THE Board of Trade have received through
the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy
of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at New

Orleans, stating that the limit of quarantine detention was reduced from ten to five days on and after 1st ultimo, and all such detention is to cease on the 31st instant; but that this will not change or modify the restrictions heretofore made against vessels arriving from ports infected with cholera.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at the Hague, reporting that in consequence of the recurrence of several cases of cholera at Yport, on the coast of Normandy, the port of Cherbourg, and all ports on the coast of France to the north of that place, as far as and inclusive of Dieppe, are declared to be infected.
