PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twentieth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for assigning the right of patronage of the district and future new parish of Saint Barnabas, Kentish Town, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

“Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the fourth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and published in the London Gazette on the sixth day of the same month, the said district of Saint Barnabas Kentish Town, was under the Act hereinbefore mentioned and under certain other Acts in the said Order of Your Majesty in Council mentioned constituted out of the several parishes of Saint Luke New Kentish Town, of Kentish Town and of the Holy Trinity Haverstock Hill.

“And whereas under another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the second day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four and published in the London Gazette on the twelfth day of the same month, the boundaries of the said district of Saint Barnabas, Kentish Town, so constituted as aforesaid, were altered by the annexation to the same district of a certain further portion of the new parish of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town in the county and diocese aforesaid.

“And whereas the same district has not yet become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore firstly-mentioned Act.

“And whereas no specific assignment of the whole or any part of the right of patronage of the said district of Saint Barnabas Kentish Town, or of the nomination of the minister thereof, has been made by any Order of Your Majesty in Council; and such right of patronage and nomi-

nation has hitherto continued to be exercised in accordance with, and to be subject to, the directions in that behalf which are contained in the hereinbefore firstly-mentioned Act as to cases wherein no such specific assignment of patronage has been made.

“And whereas by a certain deed, dated the twenty-fifth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to which deed the Reverend Albert Edward Whish, Clerk in Holy Orders, the minister of the said district of Saint Barnabas Kentish Town, is a party, and we the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England are also a party, the said Albert Edward Whish has conveyed to us certain land, in the same deed described, situate within the said district as and for the site of an intended new church to be called Saint Barnabas Church Kentish Town; which new church when built and approved by us and consecrated, will become and be the church of the said district, and the same district will thereupon become and be a new parish.

“And whereas the value of the said site, so conveyed to us as aforesaid, is two thousand three hundred and fifty pounds, as appears by a certain indenture now in our possession, dated the twenty-fourth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and made between the Metropolitan Board of Works of the one part and the said Albert Edward Whish of the other part.

“And whereas in the said deed of conveyance of the twenty-fifth day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four is contained a recital to the effect that the same conveyance was made on condition that we should as soon as might be after the completion thereof recommend to Your Majesty in Council that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district of Saint Barnabas, Kentish Town, and so soon as such district shall have become a new parish, then of such new parish, and the whole right of nomination and presentation of the minister of the said district, or (as the case may be) of the vicar or incumbent of the same new parish, should be assigned in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas under the circumstances aforesaid, the pecuniary consideration for the said proposed assignment of patronage would be the said sum of two thousand three hundred and fifty pounds, being the value of the said site as aforesaid, but in addition to the same, and as a further consideration for such assignment we have with

the necessary consent thereto of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend John Bishop of London, made out of the fund created by the twenty-second section of the Union of Benefices Act 1860, a grant of six thousand pounds, towards the cost of the church to be erected upon the said site as aforesaid.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the district of Saint Barnabas, Kentish Town (now exercised and subject as aforesaid) and so soon as such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of such new parish, and the whole right of nomination and presentation of the minister of the same district or (as the case may be) of the vicar or incumbent of the same new parish, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

WHEREAS one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications, viz.:—

LITTLE STUKELEY.—Forthwith wholly in the parish church of Little Stukeley, in the county of Huntingdon; and that in the

churchyard the following regulations be observed:—

i. No body shall be buried in any vault or walled grave unless the coffin be separately entombed in an air-tight manner, that is by properly cemented stonework or brickwork which shall never be disturbed.

ii. No unvalled grave shall be reopened within fourteen years after the burial of a person above twelve years of age, or within eight years after the burial of a child under twelve years of age, unless to bury another member of the same family in which case a layer of earth of not less than one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin: but if on re-opening any grave the soil be found to be offensive such soil shall not be disturbed, and in no case shall human remains be removed from the grave.

iii. No coffin shall be buried in any unvalled grave within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age when it shall not be less than three feet below the level.

iv. That no earthen grave shall be dug within eighteen inches of any other grave.

BLACKBURN.—Forthwith wholly in the Great Harwood Church in the parish of Blackburn in the county of Lancaster: and also in the churchyard after the thirty-first May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such reserved grave spaces (as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourteenth day of February next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said fourteenth day of February.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled

"An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, in so far as it affects burials in the Parish Church and Churchyard of Fairford, in the county of Gloucester, should be varied by substituting for the directions therein contained in respect of burials in the said Church and Churchyard the following directions, viz.:

That burials be discontinued forthwith and wholly in the Parish Church of Fairford, in the county of Gloucester; and also in the churchyard after the first day of May, one

thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

(d.) In such reserved spaces in the churchyard (as have never before been buried in and when opened are free from water) burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they may be allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourteenth day of February next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation one month before the said fourteenth day of February.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discon-

tinuance of burials in such churchyards be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the parish churchyard of Willian, in the county of Hertford, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

In the parish churchyard of Cobham, in the county of Surrey, to the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

In the churchyard of Lyndhurst, in the county of Hants, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

In the new portion of the churchyard of Kingswear, in the county of Devon, to the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

In Dan's Castle Burial-ground, Tow Law, in the parish of Wolsingham, in the county of Durham, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

In the parish churchyard of Great Abington, in the county of Cambridge, to the sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.
