(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 11th day of October, 1884.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The Declaration described in the Schedule to this Order, made by the Local Authority acting in and for the county of Warwick, declaring the existence of foot-and-mouth disease at the Place therein mentioned, is hereby cancelled, and the Infected Place thereby declared shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at St. Petersburg, transmitting the following copy of Quarantine Regulations issued by the Russian Government, with respect to arrivals in Russian Black Sea Ports, viz. :—

September 22 (October 4), 1884.

INSTRUCTION for the Sanitary Control over and Systematic Disinfection of Vessels arriving from countries affected by Cholera epidemic.

Confirmed by the Ministry of the Interior on the 12-24 September, 1884.

I.

1. All vessels arriving from a country affected by cholera epidemic shall be subjected to fourteen days observation, as established by the Ministry of the Interior, in a quarantine port.

2. The term of observation shall commence from the time when health guards are stationed on board the vessel.

3. The observation consists in the vessel, the crew, passengers, effects, and cargo being placed under the supervision of the quarantine authorities, and being cut off from communication with other vessels, persons, and the shore, until it be considered entirely safe to allow the vessel pratique.

4. If after a sanitary examination of the crew and passengers, and an inspection of the vessel and cargo by the quarantine authorities, the master of a vessel provided with a clean bill of health expresses his readiness to effect a systematic purification of such vessel on his own account, under the direction and supervision of the quarantine authorities, the observation will only last seven days, including the time employed in putting the vessel into a proper sanitary condition.

5. Must be systematically disinfected: rags of all kinds; clothes and linen, including bed linen,

particularly such as have been in use and are unwashed; old clothes; offal of all kind; refuse, especially animal and vegetable; hides; hair; bristles, feathers, wool, felt, &c.; the parts of the vessel occupied by the crew and passengers and by the articles above mentioned; the holds of the vessel and also all persons without exception on board the vessel.

6. The process of disinfection shall consist of the destruction by fire or sinking in the sea of all refuse and rubbish found on board vessels and of such articles as are soiled and capable of containing germs of cholera, and which cannot be disinfected or possess small value.

7. Body and bed linen, as also bedding and similar articles, are to be washed in boiling water, or in a solution of lye, and afterwards well aired and dried on deck.

8. The cabins of the vessel inhabited by the crew and passengers, and all articles contained therein, as also the parts of the vessel occupied by that portion of the cargo which has to be subjected to disinfection shall be carefully scoured with brushes, scraped and washed with boiling water, and afterwards dried and aired.

9. The hold of the vessel shall be disinfected in the following manner: a hose is attached to the steam pump and lowered into the hold; a stream of sea water is then directed against the parts which are to be washed, the same having been previously scraped and scoured with a brush; this cleansing process is to continue until the water pumped out shall be of the same purity as that pumped in; all parts of the vessel are afterwards to be subjected to a thorough airing in case of necessity by means of an air pump. Sailing vessels not possessing their own steam pumps may employ those of tug boats and similar vessels.

10. All persons on board the vessel shall wash themselves with green soap, take a bath, and put on disinfected clothes.

II.

11. *Vessels with unclean bills of health, as regards cholera*, and others of the same category, in addition to systematic purification, shall undergo quarantine disinfection.

12. For quarantine disinfection must be employed: (1) A water solution of carbolic acid (1:18); (2) Water solution of corrosive sublimate of mercury (1:1,000); and (3) Steam, having a temperature of not less than 100° Celsius.

13. On vessels with an unclean (cholera) bill of health, all articles specified in § 7 are to be disinfected with carbolic acid or steamed. For this purpose they are to be immersed for 48 hours in a water solution of carbolic acid (1:18), or subjected to the action of steam of a temperature of not less than 100° Celsius; the places which contained such articles are to be steamed for various duration of time according to the nature and condition of the articles subjected to the process; for articles easily permeable not less than one hour, for those permeable with difficulty not less than two hours; during the steaming, the time elapsing before the thermometer, fixed at the aperture out of which the steam escapes from the place undergoing disinfection, indicates 100° Celsius is not to be taken into account. On the conclusion of the disinfection, the articles which have been subjected to the process, are to be washed, dried and aired as stated in § 7.

14. The parts indicated in § 8 of vessels with an unclean bill of health are to be disinfected with a solution of carbolic acid (1:18), for which purpose the ceiling, walls, and floors, as well as

all the contents, are to be washed with rags soaked in the above solution, or steamed as set forth in § 13.

15. The ship's hold with its contents are to be disinfected with corrosive sublimate of mercury, according to the greater or smaller quantity of bilge water in the hold, and reckoning one lb. of corrosive sublimate to 1,000 lbs. of bilge water, 1½ lbs. to 2½ lbs. of the chemical is mixed with from 25 to 50 lbs. of water in a wooden vessel; about two hours continued stirring will be necessary to entirely dissolve the corrosive sublimate of mercury. This solution is then poured into the water in the hold, and during the course of an hour at least the solution is to be carefully mixed with the bilge water. Each compartment of the hold, not connected with the others, is to be disinfected separately; the holds having a connection may be disinfected together, on all the hatches being opened and complete communication established.

In order to ascertain whether the disinfection with corrosive sublimate of mercury has attained its object, the following test is to be made; a sample of the disinfecting liquid is taken from various parts of the hold and a small plate of copper, polished to the extent of half its length with emery paper or sulphuric acid, is then immersed in it. If at the expiration of two minutes a distinct grey precipitate, easily removed with the finger, does not form on the copper, the disinfection must be considered as insufficient, and a further addition of the chemical solution must be poured into the hold and carefully stirred with the bilge water until the latter acts on the piece of copper in the manner above described. After the solution has been mixed with the bilge water as above described, the latter should not be pumped out directly, but allowed to remain in the hold for a further period of twenty-four hours. Only on the expiration of that time should the water be pumped out and replaced with an equal quantity of fresh sea-water. So as to leave as little a quantity of the disinfecting liquid in the hold, it will be necessary to repeat the pumping in and out of the water for three times at least during the course of three days.

(1.) *Dudgeon Shoal—Knoll North-East of Light-Vessel.*

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that a four-fathoms knoll has grown up on the inner edge of the Dudgeon Shoal, at about eight cables N.E. of Dudgeon Light Vessel, where the least depth formerly known was six fathoms.

IRISH CHANNEL.—ISLE OF MAN.

(2.) *Port St. Mary—Green Light on Breakwater.*

The Isle of Man Harbour Commissioners have given notice, that on 1st September, 1884, and until further notice, a light would be exhibited from the outer end of the finished portion of the breakwater in course of construction at Port St. Mary Point:—

The light is a fixed green light, elevated 25 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about three miles; it bears S.E. by S. from the pier head, distant about 400 yards.

The breakwater extends about 260 yards from the shore in an E.N.E. direction; vessels should pass eastward of the green buoy moored 70 yards north-eastward of the light, in order to avoid the portion of the work beyond the light, which is covered at high water.

Vessels approaching the harbour, should keep the white and red lights in line as heretofore.

(3.) *Leading Lights at Port Erin.*

Also, that on 1st October, 1884, and until further notice, two leading lights will be exhibited on the eastern bore of Port Erin, which, kept in line, will lead into the port, about midway between the breakwater and the northern shore.

The lights will be fixed red lights, placed 130 feet apart, elevated 33 and 52 feet respectively above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about five miles. The outer and low light bears E.S.E. from the extremity of the breakwater, distant 900 yards.

NOTE.—The breakwater, with the exception of a short length at the root, is covered at high water spring tides; a black buoy, which vessels should pass northward of, marks the outer end.

The arm of the landing pier at Port Erin has been destroyed.

Also, the following information concerning Ramsey Bay and Peel Harbour:—

(4.) *Ramsey Bay.*—The landing pier, in course of construction, extends in an E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. direction from the shore a distance of about 720 yards; its inner end is about 30 yards southward of the proposed position shown on the published plan; this pier will not have a T head. The wooden landing stage no longer exists.

(5.) *Peel Harbour.*—An approach road has been made to the breakwater, and a casing is in course of construction on the harbour side of breakwater.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation (1) 18° , (2)–(4) $21\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$, Easterly in 1884.]
