THE following Statutes, passed on the 24th day of May, 1884, by the Governing Body of Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 :—

At a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Gonville and Caius College specially summoned for the purpose on May 24th, 1884, it was resolved by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting to submit to the Queen in Council the following alterations of the Statutes of Gonville and Caius College.

PRESENT STATUTE.

The College shall (subject to the provisions in these Statutes contained for the increase or diminution of the number of Fellows or Scholars) consist of a Master twenty-two Fellows and twenty-four Scholars.

PROPOSED STATUTE.

The College shall (subject to the provisions in these Statutes contained for the increase or diminution of the number of Fellows or Scholars) consist of a Master twenty-two Fellows and such number of Scholars as the Governing Body may from time to time determine.

D.—OF THE FELLOWS.

PRESENT STATUTE.

(10.) The Governing Body may in any special case in which the interests of the College so require make it, at a time of election, a condition of the tenure of a Fellowship that the Fellow shall, if called upon so to do, within one year from the date of his election perform such duties in College for such time as the Governing Body shall require, on any breach of such condition the Fellowship shall become vacant.

PROPOSED STATUTE.

After (10) add (11).
If a person elected to a Fellowship shall at the time of such election be holding a Shuttleworth Scholarship and shall not resign the same within one calendar month from the time of his election, his election shall be void.

E.—OF THE SCHOLARS.

PRESENT STATUTE 14.

(1.) The Scholars of the College shall subject as hereinafter provided to the controlling direction of the Governing Body be elected by an electing body composed of the Governing Body together with such other Fellows as may have been appointed by the Governing Body to take part in ascertaining the merits of the Candidates for Scholarships.

The Election shall be conducted in the like manner and shall be governed by the like rules as the ordinary elections to Fellowships by the Governing Body.

(2.) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained all or such portion as the electing body shall think fit of the vacancies occurring from time to time in the Scholarships shall be filled up annually from among the Students of the College or (if the Governing Body think fit) from among students in the University who shall have distinguished themselves in the studies of the College or University or in any examination that may be directed by the Governing Body to

(1.) The Scholars of the College shall subject as hereinafter provided to the controlling direction of the Governing Body be elected by an electing body composed of the Governing Body together with such other Fellows as may have been appointed by the Governing Body to take part in ascertaining the merits of the Candidates for Scholarships.

The Election shall be conducted in the like manner and shall be governed by the like rules as the ordinary elections to Fellowships by the Governing Body.

(5.) Each Scholarship shall except as hereinafter provided be tenable until the Scholar holding it shall be of standing to take the degree of Bachelor of Arts; and it shall be lawful for the Governing Body in any case which shall appear to them of special merit to prolong the tenure of any such Scholarship for any period not extending beyond the time when the holder thereof shall be of standing to take the degree of Master of Arts.

(6.) It shall be lawful for the Governing Body from time to time to offer any number of vacant Scholarships for competition upon such terms (subject to the following provisions) as the Governing Body shall think proper amongst persons whose age shall not exceed nineteen years on the day appointed for the commencement of the Examination who shall not for the time being have come into residence at the University as members of any College or as unattached members of the University. Each Scholarship so offered (hereinafter called an "Entrance Scholarship") shall be tenable for a time not exceeding two years by the person obtaining it. The maximum value of such "Entrance Scholarships" shall not exceed eighty pounds a year including rent of rooms and all allowances.

(7.) Every person elected to a Scholarship shall if not already a Student of the College forthwith procure admission as such and in default thereof he shall forfeit the Scholarship.

(8.) The Governing Body may at any time if they shall see sufficient reason deprive any Scholar either temporarily or permanently of all or any part of his Scholarship or of any of the emoluments or advantages thereof.

(9.) Any Scholar who shall be elected to a Fellowship shall thereupon vacate his Scholarship as at the time from which he shall be entitled to the emoluments of his Fellowship.

(3.) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained the persons eligible to Scholarships shall be Students of the College or (if the Governing Body think fit) Students in the University who shall have distinguished themselves in the studies of the College or of the University.

[Omit the present sub-section (3) of this Statute.]

(4.) It shall be lawful for the Governing Body from time to time to offer Scholarships for competition upon such terms (subject to the following provisions) as the Governing Body shall think proper amongst persons whose age shall not exceed nineteen years on the day appointed for the commencement of the Examination who shall not for the time being have come into residence at the University. Each Scholarship so offered (hereinafter called an Entrance Scholarship) shall not exceed eighty pounds a year including rent of rooms and all allowances.

(5.) Every person elected to a Scholarship shall if not already a Student of the College forthwith procure admission as such and in default thereof he shall forfeit the Scholarship.

(6.) The Governing Body may at any time on the ground of immoral or unbecoming conduct or for want of due diligence or of satisfactory progress in study or for any other reason that may seem to them sufficient withdraw from a Scholar temporarily or permanently the whole or any part of the emoluments or advantages of his Scholarship.

If in any year any part of the Scholarship Fund shall remain unapplied after satisfying all the purposes of merit to which the Governing Body shall think proper to apply any part of that Fund the unapplied part shall be carried to the credit of the Pension and Endowment Fund.

If at any time it shall appear to the Governing Body that the income of the College is permanently more than sufficient to make in full the payments hereinbefore directed to be made out of the income of the College Account No. I they may (subject as hereinafter provided) increase the number of Fellows (either permanently or temporarily) or retain such part as they may think fit of the excess and apply the same either in increasing the amount to be paid to the Scholarship Fund or for such other College purposes as may be considered most advantageous to the College as a place of education religion learning and research. Provided that no increase of Fellowships shall be effected which will have the effect of rendering the increase of the College insufficient to make the said payments in full and if moreover after any such increase shall have been made it shall appear that the increase cannot be maintained consistently with the said payments being made in full then such a number of the new Fellowships shall from

THE following Statutes, passed on the 15th day of November, 1884, by the Governing Body of Jesus College, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

EXISTING STATUTES.

§ 24. Appointments to Official Fellowships may be made by the Principal and Fellows at any Stated General Meeting, with or without public notice or Examination, and with or without a period of probation, and any person may be appointed (although ineligible under the provisions of Clause 3) whom the Principal and Fellows deem eminently qualified for the office of Tutor, Lecturer, or Bursar.

§ 10. A fund shall be established to be called "The Exhibition Fund," for the purpose of maintaining Exhibitions of variable amount and tenure, to be held by members of the College receiving instruction under the direction of the College. Into this fund shall be paid:—

(a.) The income of the following Exhibitions of the Foundation of Richard Bloom, Esq.; the Rev. Rice Powel; Sir Leoline Jenkins; W. Le Hunt, Esq.; Bishop Parry; John Curre, Esq.; Mrs. Mary Robinson; William Robson, Esq.

(b.) Such a yearly sum, not exceeding 150*l.*, from the general revenues of the College, as the Principal and Fellows may, at any Stated General Meeting, from time to time determine.

The annual income of this fund shall be applied in assisting such members of the College receiving instruction as aforesaid as the Principal and Fellows may deem to be in need of assistance at the University, or, as to so much thereof as may not be required for that purpose, in such manner as they may deem best for promoting study and improvement among the members of the College *in statu pupillari*.

A member of the College receiving instruction as aforesaid who is already a Scholar or Exhibitioner of the College, shall not be ineligible for such assistance if, in the judgment of the Principal and Fellows, he shall be in need of it; and it shall be in the power of the Principal and Fellows, in any such case, to make to any such Member of the College, whether a Scholar or Exhibitioner or not, an allowance for tuition or for room rent. But no such assistance out of the Fund formed under this clause shall be given to any Scholar or Exhibitioner who shall not already be residing in the College, nor shall any prospect of such assistance be announced when notice is given of any election to a vacant Scholarship or Exhibition.

All the said Exhibitions shall be tenable under such regulations as shall be made by the Principal and Fellows from time to time.

Statute IV.

Add "The Principal and Fellows may admit an Official Fellow to a place on the Governing Body, and to be present and vote at any College Meeting, although he has not resided in the University during at least three terms after his election (Easter and Trinity Term being counted as one)."

Statute V.

Omit the word "already."

ALTERATIONS PROPOSED.

EXISTING STATUTES.

§ 12. Every Scholarship shall be tenable for two years from the day of election, if the person elected be already a member of the University, but if he be not already a member of the University, then it shall be tenable for two years from a day not later than three months after the day of election, to be fixed by the Principal and Fellows, and at the expiration of such two years it shall determine, unless the Principal and Fellows shall by a resolution have declared themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of the Scholar, in which case the tenure of his Scholarship shall be renewed for a further term of two years, to be reckoned from the expiration of two years from the day of his election. At the end of this latter period the Principal and Fellows may extend the tenure of any such Scholarship for one year longer, if for special reasons they deem it advisable so to do, or for any period not exceeding two years, provided the Scholar be engaged in education as a Master of a School in Wales or Monmouthshire where the College is represented on the Governing Body.

Before declaring themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of any Scholar, the Principal and Fellows shall receive and consider a report concerning him laid before them by the Tutors and Lecturers of the College at or immediately before the time of their making such declaration.

Provided always, that nothing in this clause shall prevent the exercise at any time, for any sufficient cause, of the powers given by Clause 14 to the Principal and Fellows of depriving a Scholar of his Scholarship or of any part of the emoluments thereof.

Schedule: King Charles the First's Trust.

§ 6. No person shall be eligible to any of King Charles the First's Scholarships or Exhibitions, who has on the day of election exceeded the nineteenth year of his age.

Statute concerning the Meyricke Endowment.

§ 3. The Principal and Fellows may assign out of the income of the Endowment a sum not exceeding 50*l.* per annum for the maintenance and improvement of the Meyricke Library, and shall provide four Scholarships of the same annual value as the Foundation Scholarships, and shall assign the whole of the remaining clear net annual income to the maintenance of such number of Exhibitions within the College of the annual value of 50*l.* as the Principal and Fellows shall from time to time determine, and the amount of endowment will permit. Such Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be called the Meyricke Scholarships and the Meyricke Exhibitions respectively.

Statute concerning the Meyrick Endowment.

§ 5. Whenever a Meyricke Scholarship shall become vacant, if no candidate shall offer himself duly qualified according to Clause 4, the Scholarship shall be thrown open for that turn; but if a candidate or candidates so qualified shall present himself or themselves, and the electors shall not judge any one to be of sufficient merit for election as a scholar, the election shall be postponed, for not less than three months nor more than six months, to some other day to be fixed by the Principal and Fellows for that purpose; and if at the postponed election there shall still be no

such candidate as aforesaid whom the electors shall judge to be of sufficient merit for election as a Scholar, such Scholarship may be thrown open for that turn, or if there be any candidate of sufficient merit for election as an Exhibitioner the Principal and Fellows may elect him to a supernumerary Exhibition, in lieu of a Scholarship, for that turn; and if there be no candidate of sufficient merit for election as an Exhibitioner, in any election of Exhibitioners, the Principal and Fellows shall suspend such Exhibition, and may employ the emoluments thereof in augmenting the "Exhibition Fund," or for such other purpose or purposes as they may from time to time consider most conducive to the interests of the College in connexion with the promotion of education in Wales, including, if they think fit, any application of such emoluments for the benefit of any school or schools in Wales or Monmouthshire which is under the government of the College, or on the Governing Body of which the College is represented.

STATUTE passed nemine contradicente on the 20th June, 1884, at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Wadham College specially summoned for this purpose in the place of Statute IV section 9 of the Statutes made by the Commissioners for the College.

"EVERY Scholarship shall be tenable for two years from the day of election; if the person elected be already a member of the University then it shall be tenable for two years from a day not later than seven months after the day of election to be fixed by the Warden and Fellows; at the expiration of such two years it shall determine, unless the Electoral Board shall by resolution in writing to be reported to the Warden and Fellows, declare themselves satisfied with the industry and good conduct of the Scholar; in which case the tenure of his Scholarship shall be renewed by the Warden and Fellows for a further term not exceeding two years. If it shall have been renewed for a less term than two years, and if at the end of such term the Electoral Board shall pass a resolution as aforesaid, the Warden and Fellows may again renew the tenure of the Scholarship, and in like manner from time to time as they may think fit, but so that the whole time shall not exceed a second period of two years; at the end of this latter period the Warden and Fellows may extend the tenure of any such Scholarship, if for special reasons they deem it advisable so to do, but so that the whole term for which the Scholarship is held shall not exceed five years. Provided always that nothing in this clause shall prevent the exercise at any time for any sufficient cause of the power of deprivation conferred by the clause hereinafter numbered 12 or of any other power of inflicting any fines or penalties less than deprivation under

"any bylaw of the College for the time being in force."

THE following Statutes, passed on the 25th day of October, 1884, by the Governing Body of Corpus Christi, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

STATUTES made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, Oxford, specially summoned for the purpose, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, on the twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

THESE statutes if approved will be inserted in lieu of the existing statutes 19 (a); 20 (a), (c), (d) of the Corpus Christi Statutes.

19 (a.) The Tutors of the College shall be not more than three in number.

20 (a.) There shall be not more than three Assistant Tutors.

(c.) An Assistant Tutor shall be by virtue of his office an Official Fellow of the College, and shall receive out of the revenues of the College the sum of two hundred pounds per annum as the emolument of his Fellowship, in addition to his stipend as Assistant Tutor. Provided that any ordinary Fellow of the College becoming an Assistant Tutor shall not thereby vacate his ordinary Fellowship and no person appointed an Assistant Tutor who at the time of his appointment holds a Fellowship in another College shall so long as he holds such a Fellowship become an Official Fellow under this clause.

(d.) The stipend of an Assistant Tutor

shall be not less than one hundred pounds per annum nor more than two hundred pounds per annum, at the time of his first appointment. This stipend may be increased annually by a sum not exceeding fifty pounds per annum, but it shall never exceed three hundred pounds per annum. The stipend of an Assistant Tutor shall be paid one half out of the Tuition Fund and one half out of the revenues of the College. Provided that no appointment under sections 19 and 20 as amended shall operate to charge the revenues of the College with any greater aggregate sum in respect of the Fellowships and stipends of Tutors and Assistant Tutors than is authorised to be charged in respect of them under sections 19 and 20 of the Statutes as approved by the University of Oxford Commissioners on the sixteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one.

On the shores of the Gulf of Naples (which by this present Ordinance are restored to free intercourse with the remainder of the Italian continent) shall from this day be applied to vessels on their arrival all those preventive treatments to which vessels are subjected at clean places when coming from localities subject to the quarantine ordinances still in force in the kingdom.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876," it is enacted as follows :—

"The Local Government Board may, when they see fit, by their Order change the name of any Union, and direct how such change of name shall be published ; no such change of name shall affect any rights or obligations of, or securities given by or to the said Union, or render defective any legal proceedings instituted by or against the said Union ; and any legal proceedings may be continued or commenced by or against the said Union by their new name which might have been continued or commenced by or against the Union by their former name."

And whereas by an Order, dated the 21st day of August, 1835, the Poor Law Commissioners declared that the several Parishes and Places specified in the margin thereof should be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the Poor, and the said Union has been known by the name of the North Aylesford Union ; and it is expedient that the name of such Union should be changed as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows :

ARTICLE I.—On and after the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, the name of the said Union shall be changed to the Strood Union, and the Guardians of the Poor thereof shall be termed "The Guardians of the Poor of the Strood Union."

ARTICLE II. The said Guardians shall cause this Order to be published for two successive weeks within one month from the date hereof, in some newspaper circulating within the Union.

To make provision for regulating the passage of traffic (whether of the Company or not) along streets, roads, or places in which the proposed tramways will be laid or any part or parts thereof; and along, over and across such tramways, and for preventing obstructions to all or any such traffic, and to enable the Company and the respective street authorities, or either of them, or any or some or one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, or the Board of Trade, or some other public body or authority, to make bye-laws, rules, and regulations with reference to all or any of the matters aforesaid, and to attach penalties to the breach or non-observance of such bye-laws, rules, and regulations, or any of the provisions of the Bill.

To empower the Company to grant licences to use the proposed tramways, or any or any part of them, and on such terms and conditions as the Board of Trade, or some other public body or authority, may require or approve.

To provide for the maintenance and repair by the Company, or their lessees or other persons, bodies, or authorities, of the whole or some portion of any streets, roads, highways, or thoroughfares in which any tramway may for the time being be laid; and to exempt the Company and their lessees from payment of the whole or some portion of any highway or other rate or assessment in respect of the whole or any portion of any street, road, or place upon or along which any of the proposed tramways or works may be laid; and to provide for the use or disposition by the Company of all or any of the materials or things excavated or removed by them in the construction or repair of any of the proposed

tramways; and to empower the Company and their lessees on the one hand, and any local or road authority, corporation, bodies, and persons on the other hand, to enter into contracts with respect to the matters aforesaid; and to confirm any such contract or contracts which may have been entered into or may be entered into before the passing of the intended Act.

BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wisbech, as the Local Authority, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or car.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour, and whenever any car enters from the Great Eastern Railway on to the Elm-road, in this borough, the speed thereof shall not exceed four miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than one hundred yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required, by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made: Provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or a terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

6. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road, so as not to leave sufficient space for the car

to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car.

7. Whenever any car shall be approaching the bridge, called Newcommon Bridge, and at or about the distance of fifty yards therefrom, in this borough, the driver of such car shall sound his special bell or whistle as a warning to persons in charge of animals or vehicles in near proximity to the said bridge; and whenever any car shall be about to enter from the Great Eastern Railway on to the Elm-road, in this borough, the driver thereof shall sound his special bell at or about the distance of fifty yards from Elm-road aforesaid.

8. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

9. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
