Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Buenos Ayres, enclosing the following translation of a Notice respecting quarantine issued by the Sanitary Board at Buenos Ayres, viz. :-

Buenos Ayres, November 10, 1884. In view of the outbreak of cholera in Paris, and of the increased danger that this event threatens on account of the manifold relations of that capital with the Ports of Western Europe, the National Health Board resolves:

1. To increase to four days the quarantine imposed upon arrivals from healthy ports on the

French Atlantic scaloard.

2. To impose two days observation on arrivals from healthy ports in Germany, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, Sweden and Norway.

3. To maintain all previous Ordinauces in force up to this date, in so far as they are in conformity with the present.

4. To close the port against arrivals from Nantes from the date of the appearance of cholera in that town.

5. This order to affect all ships sailing from the ports above specified after this date.

The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road, so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause

interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

8. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
