(No. 205.)—BALTIC ENTRANCES.—THE KATTEGAT—SWEDISH COAST.

(1.) *Winga Island—Temporary Alteration in Fog Signal.*

THE Swedish Government has given notice, dated 24th September, 1884, that the siren at Winga Island, Winga Sound, having been destroyed by fire, the following alteration will be made in the fog signal until further notice:—

During thick or foggy weather, two guns will be fired every fifteen minutes.

(2.) *Warberg—Alterations in West Mole Light.*

The Swedish Government has given notice, that on 1st October, 1884, a new harbour light

would be exhibited (in lieu of the old light) from a lighthouse, 24 feet high, on the extremity of the prolongation of the west mole at Warberg.

The light is a flashing light showing a white flash of two seconds' duration followed by an eclipse of two seconds, between the bearings of N. 31° E. (southward of this bearing it is obscured) and N. 56° E., and a red flash of two seconds' duration followed by an eclipse of two seconds from N. 56° E., through south, and towards the harbour; it is elevated 23 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather, the white light from a distance of 10 miles, the red light from a distance of 5 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the sixth order.

NOTE.—Entering Warberg Harbour, the white flashing light leads clear of Ryggen and Masten Shoals on the port hand, and of Skalklippen Rock on the starboard hand, but when opposite the fort, the course must be altered to the northward, and the flashing red light brought in sight.

BELTS, SOUND, &c.

(3.) *Danish System of Buoyage.*

The Danish Government has given notice, that the following system of buoyage has been established in the channels on the coasts of Denmark:—

1. All sea marks, which should be left on the starboard hand by vessels approaching from the northward and eastward, are red with red perch.

2. All sea marks, which should be left on the port hand by vessels approaching from the northward and eastward, are white with white perch.

3. All sea marks, which may be passed on either side, are coloured red and white in bands, the perches also having red and white bands.

NOTE.—This system is not followed in the buoyage of Flint Channel—the sea marks on the Swedish coast being red; black sea marks have been placed on the Danish side of the channel.

The shape of the sea marks, and of the top-marks—balls, brooms, &c.—has no special signification. Large sea marks—beacon and bell buoys, &c.—are only used where desirable for better distinction.

SWEDISH COAST—HOLMÖ.

(1.) *Fixed Light on Berg Point.*

THE Swedish Government has given notice, that on 18th September, 1884, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on Berg Point, west coast of Holmö (Holmön) and eastern side of West Quarken:—

The light is a fixed white light, visible between the bearings of N. 31° E. (leading westward of the shoals off the coasts of Holmö Group), through east, and S. 34° W. (leading westward of Lillhallan); the light is most powerful between N.

43° E. and S. 23° W.; it is elevated 20 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 10 miles.

The lighthouse is white in colour.

Position, lat. 63° 46 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' N., long. 20° 52' E.

RUSSIAN COAST—Rafsö FIARD.

(2.) *Light on Kallö Islet.*

The Russian Government has given notice, dated 16th September, 1884, that a light is now exhibited from a small wooden building erected on Kallö Islet, at the entrance to Rafsö Fiard:—

The light is visible seaward through an arc of 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ °, showing two successive white flashes, each of one second duration, followed by an eclipse of four seconds, between the bearings of N.N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. and N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.; a fixed white light from N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N. to E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., indicating the fairway of approach to the fiard; and a flashing red light of one second duration, followed by an eclipse of four seconds from E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. to E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., over Trekant Ground.

The light is elevated 24 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 9 miles. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fifth order.

Position on chart, lat. 61° 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., longitude 21° 28 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' E.

Also, that a fixed white light is shown from a pole in Rafsö Roadstead, elevated 15 feet above the sea, and visible in clear weather from a distance of about 7 miles.

RAUMO APPROACH.

(3.) *Alternating Light on Valkiakari Islet.*

Also, dated 6th September, 1884, that a light is now exhibited, and will continue to be exhibited until navigation is closed, from a lighthouse erected (in the position previously occupied by the beacon) on Valkiakari Islet, approach to Raumo.

The light is an alternating red and white light, showing thirty flashes every minute, visible between the bearings of S. 67° E., through north, and N. 60° W.; it is elevated 34 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of about 6 miles.

The lighthouse, 21 feet high and painted white, is erected on a wooden scaffolding painted red; a store-house, also painted red, stands a short distance eastward of the lighthouse.

Position, lat. 61° 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., long. 21° 22 $\frac{3}{4}$ ' E.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation (1) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ °, (2) 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ °, (3) 7°, Westerly, in 1884.]

(No. 207.)—BALTIC.—KALMAR SOUND.

(1.) *Fog Horn at Grimskär Lighthouse.*

THE Swedish Government has given notice, dated 1st October, 1884, that a fog horn has been established at Grimskär Lighthouse, Kalmar Sound.

During thick or foggy weather the horn will give every four minutes a blast of one minute duration, followed by an interval of three minutes.

The sound produced by this horn is not loud, but except during very severe weather, should be heard over the neighbouring channel.

STOCKHOLM APPROACH—SANDÖ CHANNEL.

(2.) *Stålbådan Shoal, Automatic Signal Buoy.*

Also, that on 15th October, 1884, the black buoy previously marking Stålbådan Shoal, southern side of Sandö Channel Entrance, would be replaced by an automatic signal buoy.

This buoy, fitted with a whistle, is coloured black.

GULF OF FINLAND.—BIÖRKÖ SUND.

(3.) *Light-Vessel with Fog Bell near Verko Matala Ground.*

The Russian Government has given notice, that on 4th October, 1884, a light-vessel was placed about a quarter of a mile south-eastward of Verko Matala Ground, western shore of Biörkö Sund.

The light is a fixed red light, elevated 30 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of nine miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses. The light-vessel, of iron, is painted red, with the name Werkkomatata in large white letters on her sides.

Position, lat. 60° 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' N., long. 28° 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' E.

Also, that during thick or foggy weather, a bell will be sounded on board Verko Matala Light-Vessel.

NOTE.—Pilots will be stationed on board this light-vessel.

(1.) *Læso Channel Light-Vessel—Alteration in Fog Signal.*

THE Danish Government has given notice, that on 15th October, 1884, the following alteration would be made in the fog signal on board Læso Channel Light-Vessel.

The signal is a siren, worked by a caloric engine, which, during thick and foggy weather, will give one powerful blast every two minutes.

GULF OF FINLAND.

(2.) *Fixed Light on Dalskär.*

The Russian Government has given notice, that on 10th September, 1884, a light was exhibited on Dalskär, eastward of Pitkepas Islands.

The light is a fixed white light, visible between the bearings of N. 26° E. and N. 54° W.; a fainter light is shown over the harbour to the north-west, it is elevated 22 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles.

Position, latitude 60° 28' 50" N., longitude 27° 56' 55" E.

NOTE.—Vessels approaching the anchorage north-west of Dalskär will, with this light in sight, clear the shoals on the eastern side of the entrance.

(No. 209).—BAL TIC.—SWEDISH COAST.—
WESTERVIK APPROACHES.

THE Swedish Government has given notice, that on 1st October, 1884, the undermentioned lights would be exhibited in the approaches to Westerwik:—

(1.) *Fixed Light on Bussen Islet.*

The light (in place of the beacon) on Bussen Islet, shows fixed red to the northward, westward, and southward; a sector of white light is also shown to the southward, through a small arc, between Great and Little Krakan Beacons; this light, elevated 31 feet above the sea, is not visible seaward.

The lighthouse, 26 feet high, is white; a red store-house stands near it.

Position, lat. $57^{\circ} 39\frac{1}{4}'$ N., long. $16^{\circ} 46'$ E.

This light, which is not constantly attended to, will be exhibited annually from 15th July to 15th December.

(2.) *Fixed Light on Stängskär.*

The light on Stängskär is a fixed white light, elevated 31 feet above the sea.

The lighthouse, 25 feet high, is white; a gray store-house stands near it.

Position, lat. $57^{\circ} 40\frac{1}{4}'$ N., long. $16^{\circ} 47\frac{3}{4}'$ E.

(3.) *Flashing Light on Idö Islet.*

The light on Idö Islet shows a flashing red light eastward of the broom beacon (Kaltrefvet) near Stickskär, and a flashing white light westward of that beacon; it is elevated 11 feet above the sea.

The lighthouse, 8 feet high, is a small white house on a base of masonry.

Position, lat. $57^{\circ} 42\frac{3}{4}'$ N., long. $16^{\circ} 46\frac{1}{4}'$ E.

(4.) *Alternating Light on Stickskär.*

The light on Stickskär is an alternating red and white light, elevated 29 feet above the sea.

The lighthouse, 16 feet high, is painted white; a red store-house stands near it.

Position, lat. $57^{\circ} 43'$ N., long. $16^{\circ} 45\frac{1}{2}'$ E.

NOTE.—The beacon on Stickskär is removed.

The lights on Stängskär, Idö Islet, and Stickskär, are not constantly attended to; they will be exhibited annually from 1st April to 15th December.

(5.) *Fixed and Flashing Light on Sparö Islet.*

The light on the southern part of Sparö Islet is a fixed white light, varied every minute by two red flashes in quick succession, visible between the bearings of north, through west, and south, it is elevated 111 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse, 22 feet high, consists of a white tower, above a dwelling, painted red.

Position, lat. $57^{\circ} 42\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $16^{\circ} 44\frac{1}{4}'$ E.

This light will be exhibited throughout the year, except when navigation, within its range of visibility, is closed by ice.

GULF OF BOTHNIA.—SWEDISH COAST.

BYE-LAWS and Regulations made by the Plymouth, Devonport, and District Tramways Company, under the powers conferred on the Company by "The Tramways Act, 1870."

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger or other person shall smoke inside any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. No person in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or otherwise damage the cushions, curtains, or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage, or wilfully mark, break, or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage or the furnishings or fittings thereof. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of

the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket or check (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or check or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket or check intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers), shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant or officer of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, and any person so acting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person other than a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so, or objected to by any passenger.

16. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter, or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

17. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.
