"Notice to British Shipmasters trading to Bilbao with Cargoes.

"Vessels arriving from abroad after mooring can change their berth on obtaining permission from the port authorities, and also the authorization of the Customs, to which department due notice of the wish to change berth must be given. Foreign vessels complying with the above regulations are permitted at the port of Bilbao to discharge cargoes in two or more places.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of a Proclamation by the Governor of Gibraltar, giving effect to the following regulations in respect to quarantine at that place, viz. :—
"1. That the Proclamation of the 28th No-

vember, 1884, be rescinded.
"2. That arrivals from Italy and France be admitted to free pratique, provided clean bills of health are brought.

"3. That arrivals from Nantes be subjected to fourteen days quarantine from date of sailing until

the 20th of this month.

"4. That arrivals from the French possessions in the Mediterranean be subjected to fourteen days quarantine, from date of sailing, provided clean bills of health are produced and good health is enjoyed on board.

" Official Gazette, 1-13th December, 1884.

"In view of official information received con-- cerning the cessation of the epidemic of cholera in France, Italy, and Spain, the Ministry of the Interior has now deemed it possible to repeal the · extraordinary measures taken during the current year on our land and sea frontiers, concerning arrivals from the above-mentioned countries, leaving in force only the 2nd paragraph of the Regulations of August 15 of this year, forbidding the importation of all kinds of rags which have been in use as personal and bed linen or wearing apparel, unless they shall have been submitted at the frontier to a thorough precautionary disinfection."

- 1. Approaching from seaward—all buoys on the starboard side of a channel are painted red, and if numbered, marked with even numbers, and should be left on the starboard hand.
- 2. Approaching from seaward—all buoys on the port side of a channel are painted black, with odd numbers, if any, and should be left on the port hand.
- 3. Buoys painted red and black in horizontal bands mark obstructions or middle grounds, and may be left on either hand.
- 4. Buoys painted white and black in vertical stripes mark mid-channel, and should be passed close to, to avoid danger.
- 5. All other distinguishing marks to buoys are in addition to the foregoing, and indicate particular spots, a detailed description of which is given when the mark is first established.
- 6. Perches with balls, cages, &c., will, when placed on buoys, be at turning points, the colour and number indicating on which hand they should be left.
- 7. The rule for colouring buoys is equally applicable to beacons, and other day marks, so far as it may be practicable to carry it out.

Proceeding down the river, keep Port Penn Range Lights in line and Ship John Shoal Light white until within three miles of it, then keep Cross Ledge Light white till three miles below Ship John Shoal, at which point both Ship John Shoal and Cross Ledge Lights should show white; then keep Ship John Shoal Light white until abreast Cross Ledge, then steer for Fourteen-feet Bank Light-vessel or Brandywine Shoal Light, keeping the latter white till abreast the Light-vessel or midway between Cross Ledge and Brandywine Shoal Lights; then keep Cross Ledge Light white until one mile below Brandywine Shoal Light, thence keep in the white lights of Brandywine Shoal and Cape Henlopen.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Bye-laws and Regulations, of which the following is copy, were, on the 3rd day of December, 1884, made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Gateshead, acting by the Council as the Local Authority, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870:-

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Gateshend, acting by the Council as the Local Authority, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or car.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than four miles

an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than one hundred yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required, by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made: Provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 24.

5. Except at a passing place or a terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction

of two or more streets or roads.

6. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road, so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car.

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause

interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

8. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.
