Post Office (Acquisition of Sites).

(Power to the Postmaster-General to acquire by compulsion certain Lands, Houses, and Buildings in London, Birmingham, Bristol and Newcastle-upon-Tyne for the Service of the Post Office, Stopping up Highways; Agreements with Local Authorities; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the session of 1885 for an Act to empower Her Majesty's Postmaster-General to acquire and take for the service of the Post Office, by compulsory purchase or otherwise, the lands, houses, and buildings following (that is to say):—

St. Martin's-le-Grand, London (Extension of General Post Office).
