(Application for Provisional Order for Authority to Maintain and Continue Waterworks and Supply Water; to Define Limits for Supply of Water; Rates, Rents, and Charges; Opening of Streets and Roads for Laying Pipes; Money Powers; Agreements with Local Authorities and others; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts).
