The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of May, 1884, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to effect certain changes in the arrangements for awarding Naval and Greenwich Hospital Pensions to Officers of the Royal Navy, by altering the distribution of the pensions; by establishing pensions for Chief Gunners, Chief Boatswains, and Chief Carpenters; by increasing the number of Greenwich Hospital Pensions allotted to Warrant Officers; and by establishing a few pensions for Pensioned Chief Officers of Coast Guard.

"We would humbly submit the following proposals for Your Majesty's sanction :—

"(1.) That the following be the numbers of pensions established for Captains, Commanders, Lieutenants, Captains retired from the Staff Captains' List, and Paymasters in lieu of those fixed by Article 1987 of Your Majesty's Regulations for the Navy 1879, and Order in Council of 1st April 1881 :—

"Captains ...	5	1	£ 80
"Commanders ...	18	5	65
"Lieutenants ...	42	3	50
"Captains retired from Staff Captains' List ...	1	2	80
"Paymasters - in-Chief and Paymasters... ..	Nil.	15	50

"(2.) That the re-apportionment, so far as relates to the above-mentioned pensions, be carried out in such manner as may seem to us to be suitable.

"(3.) That further provisions for appropriation of pensions lapsing under these proposals, and not hereby allotted to other classes of officers, shall be submitted by us for Your Majesty's sanction.

"(4.) That the following Greenwich Hospital Pensions of £35 a year shall be established :—

- "Chief Gunners, 2 pensions.
- "Chief Boatswains, 2 pensions.
- "Chief Carpenters, 2 pensions.

These officers to cease to be eligible for the Warrant Officers' Pensions of £25 a year. The qualification in respect of service, &c., to be same as hitherto for the £25 pensions.

"(5.) That the Warrant Officers' Greenwich Hospital Pensions of £25 a year, shall be increased in number—

- "For Gunners, from 5 to 16.
- "For Boatswains, from 6 to 16.
- "For Carpenters, from 4 to 9.

"(6.) That three pensions of £25 a year shall be established for Pensioned Chief Officers of Coastguard. That Pensioned Chief Officers of Cruisers, Senior Mates of such vessels, and Chief Officers of Stations shall be eligible for these pensions. The qualification of service to be subject to such modifications as may seem to us, from time to time, desirable, 10 years' service as Chief Officer of Station, Chief Officer, Senior Mate, or Inspecting Officer of Coastguard.

"An Officer who has received severe wounds in action or disabling hurts in actual service to be exempted from the foregoing rule as to service.

"An Officer who has been granted civil superannuation to be ineligible for a pension.

"We would represent to Your Majesty that the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have concurred in the arrangements affecting Naval Pensions."

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second

and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of All Saints Blackheath in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester and for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham also in the county of Kent and diocese of Rochester aforesaid.

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twelfth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine and published in the London Gazette upon the nineteenth day of the same month a part of the parish of Lewisham in the said county of Kent but at that time in the diocese of London was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church called All Saints situate at Blackheath in the said parish of Lewisham and the same district chapelry was called ‘the District Chapelry of All Saints Blackheath.’

“And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five and published in the London Gazette upon the thirtieth day of the same month a part of the said parish of Lewisham at that time in the diocese of London as aforesaid was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Stephen situate in such parish and the same district chapelry was called ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Stephen Lewisham.’

“And whereas both the said district chapelry of All Saints Blackheath and also the said district chapelry of Saint Stephen Lewisham have under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four each become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the said above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of All Saints Blackheath should be altered by way of extension so that they shall include a further part of the said parish of Lewisham and that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham should also be altered by way of extension so that they likewise shall include a further part of the parish of Lewisham aforesaid.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order

of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of All Saints Blackheath shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all that part of the said parish of Lewisham which is described in the first schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and numbered I and which is thereon coloured pink and also that from and after the same day the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all that other part of the said parish of Lewisham which is described in the second schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and numbered II and which is thereon coloured pink and that from and after the said day of publication as aforesaid and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said part of the parish of Lewisham so to be included within the boundaries of the new parish of All Saints Blackheath as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of All Saints Blackheath and in like manner the said other part of the parish of Lewisham aforesaid so to be included within the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of All Saints Blackheath in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester being:—

“All that portion of the parish of Lewisham in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is bounded upon all sides as follows that is to say on the east by the said new parish of All Saints Blackheath on the north by the parish of Greenwich in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the west by the new parish of the Ascension Blackheath in the said county and diocese and on the south by the parish of Lee in the same county and diocese.

“THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

“The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester being:—

“All that portion of the parish of Lewisham in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls and which is bounded upon all sides as follows that is to say on the south partly by the parish of Lee in the said county and diocese and partly by the said new parish of Saint Stephen Lewisham on the south-west by the last-named new parish and on the north-west and north-east by the new parish of the Ascension Blackheath in the county and diocese aforesaid.”

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six and published in the London Gazette on the ninth day of May in the same year a part of the parish of Rochdale in the county and diocese aforesaid was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Alban situate within the limits of the said parish of Rochdale and the same district chapelry was called 'The District Chapelry of Saint Alban Rochdale.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Alban Rochdale has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and by the said above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale were altered by way of extension so as to include a further portion of the parish of Rochdale.

"And whereas it has been represented to us,

and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale should be again altered by way of extension so that they shall include certain other portions of the said parish of Rochdale.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all those portions of the said parish of Rochdale which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and are thereon coloured pink and that from and after the day of the same date, and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portions of the parish of Rochdale so to be included as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory proposed to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, being:—

"1. All that portion of the parish of Rochdale in the county and diocese aforesaid wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls which is comprised within and is co-extensive with the limits of the plot or parcel of land situate on the northern side of Drake-street at its junction with Latin-street, and containing by admeasurement eleven hundred and sixty-four square yards or thereabouts all which said plot or parcel of land with the buildings erected thereon was by a deed under the authority of the 'Schools Sites Acts 1841 to 1851,' and bearing date the sixth day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, granted and conveyed by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to the vicar and churchwardens for the time being of the new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale aforesaid as and for a site for a school with a teacher's residence, such school to be for the use of certain of the residents within the same new parish.

"2. And also all that other portion of the parish of Rochdale aforesaid which consists of that part of Latin-street aforesaid measuring one hundred and thirty-six feet and seven inches or thereabouts in length which abuts upon the western front of the above-described plot or parcel of land, and which intervenes between such front and the boundary which, in the middle of the same street, divides the said parish of Rochdale from the new parish of Saint Alban Rochdale aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and in-

cumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer (if and so far only as a transfer is needed) of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called the said benefice) of Cockington in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas the said benefice of Cockington is a district chapelry and new parish and the limits of the said district chapelry and new parish as defined by the Order of Your Majesty in Council creating the same (which Order is dated the nineteenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one and was published in the London Gazette of the twenty-third day of the same month), are co-extensive with the limits of the parochial chapelry and civil parish of Cockington which parochial chapelry and civil parish was prior to and up to the date of the same Order united with the parochial chapelry of Tormohun in the said county of Devon and diocese of Exeter as one benefice.

"And whereas Richard Mallock of Cockington Court in the said parochial chapelry of Cockington, Esquire, and his predecessors in estate have aforetime been accustomed as patrons of the united benefice of Tormohun and Cockington to present thereto Clerks each of whom was thereupon admitted as incumbent of the same benefice.

"And whereas upon and in consequence of the passing of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the nineteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one as aforesaid whereby the said benefice of Cockington was in effect separated from the said parochial chapelry of Tormohun doubts have arisen as to whether the patronage and right of presentation or nomination to the said benefice of Cockington is still vested in the said Richard Mallock as aforesaid or whether on the contrary the same may have become vested in and exercisable by the vicar of the benefice (that is to say of the said parochial chapelry) of Tormohun and his successors.

"And whereas the said Richard Mallock has out of his own private resources made considerable additions by way of augmentation to the endowment of the said benefice of Cockington under the belief and impression that the patronage of and right of presentation to the same benefice was well vested in himself and his heirs and assigns and the said Richard Mallock is desirous to make further augmentations of similar character of the endowment of the same benefice and in particular is now ready to secure for the benefit thereof a capital sum of one hundred and fifty pounds cash and the said last-mentioned benefaction has been accordingly paid over to us upon the faith and understanding that all doubt as to the patronage of the said benefice being well vested in him the said Richard Mallock and his heirs and assigns shall be removed and that to that end, we the said Commissioners shall lay before Your Majesty in Council the present scheme.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Frederick now Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter acting as Bishop of the diocese whose consent as such is by the Acts in the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them made necessary and the Reverend Edward Becher Prince, Clerk in Holy Orders now incumbent of the benefice of Tormohun have each of them on behalf of himself and his successors consented to the arrangement as to the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Cockington which is hereinbefore described and hereinafter proposed to be effected and each of them the said Bishop and incumbent hath accordingly executed this scheme as herein-after mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Frederick Bishop of Exeter and of the said Edward Becher Prince Incumbent of Tormohun (in testimony whereof the said Bishop hath signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal and the said Edward Becher Prince hath also signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Cockington shall if and in so far as the same is now vested in the incumbent of the said benefice of Tormohun be transferred from such incumbent and his successors incumbents of the same benefice to and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised solely by the said Richard Mallock and his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs intimation to the effect that the Egyptian Maritime and Sanitary Board have imposed quarantine on all arrivals from Rangoon since the 23rd ultimo: that quarantine has also been imposed on arrivals from Saigon in consequence of cholera prevailing at that place, and from Singapore, Colombo, Point de Galle, and Perim, unless those ports impose quarantine against Saigon and India ports in quarantine against Egypt in the same manner as Aden.

Manchester, Bury, and Rochdale Tramways
(Extensions) Order, 1882.

"The Tramways Act, 1870."

To all whom it may concern.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in them by the 46th section of "The Tramways Act, 1870," and of the 84th section of the said Extensions Order the Local Board of Littleborough have made Bye-laws and Regulations, dated the 15th day of May, 1884, as to the rate of speed to be observed in travelling upon the tramways; the distances at which carriages using the tramways shall be allowed to follow one after the other; the stopping of carriages using the tramways; and the traffic on the roads in which the tramways are laid; and for other purposes; and that the schedule hereto contains a copy of such Bye-laws and Regulations.—Dated at Todmorden this 19th day of May, 1884.

The Schedule above referred to.

1. No tramway carriage (hereinafter called "Car") shall travel at a greater or higher rate of speed in the district of the Littleborough Local Board than eight miles an hour.

2. No car shall follow any other car on the same line of rails at a nearer distance than 150 yards.

3. Every driver and conductor of any car shall stop for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers in the course of its journey, whenever required by any passenger or person desiring to enter or leave any car; but no car shall stop at or within 10 yards on either side of any crossing from one line of tramway to another line of tramway, or at or within 10 yards of any crossing over any street.

4. The drivers and conductors of all cars shall have their brakes always under control, and use their utmost endeavours to avoid any collision with or injury to any animals or foot passengers, and shall keep a good look out for children incautiously straying or walking in the streets or main-road, or attempting to cross over in the face of an approaching car, and shall, by using a special bell-signal, give warning of the approaching car. This signal shall also be made at every starting of the car.

5. When any car is following any vehicle, a space of 20 yards between the car and such vehicle shall be allowed, so that in the event of the vehicle

pulling up suddenly no collision may result therefrom; but every vehicle shall go out of the way of the car with all despatch, so as to keep the tramway clear for the use of the car.

6. No car shall be stopped abreast, or within 12 yards of another car, on an adjoining line of rails; and when cars on different lines are passing each other, the conductors and drivers shall respectively slacken the speed of the cars, and gently put on their brakes, to guard against running over persons that may be crossing in the rear of either car.

7. In the event of any street being blocked, the driver of any car shall stop the same before arriving at the place where the block occurs, so as to keep an open space of 20 yards between the block and the car for carriages to pass.

8. When cars are going in opposite directions and likely to meet near a facing point (whether such facing point leads to a junction, siding, or cross-over) drivers shall not pass each other until they are certain that the car first approaching such facing point has taken it safely. The car about to take a point shall have the precedence of the other.

9. All drivers of cars on coming in sight of any cart, carriage, or other vehicle standing on the line of tramway on which he is plying, or by the side thereof, without there being free space to pass, shall use the special bell signal as a warning to the drivers or persons in charge of any such cart, carriage, or other vehicle, and such signal shall be made use of for a distance of 30 yards at least before coming up to such cart, carriage, or other vehicle.

10. No car shall remain stationary upon the main road within the district of the Littleborough Local Board longer than six minutes.

11. The above Bye-laws and Regulations shall be strictly and faithfully observed and performed in all points. Any proprietor, conductor, or driver of a car, and any person whomsoever who shall be convicted of a breach or contravention of these Bye-laws, or any of them, shall be liable in a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.
