THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs an extract from a Note from the Russian Ambassador, intimating that vessels from parts of France infected with cholera will, at Russian ports of the Black Sea, be subjected to fifteen days quarantine, without taking into consideration any quarantine which they may have undergone at foreign ports. At Russian ports of the Baltic all vessels from France will be subjected to a rigorous sanitary inspection, and, if they come from an infected port, will be refused admission, unless they have previously undergone quarantine at a foreign port.

POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE POST OFFICE (MONEY ORDERS) ACTS, 1848 TO 1883.

WHEREAS the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, provides that subject to the Post Office Regulations, the Postmaster-General, with the consent of the Treasury, may for the purpose of the transmission of small sums through the Post Office authorize his officers or any of them to issue Orders (hereinafter referred to as Postal Orders) in the form set forth in the Schedule to that Act, subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Act.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 and 1880, the Postmaster-General is authorized with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury to make Post Office Regulations relating to Money Orders and to the persons by or to whom Money Orders shall be paid, and to the times at which and the mode in which the same shall be paid.

And whereas by the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1883, certain alterations in the form of Postal Orders as set forth in the schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, are sanctioned, and the Postmaster-General is empowered, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her

Majesty's Treasury, to prescribe by Post Office Regulations further modifications of the form of Postal Orders and the several amounts (not exceeding twenty shillings) of such Orders, and the sums of poundage (not exceeding two pence) to be taken in respect of such Orders, and it was amongst other things provided that where an arrangement is made with the Government of any British Possession for the transmission of small sums through the Post Offices of the United Kingdom, and such British Possession by means of Money Orders of a like character to those issued under the Post Office (Money Orders) Act, 1880, as amended by that Act the said Act as amended by that Act should so far as is consistent with the tenour thereof and subject to the prescribed modifications, apply in like manner as if an Order issued in pursuance of such arrangement, whether by an officer of the Post Office or of such British Possession, was an Order under the said Act as amended by that Act and that such portions of the said Act as enact punishment should apply accordingly.

And whereas an arrangement has been made with the Government of British India for the issue in British India and payment in the United Kingdom and Gibraltar and Constantinople of Postal Orders in the form and subject to the Regulations hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Henry Fawcett, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, in pursuance of the said Acts, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, do hereby order as follows:—

1. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1884.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations Postal Orders issued at any Post Office in British India may be paid in the United Kingdom, Gibraltar, and Constantinople by any officer or person for the time being there authorized to pay Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom.

3. Every Postal Order issued in British India as aforesaid shall be in the form and of one of the amounts specified in the Regulations made under the Post Office (Money Orders) Acts, 1848 to 1883, and dated the 28th day of January, 1884, or any other Regulations for the time being in force with reference to Postal Orders issued in the United Kingdom, and all the provisions of the said Regulations shall apply to Orders issued in British India as aforesaid so far as the nature of the case admits.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:—Cholera Regulations.—(Rags from Marseilles or Toulon).—Port of London.

To the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of London;—

To all Officers of Customs;—

To the Medical Officer of Health of the said Port Sanitary Authority;

To all Masters of Ships;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent at Marseilles and Toulon, in the Republic of France,

and it is expedient, in order to prevent the spread of the disease, that rules and regulations should be made with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags exported from either of those places and consigned to this country :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 52 of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and Section 130 of The Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of London :

Definitions.

ART. 1.—In this Order —

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat ;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs :

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship :

ART. 2. From and after the date of this Order, no rags exported from Marseilles or Toulon shall be landed at any place in England or Wales.

ART. 3. No master of a ship having such rags on board, and no consignee of or other person having any control over such rags shall permit the same to be landed in contravention of this Order.

ART. 4. If in contravention of this Order any such rags are landed, it shall be the duty of the said Port Sanitary Authority to take proceedings against the persons who may be responsible for such landing ; and, unless the rags are immediately re-shipped, to cause the same to be destroyed, with such precautions as may be recommended by the Medical Officer of Health of the said Authority.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent at Marseilles and Toulon, in the Republic of France, and it is expedient, in order to prevent the spread of the disease, that rules and regulations should

be made with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags exported from either of those places and consigned to this country :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of The Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the several Authorities herein-after named :

Definitions.

ART. 1.—In this Order—

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat ;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs :

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship :

ART. 2. From and after the date of this Order, no rags exported from Marseilles or Toulon shall be landed at any place in England or Wales.

ART. 3. No master of a ship having such rags on board, and no consignee of or other person having any control over such rags shall permit the same to be landed in contravention of this Order.

ART. 4. If, in contravention of this Order, any such rags are landed it shall be the duty of the Port Sanitary Authority, within the jurisdiction whereof the same are landed, or if there be no such Port Sanitary Authority, then of the Urban or Rural Sanitary Authority in whose district the same are landed, to take proceedings against the persons who may be responsible for such landing ; and, unless the rags are immediately re-shipped, to cause the same to be destroyed, with such precautions as may be recommended by the Medical Officer of Health.
