To all the Local Authorities in Scotland, under the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867, within whose District there is a Port or Harbour ;-

To the Medical Officers of Health of such Local Authorities ; -

To all Officers of Customs ;-To all Masters of Ships ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent at Marseilles and Toulon, in the Republic of France, and it is expedient, in order to prevent the spread of the disease, that rules and regulations should be made with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags exported from either of those places and consigned to this country:

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Section 6 of the Act passed in the sixth year of His Majesty King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, intituled "An Act to Repeal the several Laws relating to Quarantine, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof," and every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Lords of the Council do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

ARTICLE 1. In this Order-

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the

Commissioners of Customs; The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship.

ARTICLE 2. From and after the date of this Order, no rags exported from Marseilles or Toulon shall be landed at any place in Scotland.

ARTICLE 3. No master of a ship having such

rags on board, and no consignee of or other person having any control over such rags shall permit the same to be landed in contravention of this Order.

ARTICLE 4. If, in contravention of this Order, any such rags are landed it shall be the duty of the Local Authority to take proceedings against the persons who may be responsible for such landing; and, unless the rags are immediately re-shipped, to cause the same to be destroyed, with such precautions as may be recommended by the Medical Officer of Health of the said Authority.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Christiania, stating that the Norwegian import duty on unbleached linen, hemp, and jute tissues, weighing less than 110 grammes per half metre square, has been reduced from 13 ore per kilo. (7s. 4d. per cwt.) to 7 ore per kilo. (3s. 11 d. per cwt.) The Despatch is accompanied by a detailed statement of certain other alterations which have been made in the Norwegian customs tariff, the duties affected being those on spirit and other varnish and polish and drying oils; flax, hemp, and jute yarn; barbed fencing wire; molasses and syrup; drawing instruments; and tobacco stalks.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin, who reports with reference to the outbreak of cholera in France, that:-The precautions to be taken at German ports are to be in accordance with the circular instructions to the Local Authorities of July 5, 1883, and the special measures to be adopted in the case of persons entering Germany from France by land are to be confined to a medical examination at the frontier railway stations, which is to take place in the railway carriages, and not in a room or building set apart

Persons presenting suspicious symptoms will not be permitled to continue their journey, but will be detained for treatment in a suitable building, and the cerriages in which they have travelled will be stopped and disinfected before

being again used.

To all Port Sanitary Authorities ;-

To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities;— To the Medical Officers of Health of the said Sanitary Authorities ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent at Marseilles and Toulon, in the Republic of France, and it is expedient that Rules and Regulations should be made with reference to rags brought from those places:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this hehalf, make the following Regulations:

ARTICLE I .- In this Order "Sanitary Authority" means Port Sanitary Authority, Urban Sanitary Authority, and Rural Sanitary Authority.

ARTICLE II. - If any rags from Marseilles or Toulon, in the Republic of France, whether exported from those Ports or any other Port, have, since the thirtieth day of June last, been landed in any place in England or Wales, and are for the time being deposited in any place therein, the consignee of the rags, and any person having control over the same, shall not remove them or permit them to be removed from such last-mentioned place, except with the express authority in writing of the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary Authority having jurisdiction in such place.

ARTICLE III.—The Medical Officer of Health

may give the authority referred to in Article 2 of this Order either conditionally or unconditionally; and if such authority is given subject to conditions as to the disinfection or otherwise of the rags, either before or after their removal, or as to their destruction, the consignee of the rags, or other person having control over them, shall cause them to be removed, and shall comply with such conditions; and it shall be the duty of the Medical Officer of Health to satisfy himself that the conditions are duly complied with.

The southern extreme of the reefs, north-eastward of Sawákin, bears N. 654° E. from the entrance to that harbour, distant 2 3 ths miles.

Pending further information, the approach from Mersá Sheikh Barud to the northward, and that from Tellah Tellah Seghir Island to the southeastward, should alone be used.

Northern Approach .- Aroud Trelor Mountain, in lat. 19° 34½ N., long. 36° 55' E., forms the best mark for making Sanganeb Reef-the outer horse-shoe reef north-eastward of Mersá Sheikh

Barud-from seaward.

This mountain is high and whale-backed, and has, when seen from the eastward, a distinct notch on the south side of its summit; the next range to the northward is of the same height, but has several bold conical summits, with some remarkably pointed lower peaks.
