#### SAVINGS BANK (INVESTMENTS) REGULATIONS, 1884.

WHEREAS by the Savings Banks Act, 1880, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are empowered with the consent of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt (hereinafter referred to as the National Debt Commissioners), so far as any Regulations relate to those Commissioners, and with the consent of the Postmaster-General, so far as any Regulations relate to Post Office Savings Banks, from time to time to make, and when made to revoke, alter, or add to Regulations in respect of the matters mentioned or referred to in the said Act.

And whereas by the National Debt (Conversion of Stock) Act, 1884, it is enacted that Regulations made in pursuance of the Savings Banks Act, 1880, with respect to investments in and sales of stock through the medium of Trustee and Post Office Savings Banks may provide for investments in  $2\frac{3}{4}$  Stock and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per Cent. Stock and otherwise, as in the last-mentioned Act mentioned, and that for the purpose of Regulations made in pursuance of the last-mentioned Act the expression "Government Stock" in the Savings Banks Act, 1880, shall be deemed to include  $2\frac{3}{4}$  per Cent. Stock and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per Cent. Stock.

And whereas under the provisions of the Savings Banks Act, 1880, Regulations were on the 6th day of November, 1880, and the 31st day of December, 1881, respectively made by the

Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, with the consent of the National Debt Commissioners and Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, and it is expedient that the said Regulations should be amended, and that further Regulations should be made.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, under and by virtue of all powers and authorities vested in us in that behalf, do, with the consent of the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and with the consent of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

#### Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited for all purposes as the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1884.

#### Commencement of Regulations.

2. These Regulations come into operation upon the date thereof, so far as regards exchange or conversion of stock, and from the 20th October, so far as regards purchase of  $2\frac{3}{4}$  or  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per Cent. Stock.

#### Interpretation.

3. These Regulations shall be read as one with the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1880 (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations of 1880), and with the Regulations hereinbefore referred to made on the 31st day of December, 1881 (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations of 1881), and subject as in these Regulations provided, expressions to which meanings are assigned by the Regulations of 1880, or the Regulations of 1881, have in these Regulations the same respective meanings.

#### Extension of Regulations to $2\frac{3}{4}$ and $2\frac{1}{2}$ per Cent. Stock.

4. The expression "Government Stock" as used in and for the purposes of the Regulations of 1880, the Regulations of 1881, and these Regulations, shall from the date of these Regulations mean and include in addition to the descriptions of Stock in the Regulations of 1880 expressly referred to,  $2\frac{3}{4}$  per Cent. Stock and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per Cent. Stock, as respectively defined or referred to in the National Debt (Conversion of Stock) Act, 1884, and all the provisions of the Regulations of 1880 and the Regulations of 1881 shall apply to such  $2\frac{3}{4}$  per Cent. Stock and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per Cent. Stock in the same manner in all respects as such Regulations apply to the several descriptions of Stock in the Regulations of 1880 expressly referred to.

#### Exchange of 3 per Cent. Stock for $2\frac{3}{4}$ or $2\frac{1}{2}$ per Cent. Stock.

5. A depositor in a Savings Bank who desires to exchange any sum of 3 per Cent. Stock standing to his credit in the Stock Register of the Savings Bank may do so provided that the new Stock taken in exchange shall not exceed £300 on his sending to the Savings Bank Authority, together with his deposit book and investment certificate, an application signed by him on a form to be obtained at the Bank in which he is a depositor, or in the case of a depositor in the Post Office Savings Bank, at the Chief Office.

Within seven days from the receipt of such application the Savings Bank Authority shall write off the amount of 3 per Cent. Stock previously standing to the credit of the depositor in the Stock Register of the Savings Bank, and shall credit the depositor in such Stock Register with the equivalent amount of  $2\frac{3}{4}$  per Cent. Stock or  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per Cent. Stock, as the case may be, and shall send to the depositor a certificate of the exchange of Stock thus effected (in these Regu-

lations called "an Exchange Certificate") in the Trustee Savings Bank in the Form (A) in the Schedule hereto annexed, and in the case of the Post Office Savings Bank in the Form (B) in that Schedule.

*Proceedings of National Debt Commissioners in relation to Exchange.*

6. On receipt of an application from a depositor for the exchange of any 3 per Cent. Stock standing to his credit for 2½ per Cent. Stock or 2¼ per Cent. Stock, as the case may be, the Savings Bank Authority shall forthwith give notice to the National Debt Commissioners of the request, and shall at the same time certify whether the amount of 3 per Cent. Stock referred to in the application is standing to the credit of the depositor in the Stock Register of the Savings Bank.

The Commissioners, on receipt of the notice, shall forthwith make the necessary application to the Bank of England, under the Conversion of

Stock Act, in order that the required amount of 2¼ per Cent. or 2½ per Cent. Stock referred to in the notice may be placed to the credit of the Savings Bank Investment Account, in lieu of the 3 per Cent. Stock referred to in the notice, and the 2¼ per Cent. or 2½ per Cent. Stock, when so placed, shall be held by the Commissioners on account of the Savings Bank Authority, and the Savings Bank Authority shall be advised accordingly.

*Exchange of Stock by Minor.*

7. Where any 3 per cent. Stock is standing to the credit of a minor in a Savings Bank, either alone or on a joint account with any other person, an application for the exchange of such Stock or part thereof under the provisions of these Regulations may be made by the minor at the age, and subject to the conditions, at and subject to which an application for the withdrawal of a deposit in that Savings Bank, may, in pursuance of the Regulations relating to the Savings Bank, be made by the minor.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England send greeting :

WHEREAS a new church has lately been built within the parish of Sidestrand, in the county of Norfolk, and in the diocese of Norwich, and has been consecrated and dedicated to Saint Michael.

And whereas the Honourable and Right Reverend John Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich, and the Right Honourable John George Dodson, the Chancellor of Her Majesty's Duchy of Lancaster, in right whereof Her Majesty is patron of the rectory of the said parish of Sidestrand for every alternate turn or right of presentation, and Samuel Hoare, of Cromer, in the said county of Norfolk, Esquire, who is the patron of the same rectory for every other alternate turn or right of presentation, and the Reverend Forster George Simpson, Clerk in Holy Orders, Incumbent of the same rectory, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the second day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parish of Sidestrand that the said new church of Saint Michael, situate within such parish, should be substituted for the old parish church (also dedicated to Saint Michael) of the same parish.

Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf contained

in the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her present Majesty, chapter seventy, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling us in the same behalf, do, by this instrument under our common seal, with the consents (testified as hereinafter mentioned) of the said John Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich, and of the said John George Dodson, acting on behalf of Her said Majesty as such alternate patron as aforesaid, and of the said Samuel Hoare as such other alternate patron as aforesaid, and of the said Forster George Simpson as such Rector as aforesaid, hereby declare that the said new church of Saint Michael, situate within the said parish of Sidestrand, and duly consecrated as aforesaid, shall be, and the same is hereby, substituted for the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Michael as aforesaid) of the same parish, and that such new church shall henceforth be the parish church of the said parish of Sidestrand, in lieu of the said old parish church of Saint Michael as fully in all respects as if the said new church of Saint Michael, so hereby substituted, had been originally the parish church of the same parish.

And we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities aforesaid, and with such consents as aforesaid (testified as herein-after mentioned), do hereby transfer all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said old parish church (dedicated to Saint Michael as aforesaid) of the said parish of Sidestrand, or of or belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof to the said new church of Saint Michael (now being, by virtue of these presents, the parish church of the said parish of Sidestrand), and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his successors for ever.

In witness whereof to these presents we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have set our common seal, and the said John Thomas, Bishop of the said diocese of Norwich, has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal, and the said John George Dodson has set his

hand and affixed his seal as Chancellor of Her Majesty's said Duchy of Lancaster, and the said Samuel Hoare and Forster George Simpson have respectively set their hands and affixed their seals this thirty-first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.
