THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Austrian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz. :—

Circular of the Maritime Government to all Officials holding Sanitary Appointments.

By order of the Minister of Commerce, the Maritime Government decrees,—

Ships leaving Spanish ports of the Mediterranean on and after the 6th instant, will on arrival

in Austrian ports be subjected to ten days quarantine of observation provided their voyage has been healthy, and to twenty days quarantine of observation in case of an unhealthy voyage, or grave suspicion of sickness on board on arrival. This quarantine to be extended in cases of need by the Authorities.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies copy of a Notice issued by the Administrator of the Gambia, intimating that all arrivals from France which have occupied less than twenty days on their voyage will be placed in quarantine, the duration of which will depend upon the length of the voyage and the condition and health of the crew on arrival; and that all vessels from any infected port of France which shall have occupied less than twenty days on their voyage will be subjected to a varying period of not more than twenty days, dependent on the length of voyage and the health and condition of crew.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of Notices issued by the Greek Government intimating that all arrivals from the coast of Tunis will be subjected to five days quarantine of observation. This regulation to apply to departures from Tunis eight days previous to the publication of the notice (19th September), and that all arrivals which, during their voyage, touch at any port in Italy, will be treated in the same manner as arrivals from Italy.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of an Ordinance respecting quarantine issued by the Italian Government, of which the following is a translation, viz. :—

ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH No. 24.

Some cases of cholera having been certified at various points on the coast of the Bay of Naples, the Minister of the Interior decrees :—

ART. 1. The quarantine regulations prescribed by the Ordinance No. 20 of the 2nd instant, shall be applied to all vessels starting on or after to-day's date from any harbour or landing-place of the coast of the mainland of the Bay of Naples.

ART. 2. The lazaretto of Nisida shall continue to be kept isolated for the passing of quarantine for ships going there for that purpose.

The prefects of the maritime provinces of the kingdom are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's
Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in
this behalf, do by this Warrant made on the repre-
sentation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General
(testified by his signing the same), and under the
hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order,
direct, and declare as follows:—

1. All Treasury Warrants at any time hereto-
fore made relating to the conveyance by post of
postal packets (which term in this Warrant means
and includes all letters, post cards, newspapers,
packets of commercial papers, packets of printed
papers, and pattern or sample packets) between
the United Kingdom and Patagonia, Terra del
Fuego, and Staten Island, and also between any
British Colony or Foreign Country and Patagonia,
Terra del Fuego, and Staten Island aforesaid, are
hereby annulled to the extent to which such
Warrants respectively relate to the several mat-
ters comprised in this Warrant as aforesaid.

2. The rates of postage and additional sum for
registration now chargeable and payable by the
authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 29th
day of May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder
written, on postal packets conveyed or delivered
for conveyance by post from or to the Argentine
Confederation, to or from any other country or
place affected by the provisions of such last-men-
tioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879,
and all regulations and conditions as to the post-
ing, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of
postal packets conveyed or delivered for convey-
ance by post, now in force and applicable thereto,
shall extend and apply to all postal packets con-
veyed or delivered for conveyance by post from
or to Patagonia, Terra del Fuego, and Staten
Island aforesaid to or from any other country or
place affected by the provisions of such last-men-
tioned Warrant of the 29th day of May, 1879, in
the same way as if Patagonia, Terra del Fuego,
and Staten Island aforesaid had been named in
such last-mentioned Warrant of the 29th day of
May, 1879, or the schedules thereunder written.

3. This Warrant shall come into operation on
the first day of October, one thousand eight hun-
dred and eighty-four.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Govern-
ment Board:—Cholera Regulations.—(Rags from
Spain.)

To all Port Sanitary Authorities;—

To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities;—

To all Officers of Customs;—

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sani-
tary Authorities aforesaid;—

To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent in
certain parts of Spain, and it is expedient that
regulations should be made with reference to
Ships having on board bales of Rags from that
country:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government
Board, do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of
the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the
Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power
enabling Us in this behalf, make the following

regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the Authority or Authorities hereinafter specified:—

ART. 1. In this Order—

The term "Sanitary Authority" means Port Sanitary Authority, Urban Sanitary Authority, or Rural Sanitary Authority;

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs;

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship.

ART. 2. From and after the date of this Order, and until the first day of November, 1884, no rags from Spain shall be delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, nor landed in any port or place in England or Wales.

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to prohibit the delivery overside or landing of any rags which may have been previously proved to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Authority into whose jurisdiction or district the same may be brought, or any officer duly authorised by the Sanitary Authority for that purpose, and certified accordingly by such Authority or Officer, not to have come either directly or indirectly from any place where Cholera has occurred during the present year.

ART. 3. If any rags shall be delivered overside or landed in contravention of this Order, they shall, unless forthwith exported, be destroyed by the person having control over the same, with such precautions as may be directed by the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary Authority within whose jurisdiction or district the same may be found.

ART. 4. All masters of vessels, consignees, and other persons having control of any rags prohibited under this Order from being delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, or landed, are required to obey these regulations.

ART. 5. All Officers of Customs are empowered to prevent the delivery overside or landing of rags in contravention of this Order.

ART. 6. It shall be the duty of the Sanitary Authority to take proceedings against masters of ships, consignees, or other persons having control over any rags, who shall wilfully neglect or refuse to obey or carry out, or shall obstruct the execution of any of these regulations.

Compton Gifford Local Government District.

NOTICE.—The following Bye-laws and Regulations have been made by the Local Board of Compton Gifford, in the county of Devon, as the Local Authority, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, at a Meeting of such Board, held the 3rd September, 1884:—

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the district of Compton Gifford; and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or car.

2. The driver of every car in descending the incline on the Tavistock-road, known as Townsend-hill, shall not drive the same at a speed exceeding four miles an hour, and shall bring the car to a complete stop at the top, and also at the bottom of the said incline.

3. Except, as directed by Bye-law No. 2, the driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

4. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than fifty yards.

5. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 4 and 6, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required, by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

6. Except at a passing place or a terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

7. The driver of any car stopping at the terminus shall not allow the same to remain longer than five minutes on the outer line of rails of the loop line.

8. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

9. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

10. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence, ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
