NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 87.)—MEDITERRANEAN.—ITALY—  
WEST COAST.

(1.) *Giglio Islands—Particulars of Fenaio Point Light.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 109 (1), of 25th April, 1883, on the exhibition of a flashing white light on Fenaio Point, westward of Morto Point, northern extreme of Giglio Island, Tuscan Archipelago:—

Information has been received, that the light shows flashes of five seconds' duration, with eclipses of ten seconds. It should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles.

IONIAN SEA—CORFU SOUTH CHANNEL.

(2.) *Withdrawal of Lefchimo Point Light-Vessel.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 76, of 19th April, 1884, on the exhibition of a revolving white light on the northern point of Sivota (Sybota) Island, near Mourzo (Mourtzo or Murto), eastern side of Corfu South Channel, coast of Albania:—

The Hellenic Government has given notice, that on 15th May, 1884, consequent on the exhibition of Sivota Island Light, Lefchimo (Alefkino) Point Light-vessel, on the western side of Corfu South Channel, coast of Corfu, will be withdrawn.

(3.) *Particulars of Mersyn Light.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 278 (2), of 18th September, 1883, on a new lighthouse having been erected near Mersyn (Mersyna), on the extremity of the point, about half a mile south-westward of the old lighthouse:—

Information has been received, that the light is a fixed and flashing white light, showing a fixed light for a period of sixty seconds; eclipse of fifteen seconds; a flash of six seconds; followed by an eclipse of fifteen seconds. It is elevated 53 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

*Zannone Island—Flashing Light on Cape Negro.*

THE Italian Government has given notice, that on 15th May, 1884, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on Cape Negro, the northern extreme of Zannone Island, Ponza Islands:—

every five seconds, visible through an arc of 221° or except where obscured by the high land of the island; it will be elevated 38 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The lighthouse, octagonal in shape, rises above a one-storied dwelling; the whole being painted yellow.
