(Application for Provisional Order for Authority to Maintain and Continue Waterworks and Supply Water; to Define Limits for Supply of Water; Rates, Rents, and Charges; Opening of Streets and Roads for Laying Pipes; Money Powers; Agreements with Local Authorities and others; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts).

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade, on or before the 23rd day of December next, for a Provisional Order, pursuant to the Gas and Waterworks Facilities Act, 1870, to authorize and empower the Great Berkhampstead Waterworks Company Limited (hereinafter called the Undertakers), to maintain, continue, alter, improve, and renew the existing waterworks at Great Berkhampstead, in the parish of Berkhampstead St. Peter, otherwise Great Berkhampstead and Berkhampstead St. Mary, otherwise Northchurch, in the county of Hertford, and to supply water in and to the said parishes and places of Berkhampstead St. Peter and Northchurch, and to so much and such parts of the parishes of Bovingdon, Eddlesborough, Great Gaddesden, Little Gaddesden, and Hemel Hempsted, in the county of Herrford; and of Chesham, Ivinghoe, and Pitstone, in the county of Buckingham, as are respectively situated within a radius of three miles from Great Berkhampstead parish

The existing waterworks so intended to be maintained, continued, enlarged, and improved consist of :—

(a.) A well shaft or boring, with pumping station, pumping engines, and engine and boller house, public bath house, and other works, buildings, and conveniences in connection therewith, situate on the site of a messuage or tenement and garden abouting upon the east side of the White Hart Inn and the north side of High-street, in the town of Berkhampstead, in the parish of Berkhampstead St. Peter, otherwise Great Berkhampstead, in the county of Hertford, containing a frontage to the north side of High-street

aforesaid of twenty-five feet, or thereabouts, and a depth of one hundred yards or thereabouts.

- (b.) A reservoir (No. 1), in the said parish of Berkhampstead St. Peter, situate on a piece of land (being portion of a field known as Kentish Croft) at King's Hill, abutting on the north-east side of the road leading from Cross Oak to King's Hill, and containing twenty-one and a quarter poles or thereabouts.
