Great Berkhamstead Water.

(Application for Provisional Order for Authority to Maintain and Continue Waterworks and Supply Water; to Define Limits for Supply of Water; Rates, Rents, and Charges; Opening of Streets and Roads for Laying Pipes; Money Powers; Agreements with Local Authorities and others; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade, on or before the 23rd day of December next, for a Provisional Order, pursuant to the Gas and Waterworks Facilities Act, 1870, to authorize and empower the Great Berkhamstead Waterworks Company Limited (hereinafter called the Undertakers), to maintain, continue, alter, improve, and renew the existing waterworks at Great Berkhamstead, in the parish of Berkhamstead St. Peter, otherwise Great Berkhamstead and Berkhamstead St. Mary, otherwise Northchurch, in the county of Hertford, and to supply water in and to the said parishes and places of Berkhamstead St. Peter and Northchurch, and to so much and such parts of the parishes of Bovington, Eddlesborough, Great Gaddesden, Little Gaddesden, and Hemel Hempstead, in the county of Hertford; and of Chesham, Ivinghoe, and Pitstone, in the county of Buckingham, as are respectively situated within a radius of three miles from Great Berkhamstead parish church.

The existing waterworks so intended to be maintained, continued, enlarged, and improved consist of:—

(a.) A well shaft or boring, with pumping station, pumping engines, and engine and boiler house, public bath house, and other works, buildings, and conveniences in connection therewith, situate on the site of a messuage or tenement and garden abutting upon the east side of the White Hart Inn and the north side of High-street, in the town of Berkhamstead, in the parish of Berkhamstead St. Peter, otherwise Great Berkhamstead, in the county of Hertford, containing a frontage to the north side of High-street

aforesaid of twenty-five feet, or thereabouts, and a depth of one hundred yards or thereabouts.

(b.) A reservoir (No. 1), in the said parish of Berkhamstead St. Peter, situate on a piece of land (being portion of a field known as Kentish Croft) at King's Hill, abutting on the north-east side of the road leading from Cross Oak to King's Hill, and containing twenty-one and a quarter poles or thereabouts.

(c.) A reservoir (No. 2), situated on a piece of ground, formerly portion of a garden of the late Joseph Robinson, the remainder of such garden being occupied by William Paxton, and situated in the parish of Berkhamstead St. Peter, near to and approached from Grubb's-lane there.

(d.) A conduit, line of pipes, or pumping main commencing in High-street, in the town of Berkhamstead, at the pumping station (a) and terminating in the reservoir (No. 1), hereinbefore described.

(e.) A conduit, line of pipes, or pumping main commencing in the High-street, in the town of Berkhamstead, at the said pumping station (a), and terminating in the reservoir (No. 2), hereinbefore described.

Together with all needful goits, conduits, or pipes, channels, dams, weirs, sluices, pens, locks, engines, engine-houses, machinery, stand pipes, tanks, valves, hydrants, apparatus, walls, fences, and other works and conveniences connected with the beforementioned works or any of them.

The intended order will confer on the Undertakers the following, or some of the following, powers, viz.:—

To maintain, continue, use, alter, repair, and renew their existing waterworks and works connected therewith, and to make provision for the protection of the works, property, and water supply of the Undertakers, and for prohibiting the fouling or contamination of the water in any reservoirs, wells, or other works belonging to them, and the waste or misuse of water.

To lay down and maintain conduits, pipes, and other works, in, under, over, across, and along, and
