NOTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold Levees at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Monday, the 2nd of March, and on Saturday, the 14th of March next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levees shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case he names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

**THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANI-
MALS) TRANSFER OF PARTS OF
DISTRICTS ACT, 1884.**

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most
Honourable Privy Council approved, on the 9th
day of February, 1885, of an Agreement bearing
date the 15th day of December, 1884, made

between the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of
the Borough of Monmouth, of the one part, and
Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the
County of Monmouth, in General Quarter Ses-
sions assembled, of the other part, whereby the
jurisdiction, for the purposes of The Contagious
Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, of the whole of
the district of the Borough of Monmouth was,
from and after the date of such approval by the
Privy Council as above, transferred to the district
of the County of Monmouth.

Curates is in receipt of a salary after a rate of
not less than one hundred and twenty pounds
per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum
or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so
long only as may to us appear to be expedient
under the circumstances from time to time affect-
ing the said rectory and parish of Jarrow.
