NOTICE is hereby given, that a Petition has been addressed to Her Majesty in Council by certain Inhabitant Householdors of the borough of Wareham, in the county of Dorset, praying that a CHARTER may be granted, whereby the powers and provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act may be extended to that borough; and notice is hereby further given, that the said Petition will be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The provisions of Article 1 (*Slaughter in Swine-Fever*) of The Animals Order of 1884, Swine-Fever Amendment are hereby suspended in favour of any swine liable to be slaughtered under that Article that may be in the possession or charge of Dr. Edward Emanuel Klein, or of any person or persons certified under his hand to be in his employment, at certain premises known as The Brown Institution, situate in the Wandsworth-road, in the parish of Lambeth, in the Metropolis, and such swine shall be and are hereby reserved for observation and treatment.

2. Notwithstanding anything in Article 66 of The Animals Order of 1884, no pig shall, during the continuance of this Order, be moved alive out of The Brown Institution aforesaid.

3. If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the person for the time being in the possession or charge of the pig, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

4. In this Order words have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1884.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at Monte Video, reporting that the quarantine regulations at that port have been modified as follows, viz. :—

1st. Vessels proceeding from ports formerly infected, but now officially declared free of cholera, will be subject on their arrival only to a precautionary visit of inspection, regulated by the Municipal Board of Health, that is, if no sickness of an epidemic character or grave suspicion of such have taken place on board of them during the voyage.

2nd. This visit can be dispensed with at the discretion of the Sanitary Board, which also retains its general powers of prescribing any necessary

precautions or measures for the safeguard of the public health.

3rd. The Order issued on September 12, regarding vessels proceeding from the ports of Naples and Toulon in particular, remains in full force till such time as the entire disappearance of the epidemic from the said ports be officially reported.

By these dispositions vessels proceeding from British ports are entirely freed from all the special quarantine restrictions published during the course of the late epidemic.

"Information having been received from the Health Board of Monte Video, that the steamers which sailed from Genoa for ports in the River Plate since the 24th October are in good sanitary condition, and it being known on official authority that no case of cholera has since occurred in that port, the National Board of Health, duly authorized by the Decree of the 29th of November, resolves:—

"1st. To admit vessels which sailed from Marseilles and Genoa before the 17th November, and since the disappearance of cholera, provided that their voyage has lasted more than fifty days.

"2nd. Further, to subject them to the provisions of the Ordinance of the 25th July last."

Metropolitan Board of Works.

AT a Meeting of the Board at their Office, Spring-gardens, Charing Cross, this 9th day of January, 1885, amongst the Orders is as follows:—

Metropolis Management Act, 1855; Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862; Division of the Parish of St. Leonard Bromley into Wards.

WHEREAS by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, Section 41, it is enacted: that "When at any time upon any account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament any of the parishes within the Metropolis not now divided into wards for the purpose of electing vestrymen shall be found to contain more than two thousand rated householders, it shall be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application in writing of the vestry or of not less than 500 rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine, and set out the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall, in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward, have regard as far as in their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three."

And whereas the parish of St. Leonard Bromley is within the limits of the Metropolis as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and is one of the parishes in Part I of Schedule B of that Act, and at the passing of the same Act the parish was not divided into wards.

And whereas not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish of St. Leonard Bromley have applied to us, the Metropolitan Board of Works, to divide the said parish into wards pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862.

And whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament that the said parish contains eight thousand one hundred and ten rated householders, and that the number of inhabited houses in the parish is returned at eight thousand two hundred and forty-one, and the rateable annual value of property at two hundred and three thousand six hundred and eighty pounds. Now the Metro-

politan Board of Works, having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament as contained in the census return for the year 1881, that the number of rated householders for the parish of St. Leonard Bromley is eight thousand one hundred and ten, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the same parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are

rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of St. Leonard Bromley be divided into three wards to be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the undermentioned schedule, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said schedule.
