The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding " of benefices in plurality, and to make better " provision for the residence of the clergy," after "reciting that "Whereas in some instances " tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or " districts may be separated from the parishes or " mother churches to which they belong, with "great advantage, and places altogether extra 66 parochial may in some instances with advantage " be annexed to parishes or districts to which " they are contiguous, or be constituted separate "parishes for coclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with " respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the "Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop " of any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place or district within the diocese of such " Archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, " as the case may be, may be advantageously " separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by " itself or be united to any other parish to which " it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any " other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, " or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to " form a separate parish or benefice, or that any " extra-parochial place may with advantage be " annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, " or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesi-" astical purposes; and the said Archhishop or "Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the " scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the " said Archbishop for his consideration) de-"scribing the mode in which it appears to "lim that the alteration may best be effected, " and how the changes consequent on such " alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-" diction, globe lands. tithes, rent-charges, and " other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, " and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, " may be made with justice to all parties in-" terested; and if the patron or patrons of the " benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or " their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-

" cation thereof as the said Archbishop may ap-"prove, and the said Archbishop shall, on full " consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with " any such scheme, or modification thereof, " and shall certify the same and such consent as " aforesaid, by his Report to Her Majesty in " Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in " Council to make an Order for carrying such " scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may " be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to " make bet:er provision for the assignment of " ecclesiastical districts to churches or chapels " augmented by the Governor of the Bounty of "Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That "when by any Order of Her Majesty in Council, " as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical " purposes is constituted, the same shall, on regis-" tration thereof, and with the consent in writing " of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice " or benefices to be thereby affected, become a " perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister " thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, " and his successors, shall be a body politic and " corporate, with perpetual succession, and may " receive and take to himself and his successors " all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, " and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him " or them, and such perpetual curate shall thence-" forth have within the limits of the district " parish formed under the Church Building Acts; " for the church of such perpetual curacy, sole "and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in "anywise be subject to the conroul or inter-"ference of the incumbent or incumbents of the " b-nefice or benefices to be affected by such " Order, if he or they shall have consented to "such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas William, Lord Archishop of York hath in pursuance of the aforesaid Act made a Report, dated the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, to Her Majesty in Council in the words and figures following that is to say :--

#### " To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"The undersigned William by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York Primate of England and Metropolitan in pursuance of an Act pasted in the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign intituled 'An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality and to make better provision for the residence of the Clergy doth hereby represent to Your Majesty as follows : -

" That there are in the county of York and diocese of York the parishes and benefices of Hatfield with Stainforth, Barnby - upon - Don, Fishlake, and Thorne, the boundaries of which said parishes are well-known and defined.

"That there is in the same county and diccese the township of Stainforth which consists of -several detached portions the boundaries of which are well-known and defined.

" That the main body of the said township of : Stainforth comprises portions of the said parishes of Hatfield with Stainforth and of Barnby-upon-Don.

" That there are in the said county and diocese and included within the boundaries of the said main body of the said township of Stainforth certain detached portions of the said parishes of Thorne and of Fishlake which said portions are more particularly described in the scheme and schedule hereafter written.

" That according to the last census the population of the suid parish of Hatfield with Stainforth was 2,5<sup>-0</sup> that of the said parish of Barnby-upon-Don 747 that of the said parish of Fishlake 596 and that of the said parish of Thorne 3,484.

" That the population of the said township of Stainforth according to the same census was 782.

"That there is a church situate within the said township of Stainforth convenient for the use of the inhabitants of the said township and of the inhabitants of the said portions of the said parishes of Thorne and Fishlake and Barnbyupon-Don.

" That the net annual value of the said benefice of Hatfield with Stainforth is one hundred and seventy-six pounds that of the said benefice of Barnby - upon - Don, one hundred and thirty pounds, that of the said benefice of Thorne one hundred and seventy-five pounds and that of the said benefice of Fishlake two hundred and forty pounds.

" That the patronage of the said benefice being a vicarage of Hatfield with Stainforth is vested in Henry Amelius Beauclerk Coventry of Melton Mowbray in the county of Leicester, Esquire and the Reverend George Philip Haydon is the incumbent thereof.

" That the patronage of the said benefice being a vicarage of Barnby-upon-Don is vested in the Reverend Thomas Killam-Killam of Meltham near Huddersfield in the county of York, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Reverend John Duffin is the incumbent thereof.

"That the patronage of the said benefice being a vicarage of Thorne is vested in the said Henry Amelius Beauclerk Coventry and the Reverend Joseph Johnson Littlewood is the incumbent thereof.

" That the patronage of the said benefice being a vicarage of Fishlake is vested in the Dean and Chapter of Durham and the Reverend George Ornsby is the incumbent thereof.

"That the respective patrons and incumbents of the said benefices of Hatfield with Stainforth, Barnby-upon-Don, Thorne and Fishlake are all consenting parties to the scheme hereinafter proposed.

"That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the session held in the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 106 and of the second and third years of Your Majesty's and shall do all things pertaining to the office of

reign chapter 49 the main body of the said township of Stainforth comprising as aforesaid portions of the said parishes of Barnby-upon-Don and Hatfield with Stainforth and the said portions of the parishes of Thorne and Fishlake as the same are more particularly described in the scheme and schedule hereto annexed together with a detached portion of the said township of Stainforth situate to the north of the said main body of the said township and which said detached portion is also more particularly described in the said scheme and schedule may advantageously be separated from the parishes to which they now respectively belong and be constituted a separate parish and benefice for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the aforesaid first-mentioned Act the said Archbishop has prepared a scheme in writing appended to this report describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration above-mentioned may be best effected and said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with such scheme he doth by this report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty with the consent in writing to the said scheme of the patrons and incumbents of the said respective benefices of Hatfield with Stainforth, Barnby-upon-Don, Thorne and Fish-lake to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it may be thought expedient so to do may make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect.

" Given under the hand of the said Archbishop this eighth day of December one thousand eight . " W. Ebor. hundred and eighty-four.

And whereas the scheme (together with the schedules thereunto annexed) and the consents referred to in the Archbishop's report are in the words and figures following :-

#### " The SCHEME referred to in the foregoing Report.

" That all those two portions of the parishes of Hatfield with Stainforth and Barnby-upon-Don in the first schedule hereto firstly described all that isolated and detached portion of the said parish of Hatfield with Stainforth in the said schedule secondly described all that isolated and detached portion of the parish of Fishlake in the said schedule thirdly described and also all that isolated and detached portion of the parish of Thorne in the said schedule fourthly described and also all that other detached and isolated portion of the parish of Thorne in the said schedule fifthly described and also all that small isolated portion of the parish of Thorne in the said schedule sixthly described shall be severed from the parishes and benefices to which these now belong and be united together and constituted a separate benefice and a parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the name or style of the parish or benefice of Stainforth of which the said church situated within the said township of Stainforth shall be the parish church.

".That the said proposed parish and benefice of Stainforth shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefices of Hatfield with Staiuforth Barnby-upon-Don Thorne and Fishlake and that the incumbent of the said proposed parish or benefice shall have exclusive charge of souls within the limits of the same.

"That two churchwardens shall be chosen annually in the accustomed manner and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed in and for such proposed parish or benefice and every person so appointed shall be duly admitted churchwarden as to ecclesiastical matters within the said proposed parish or benefice.

"That baptisms churchings marriages and burials shall be performed in the church of the said proposed parish and benefice and all fees and payments for the same and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized within the said proposed parish or benefice of Stainforth and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice as shall arise therein shall thenceforth belong and be paid to the incumbent of the said proposed parish or benefice of Stainforth.

"That the parishioners of the said proposed parish or benefice shall not be entitled to any accommodation in the several churches of Hatfield Thorne Barnby-upon-Don and Fishlake respectively.

"That no alterations shall be made as to the patronage or endowment of any of the said benefices of Thorne, Barnby-upon-Don and Fishlake.

"That the patronage or right of nomination of a minister to serve the proposed parish or benefice of Stainforth shall be vested in the said William Lord Archbishop of York and his successors Archbishops of York for ever.

"That the endowment particulars of which are entered in the second schedule hereto shall from and after the date of the scheme taking effect belong to and become part of the endowment for the minister of the said proposed parish or benefice of Stainforth.

#### " FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The parish or benefice of Stainforth comprising :----

" I. All those two contiguous portions of the parish of Hatfield with Stainforth and of the parish of Barnby-upon-Don both in the county of York and in the diocese of York which together constitute and are co-extensive with the limits of the main body of the township of Stainforth.

"2. All that isolated and detached portion of the River Don.

the said parish of Hatfield with Stainforth which is bounded upon the south-east the north-east and the north by the parish of Fishlake in the county and diocese aforesaid or in other words on the south-east by the Stainforth and Fishlake road on the north-east by Nab-lane and on the north by Nab Drain and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the vest by the parish of Kirk Bramwith in the county and diocese aforesaid or in other words by Nab Drain aforesaid.

"3. All that isolated and detached portion of the parish of Fishlake in the county and diocese aforesaid which is situate within and is bounded on all sides by the hereinbefore firstly described portion of the parish of Hatfield with Stainforth and of the township of Stainforth aforesaid all: which said portion of the parish of Fishlake is situate on the western side of East-lane at or near to Carr House and comprises the Fishlake and Sykchouse Gravel Pits.

"4. And also all that isolated and detached portion of the parish of Thorne in the county and diocese aforesaid which is situate at Ashfields uponthe southern side of Stainforth East Ings Drain and which is bounded upon the north the west and the south by the main body of the township of Stainforth aforesaid and upon the east by the township of Hatfield in the parish of Hatfield with Stainforth aforesaid.

"5. And also all that other detacked and isolated portion of the said parish of Thorne which is surrounded upon all sides by the main body of the township of Stainforth aforesaid and is situate on the western side of Johnston's-road being bounded on the south by Kirton-lane and on the north by the Stainforth East Ings aforesaid.

"6. And also all that small isolated and detached portion of the parish of Thorne aforesaid which is surrounded upon all sides by the main body of the township of Stainforth aforesaid and is situate near Dunston Hill Bridge over the Stainforth and Keadby Canal being bounded on the south by the said canal and on the north-west by the River Don.

Ordinance of Maritime Health, No. 48.

It being officially established that the sanitary condition of Hindo stan and other regions beyond the Sucz Canal continues to be in a normal-state, the Minister of the Interior decrees :

ART. 1. From this day forth the treatment of observation established by Ordnance No 41, of November 26 last, shall cease as regards vessels arriving with clean bills and without sickness from all non-Egyptian ports and roadsteads situated beyond the Surz Canal, and the vessels can receive pratique, if, after medical inspection, they prove free from sickness.

ART. 2. Until further orders the importation from those places of rags, tatiers, and old unwashes clothes remains forbidden.

## Sanitary Board.

In view of the outbreak of the cholera morbus epidemic in Paris, and the spread of infection to the port of Nantes, this Board, at an Extraordinary Meeting held this day, have resolved as follows :-

1st. To prolong to four days duration the sani-tary inspection of vessels arriving from the uninfected Atlantic ports of France.

2nd. To impose two days observation on all vessels proceeding from uninfected seaports of Germany, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, Norway, and Sweden.

3rd. This rule will apply to all vessels leavingthe aforesaid ports from this date.

4th. Conformably to the provisions of the Government Decree, dated on the 12th of September last, the ports of this Republic are absolutely closed to all vessels leaving Nantes after the 4th instant.

5th. This Ordinance is to be published for general information.

#### Rules.

A T the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden, by adjournnent, at Northallerton, in and for the North-Riding of the county of York, on Monday, the twenty-second day of December, in the fortyeighth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith ; and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, before the Honourable John Charles Dundas, M.P. (Chairman), John Thomas Wharton, John Richard Westgarth Hildyard, Esquires, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen, in the said riding ; and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses, and other Misdemeanors committed within the riding aforesaid,

It is resolved and ordered, that by virtue of the provisions of the Yorkshire Registries Act, 1884, the following Rules be, and they are hereby made by the said Justices as the County Authority for the said riding, under and for the purposes of the said Act.

#### Short Title.

1. These Rules may be cited as the North Riding of Yorkshire Registry Rules, 1885.

#### Commencement.

2. These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1885.

#### Interpretation.

3. In the construction of these Rules, the expression "the Act" means the Yorkshire Registries Act, 1884, and any words defined by the Act shall in these Rules have the meanings thereby assigned to them respectively.

#### Hours of Business.

4. The Registry Office shall be closed for all business on the days following :---

Christmas Day and the next following working day.

Good Friday, Easter Eve, and the Monday in Easter Week.

Monday and Tuesday in Whitsun Week.

The first Monday in August.

All days appointed by proclamation to be observed as days of public humiliation, fast, or thanksgiving.

or thanksgiving. Subject as aforesaid, the Registry Office shall be open for business every week day between such hours as the Registrar may, with the sanction of the County Authority, from time to time prescribe; and shall be open to the public every weekday but Saturday, between the hours of ten and four; and on Saturday, between the hours of ten and one.

#### Inspection of Registry by Public, &c.

5. Subject to the exceptions in these Rules contained at any times when the Registry Office is open to the public, any person may search the Register and any books and indexes required to be kept at the Registry Office under the Act or these Rules, and any registers, books, indexes, and other documents and instruments which are vested in the Clerk of the Peace by section 44 of the Act, and may take copies or extracts therefrom, upon payment of the fees prescribed with regard thereto respectively, provided that unless such person is a clerk or other person employed in the regular service of the office such copies or extracts shall be made with a lead pencil only, and not with any ink or other writing fluid.

Any such copies or extracts as aforesaid (not being certified copies or extracts) shall, when required, be made by persons employed in the office, as soon as conveniently may be, upon payment of the same fees as would be payable in respect thereof if made by the person requiring the same himself. Provided that no such person shall be required to make a copy or extract of or from any map or plan except upon payment of the actual cost of making the same estimated in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Registrar and the person requiring the same to be made, which amount the Registrar is hereby authorised to demand and take in respect thereof.

#### Forms.

6. The forms in the Schedule hereto shall be used in all matters to which they refer, or are capable of being applied or adapted, with such alterations and additions as are necessary to meet the circumstances of each case.

Copies of the said forms printed on official paper and issued under the sanction of the County Authority, shall be deemed to be accurate copies of the said forms, and to be on paper of the size and quality prescribed by these rules in respect of documents to be presented to the Registrar for enrolment.

No accidental error, omission, variance, or misdescription of the residences and occupations of any party to or person named in any memorial, affidavit, or other document to be enrolled or registered in the Registry in any point not necessary for the identification of any such party or person, shall prejudicially affect or make void the enrolment or registration thereof.

Description of Residence of Body Corporate.

7. Where in any case it is required under the Act or these Rules that a description of the residence of any body corporate should be set forth in any document, it shall be sufficient if the address of the registered office, or if there be no registered office, if the address of any office of such body corporate, be inserted therein, and for all or any of the purposes of Rules 11 and 15, a corporation may act by any of its officers authorised in that behalf under the seal of the corporation, a firm may act by any of its members, and a lunatic may act by his committee or curator bonis.

#### Size, &c., of Documents.

8. All documents which may be required to be enrolled (except Queen's Printers' copies of Acts of Parliament) and all requisitions for official searches shall be prepared in conformity with the Act and these Rules, and shall be presented to the Registrar for such enrolment, written or printed in legible characters upon strong wide-ruled demy paper of a size of 16 inches in length by 10 inches in breadth, or thereabouts, with an inner margin about 2 inches wide, and an outer margin about three-quarters of an inch wide.

Copies of Maps and Plans to be furnished.

9. Where any map or plan is endorsed upon or annexed to any instrument that may be required to be registered, an exact copy of such map or plan shall be drawn upon the copy or memorial of such instrument which is presented for actual enrolment in the Register, or drawn upon linen cloth and attached thereto.

#### Statutory Receipts.

10. For the purposes of the registration of a Statutory Receipt under the Act and these Rules, the parties to and lands affected by the conveyance upon which such receipt is endorsed shall be deemed to be the parties to and lands affected by the Statutory Receipt and shall as such be entered in the Book of Reference and the Indexes to be kept under the Act and these Rules in the same manner as if such receipt were a deed, provided that every such receipt shall be enrolled in the Register, at full length.

Enrolment of Instruments at full length.

11. Where any instrument is required to be enrolled in the Register at full length, a true copy of such instrument shall be presented for the purpose of being actually enrolled and bound up in the Register, and (except where such instrument is a caveat, or affidavit), there shall be prefixed to such copy a statement to be enrolled therewith setting forth the following particulars :--

- (a.) The name and description of the residence and occupation of the person on whose behalf the instrument is to be registered.
- (b.) The date of the instrument.
- (c.) (1.) In the case of a Deed, the names of the parties.

(2.) In the case of a Will, the name of the testator.

(3.) In the case of an Order of Court or of the Charity Commissioners, or certificate of appointment of trustee in bankruptcy, the title of the cause or matter wherein the same purports to be made, and the names of the parties thereto, if any.

(4.) In the case of a private Act of Parliament, the title of the Act.

(5.) In the case of an Order of the Land Commissioners, the name of the landowner whose lands are charged.

(6.) In the case of an Award of the Land Commissioners, the names of the persons in whose favour the award is made.

(7.) In the case of the Notice of a Will, the names of the testator and of the person by whom such notice is given.

(d.) (1.) In the case of an instrument other than a Will, the names of all the parishes wherein any lands known to be affected by such instrument are situate, in such manner as the same are expressed or mentioned in such instrument, or to the same effect.

(2.) In the case of a Will, the names of all the parishes wherein any lands known to be affected by such Will are situate, so far and in such manner as the same are expressed or mentioned in such Will, or to the same effect.

And such statement shall be signed by the person on whose behalf such instrument is to be registered.

#### Persons by whom Memorials are to be deemed to be required to be registered.

12. Every memorial, memorandum of charge, caveat, notice of will, affidavit of intestacy, or statement shall be deemed to be required to be registered on behalf of the person by whom the same is executed, signed, sworn, or made, except so far as it may otherwise appear therein.

Mode in which Registration is to be conducted.

13. (1.) Where any document is presented for enrolment in the Register an entry shall forthwith be made in the margin thereof of the date, hour, and minute when the same was delivered at the office, and such document, and any other document required to be produced to the Registrar in connection therewith for the purposes of registration, shall immediately be examined in order to ascertain :--

- (a.) That all stamp duty payable in respect of the instrument required to be registered and of the memorial thereof (if any) has been duly paid.
- (b.) That the document to be enrolled is in conformity with the requirements of the Act and of these Rules.

(2.) If the Registrar be not satisfied that all such stamp duty has been duly paid, and that the document presented for enrolment is in conformity with the requirements of the Act and these rules, he shall object to receive the same for the purpose of registration, and shall forthwith give notice of such objection and of the grounds thereof to the person on whose behalf the registration is required to be made or his authorized agent, and such document shall be deemed accordingly to have been not received at the office for the purpose of registration.

(3.) In any such case as in the last subsection mentioned, the Registrar shall cause provisional entries to be made in the Book of Reference and in the Indexes in like form as though such entries were made for the purpose of registration, but with notes appended thereto, showing that such entries are merely provisional. If, within one month after the date of such provisional registration, the Registrar is satisfied that his objection was not well founded, or if such objection shall at any time be declared by the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice to have been not well founded under any proceedings commenced in respect thereof in the said Court within the said period of one month, notice whereof has within the said period been served upon the Registrar, the said provisional registration shall become valid registration and the date of such provisional registration shall be deemed for all purposes to be the date of registration, and thereupon the Registrar shall proceed as in other cases where a document is duly presented to him for enrolment in the Register.

Where any notice of such proceedings as aforesaid is served upon the Registrar, he shall forthwith cause a note thereof to be made opposite the said provisional entries.

If within the said period of one month the Registrar is not satisfied that his objection was not well founded and no such notice of proceedings in the said Court is served upon the Registrar as aforesaid, the Registrar shall at the expiration of the said period of one month strike out the said provisional entries, and the said provisional registration shall be cancelled accordingly.

(4.) If the Registrar is satisfied that all such stamp duty has been duly paid, and that the document presented for enrolment is in conformity with the requirements of the Act and these Rules, he shall proceed as follows :---

- (a.) He shall cause the proper entries to be made in the Book of Reference.
- (b.) He shall cause an entry to be made on the face of the said document of the volume, page, and number of the Register where the same is to be enrolled.
- (c.) In any case where, under the provisions of section nine of the Act, a certificate is required to be endorsed on any instrument immediately after the registration thereof, he shall cause such certificate to be duly indorsed accordingly.
- (d.) Subject to any provisions of these Rules authorizing the retention of documents and the transmission thereof by post, he shall, as soon as conveniently may be, cause all documents produced to him for the purpose of registration, but not required to be retained at the office for the purpose of enrolment, to be returned upon request to the person on whose behalf the registration is required to be made, or his authorized agent; provided that no such document shall be allowed to leave the office unless and until a proper receipt for such document (if required by the Registrar) has been duly given, and all fees in connection with such registration have been duly paid.
- (e.) He shall forthwith cause the proper entries to be made in the Index of Names and the Index of Lands.
- (f.) As soon as may be he shall cause the document presented for enrolment to be duly enrolled in the Register (by causing the same to be bound up therein as by these Rules directed), in such a manner that the volume, page, and number of the Register where such document is so enrolled, shall correspond with the entry made in the Book of Reference relating thereto.

**Requisitions for Official Searches.** 

14. Every requisition for an official search for

any instrument registered or enrolled either before, or after the commencement of the Act, shall be signed by, or on behalf of, the person requiring the said search to be made.

The Registrar shall cause a Certificate of the result of the search made and signed by him and sealed with the seal of the Registry, to be given to the person requiring the same, and a duplicate thereof shall be bound up in the Record of Official Searches, and preserved at the Register Office.

#### Affidavits of Discharge of Mortgag-s, &c.

15. Where any document or documents may have been enrolled in the Register having reference to the creation or assignment of any mortgage, lien, or charge affecting any lands within the Riding, and such mortgage, lien, or charge is thereafter satisfied or discharged, the following provisions shall have effect.

- (1.) Any person entitled to or claiming to be entitled to any interest in such lands may present an affidavit of discharge with reference thereto, for enrolment, in the Register.
- (2.) Every such affidavit of discharge shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall be made by the person presenting the same for enrolment, and shall contain the following particulars :--
  - (a.) The name, residence, and description of the deponent.

(b.) A list setting forth every document having reference to the creation or assignment of such mortgage, lien, or charge, which has been enrolled in the Register, and against which it is desired that entries referring to such affidavit shall be made, and the volume, page, and number of the Register where each such document is so enrolled.

(c.) The names of all the parishes in which any lands affected by such mortgage, lien, or charge are situate.

(d.) The name and description of the residence and occupation of every person who immediately before the satisfaction or discharge of such mortgage, lien, or charge was entitled to the benefit thereof, and a statement that to the best of the knowledge  $\cdot$  and belief of the deponent no other person was entitled to the benefit thereof.

(e.) A statement of the fact that such mortgage, lien, or charge has been satisfied or discharged, setting forth the manner in which and the date when such satisfaction or discharge was effected.

Every such affidavit shall be deemed to be an affidavit made under the Act in order to be registered under the Act.

(3.) A consent in writing to the enrolment of such affidavit signed by every person named in the affidavit as being entitled to the benefit of such mortgage, lien, or charge (every such signature being verified by the oath of some credible witness) shall be produced to the Registrar at the time when the affidavit of discharge is presented, and where such mortgage, lien, or charge was originally created by deed or other writing, the original of such deed or writing, with an entry thereon, showing that such mortgage, lien, or charge is cancelled, shall be produced to the Registrar at the time when the affidavit of discharge is presented. Provided that where such original deed or writing cannot be so produced by reason of its having been lost or destroyed, a statutory declaration made by the person who would lawfully be entitled

to the custody of such deed or writing, if such mortgage, lien, or charge, were not satisfied or discharged, stating that such deed or writing has been lost or destroyed, shall be produced to the Registrar in lieu thereof.

- (4.) If the Registrar is not satisfied that the requirements of this rule have been duly complied with, he shall refuse to receive the affidavit of discharge for enrolment, and shall forthwith give notice of such refusal and of the grounds thereof to the person by whom such affidavit is presented, or his authorised agent.
- (5.) If the Registrar is satisfied that the requirements of this rule have been duly complied with, he shall receive the said affidavit for enrolment, and shall cause entries to be made thereon of the date when such affidavit was received for the purpose of enrolment, and of the volume, page, and number where the same is to be enrolled, and such affidavit shall be enrolled in the Register accordingly. The

Registrar shall also forthwith cause an entry to be made in the margin of every document set forth in the list of enrolled documents contained in such affidavit, stating that such attidavit has been enrolled in the Register and the place of such enrolment, and the date when such affidavit was received for the purposes thereof.

#### Removing and Cancelling of Caveats.

16. Where a Caveat has been enrolled in the Register and such Caveat is thereafter cancelled or discharged, an affidavit of discharge thereof may he enrolled in the Register; and the provisions of Rule 15 shall, so far as practicable, apply to such affidavit of discharge.

19. The Register shall consist of the documents which are presented for enrolment therein : such documents being filed in the order in which they are received, for the purposes of registration, and as soon as conveniently may be permanently bound up together in volumes, each containing not more than 500 such documents: provided that the County Authority may, if they think fit, at any time direct that, for convenience of reference, the documents affecting lands situate

within any specified divisions of the Riding shall be kept distinct and bound up in separate volumes, appropriated to such divisions respectively.

After any document has been enrolled in manner prescribed, it shall not be necessary to cause every leaf of the Register to be signed by any member of the County Authority pursuant to section 24 of the Act, but the Registrar shall sign the entry made in the margin of such document or page of register, and seal the same with the seal of the Register Office.

#### Record of Official Searches.

22. The Record of Official Searches shall consist of the duplicate certificates of the result of such searches which are retained at the office, such duplicates being filed in the order in which they are made and duly paged and numbered accordingly and, as soon as conveniently may be, permanently bound up together in volumes, each containing not more than 500 such copies.

The Record of Official Searches shall not be open to the inspection of the public.

## Sending of Deeds, &c., by Post.

23. Any document requiring to be sent to the Registry Office may be sent thereto in a prepaid cover by post; and any document requiring to be sent or returned to any person from the Registry Office shall, on due request being made in that behalf, be sent or returned by post, subject to the following conditions :—

- (o.) If the Registrar is requested to cause any document sent to him to be returned by post, there shall be sent with the document a cover for that purpose, duly addressed, and with stamps affixed thereon for the postage, and if required to be returned by registered post, with additional stamps affixed for the postal registration fee, together with a fee of sixpence for posting, which fee the Registrar is hereby authorized to demand and take in respect thereof.
- (b.) The Registrar shall not be responsible for any loss of or damage to any document which may happen in the course of its transmission to or from the office by post, or for any delay in such transmission.

#### Register, &c., not to be removed from Office without an Order.

24. No volume of any register, book, or index by the Act or these Rules directed to be kept at the Registry Office. and no document which has been enrolled therein shall be removed from the Registry Office, except in obedience to an order of the County Authority, or of an order or writ of any Court or Authority of Competent Jurisdiction.
