WHEREAS by a General Order dated the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, We, the Local Government Board, in consequence of the prevalence of Cholera in parts of France, made certain regulations with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags from that country, and declared that such regulations should be in force until the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four:
