THE Queen, as Sovereign of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, has been graciously pleased by Letters Patent under Her Royal Sign Manual and the Great Seal of the Order, bearing date this day, to dispense with all the Statutes and regulations usually observed in regard to Installation, and and grant unto the Most Noble George Douglas, Duke of Argyll, Knight of the Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, and the Right Honourable Edward Henry, Earl of Derby, Knights of the said Most Noble Order, and duly invested with the Ensigns thereof, full power and authority to exercise, respectively, all rights and privileges belonging to a Knight Companion of the said Most Noble Order of the Garter, in as full and ample a manner as if they had been formally installed, any decree, rule, or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

PASSPORT NOTIFICATION.

A DESPATCH has been received from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin stating that travellers visiting Germany who neglect to provide themselves with passports thereby expose themselves to considerable inconvenience, more especially in Berlin and other large towns where the minor state of siege (kleine Belagerungs Zustand) is in force, as the police authorities in those cities are obliged to insist upon the production of a passport before the traveller is entitled to reside there for however short a time while that state of siege continues. British subjects intending to visit Germany are therefore recommended to provide themselves with passports.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in The Foreign Animals Order of 1884, the cargo of cattle brought from Boston in the United States of America to the Port of Glasgow, which cattle are at the time of the making of this Order on board the vessel Justitia lying in Glasgow Harbour, may be transhipped in Glasgow Harbour from such vessel into another vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford in the port of London.

2. Those cattle shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs; and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the cattle on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford in the port of London.

3. The landing-vessel shall, immediately after the landing of such cattle, and before the taking on board of any other animal or other cargo, be cleansed and disinfected in manner provided respecting vessels by Article 41 of The Foreign Animals Order of 1884.

4. The cattle so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

5. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

6. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Foreign Animals Order of 1884.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Bradwell-near-the-Sea, in the county of Essex,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at St. Petersburg, enclosing a translation from the Russian Official Gazette of the 27th ultimo-9th instant, announcing that, by a resolution of the State Council, confirmed by His Imperial Majesty the Czar, a duty is about to be levied on all coal, turf-coal,

charcoal, coke, and turf imported into Russia, according to the following scale:—

$\frac{1}{2}$ copeck (gold) per poud (11.8d. per ton) at the Baltic ports.

2 copecks (gold) per poud (3s. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton) at the Black Sea ports.

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ copecks (gold) per poud (2s. 11 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per ton) along the land frontier.

The import duty on cast iron in pigs and scrap will also be raised as from the 1st-13th instant, from 6 copecks per poud (11s. 10d. per ton) to 9 copecks per poud (17s. 9d. per ton) for the period to 1st-13th March, 1885. From that date to the 1st-13th March, 1886, the duty will be at the rate of 12 copecks per poud (23s. 8d. per ton)—the duty for succeeding years being at the rate of 15 copecks per poud (29s. 7d. per ton). No reduction is to be made from the duty on iron during the term of twelve years from the date of the publication of the resolution of the State Council.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Madeira, reporting as follows:—

July 7.—By a recent decision of the Board of Health at Lisbon all the ports of England and the English Mediterranean ports are considered "suspected" of cholera; a quarantine of observation is consequently imposed on ships arriving from such English ports.

The decision came into operation here on the 6th instant.

Ships arriving from the suspected ports will not be admitted to free pratique until five days after their departure from those ports, nor unless they bring clean bills of health certified by a Portuguese Consul, and it be proved by a certificate of the ship's surgeon that there had been no suspicious sickness on board either in course of the ships' voyage, or during their stay at ports of departure, provided also that the Portuguese Consular or other competent officer informs, by telegraph, the Chief Officer of the Health Department here that no cases of cholera have occurred at such ports during the five days subsequent to the ship's departure.

In the absence of any telegraphic information, and when there is no surgeon on board ships, their people, baggage, and susceptible cargo will have to perform a quarantine of observation of five days duration, after which they will be admitted to free pratique if no sickness should have occurred on board in the interval.

No lazaretto on shore has yet been provided for the reception of passengers and cargo, but means are likely to be arranged for the performance of quarantine of observation afloat.

This quarantine will not hinder the coaling and provisioning of ships at the port of Funchal.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the "Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing and taking of wild birds were prohibited for the time between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year, and by the 8th section power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds, or any of them, was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

And whereas the Justices of the county of Northumberland, in Quarter Sessions assembled, have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds is prohibited shall be varied in the county of Northumberland, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 11th day of August, in each year.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the said Act, and on such application as aforesaid, hereby order as follows:—

The time during which the killing, wounding, and taking of wild birds is prohibited, shall be varied in the county of Northumberland, so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 11th day of August, in each year.

THE Lords Commissioners of the Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, held at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, on the 9th of July, 1884, in accordance with the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th of June, 1871, the following verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the Queen's Remembrancer, viz:—

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, and which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand

eight hundred and eighty-four, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether sixteen sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces, and six half-sovereigns or ten shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule of the Coinage Act, 1870. We found that there was no variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the Standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus one ten-thousandth (ozs. .0001) and, therefore, that the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue three sovereigns and three half-sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123.354 grains, the second 123.257 grains, and the third 123.374 grains; and that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 61.587 grains, the second 61.707 grains, and the third 61.587 grains. We then assayed the said three sovereigns and three half-sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be 916.5, 916.4, and 916.6 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereigns to be 916.5, 916.5, and 916.8 respectively. We also took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether twenty-three half-crowns, twenty-three florins, thirty-five shillings, thirty-one sixpences, one fourpenny piece, twenty-four threepenny pieces, one twopenny piece, and one penny piece, and weighed each of the said Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy of the said First Schedule of the said Coinage Act, 1870. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act was minus seven thousandths of an ounce (oz. .007) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to weight. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the Standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that there was no variation from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue one half-crown, one florin, one shilling, one sixpence, and one threepenny piece, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crown weighed 217.431 grains, that such florin weighed 174.315 grains, that such shilling weighed 87.243 grains, that such sixpence weighed 43.736 grains, and that such threepenny

piece weighed 21.818 grains. We then assayed the said half-crown, the said florin, the said shilling, the said sixpence, and the said three-penny piece separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crown to be 925.7, of such florin to be 925.8, of such shilling to be 925.8, of such sixpence to be 925.8, and of such threepenny piece to be 925.9.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the said Township of Litherland, according to the last Census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said Township, held in Saint Thomas' Church Schools, Bedford-place, Seaforth, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday, the 27th day of March, 1884, it was resolved,—

“That the Act 13 and 14 Vict., cap. 57, be applied to and put in force in this Township so far as relates to the appointment of “a Vestry Clerk.”

And whereas the Overseers of the Poor of the said Township have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of

"Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said Township of Litherland.

ARTICLE II.—Every person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk for the said Township as aforesaid, shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the West Derby Union, in the County of Lancaster, a Bond, in a penal sum of not less than One Hundred Pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, not being officers of that Union, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, or of either of them having compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs by arrangement, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die, or become bankrupt, or who may have compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs as aforesaid.

Provided that the Guardians may accept as a security the guarantee of any Company or Association which shall undertake to guarantee the good conduct of such officer, and shall give their guarantee in a security, the form whereof shall have been approved by the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board under their Seal.

ARTICLE III.—The Overseers of the Poor of the said Township shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk, under the authority of this Order, a salary at the rate of Sixty Pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as the Local Government Board may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accru-

ing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Apportionment Act, 1870," and shall be paid quarterly at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Lady Day, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, and Christmas Day.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Overseers of the Poor of the said Township.
