

General at Algiers:—28th June.—In consequence of three cases of cholera at Marseilles, Algeria has put French ports in Mediterranean in quarantine. Five days Italy and Spain by reciprocity twenty days.

The Board have also received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following Telegram, which reached the Colonial Office on the 28th ultimo:—Five days quarantine imposed on arrivals from Toulon and from all contaminated ports.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris:—29th June.—I have received the following from Vice-Consul at Bayonne, dated to-day:—"Royal Decree issued imposing quarantine of seven days upon all persons entering Spain by railway. At Irun and other roads all baggage and parcels to be opened and disinfected. Vessels leaving Bayonne to quarantine at Santander or Gigon. Sanitary condition good here."
