and inhabitants of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Furness be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Furness for the time being who shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an archdeacon within the limits of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Furness.

"And we further recommend and propose that the right of appointing the Archdeacon of Furness shall be vested in the said Harvey Bishop of Carlisle and his successors Bishops of Carlisle for ever.

"And with the consent as well of the said William Duke of Devonshire Henry William Schneider and Sir James Ramsden (testified as aforesaid) as also of the said Harvey Bishop of Carlisle aforesaid (testified as aforesaid) we further recommend and propose that upon and from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid the said benefice of Saint George Barrow which is now vacant as aforesaid shall become and be annexed and united to the Archdeaconry of Furness so hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be formed and constituted as and for an endowment of the same archdeaconry and that the first and every succeeding archdeacon appointed to the same Archdeaconry of Furness shall upon his appointment thereto become and be incumbent of the said benefice of Saint George Barrow and shall possess and enjoy and exercise all the rights privileges emoluments powers and duties belonging to the said benefice and to the incumbent thereof so long as he shall remain Archdeacon of Furness and no longer.

"And we further recommend and propose
