**N**OTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold Levees at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Monday, the 2nd of March, and on Saturday, the 14th of March next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levees shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEES TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Acting Consul at Fiume the following translation of a Notice issued by the Hungarian Government in relation to quarantine:—

Circular from the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government to all Royal Hungarian Port Offices and their Agencies.

As per order of the Royal Hungarian Ministry of Commerce, with despatch of this day, the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government ordered, that the sanitary observation of five days ordered with the Circular dated 18th December, 1884, No. 5849, for the arrivals from Algiers, Tunis, Italy, and Spain, if no case of infection occurred during the passage and every thing on board was in normal conditions, be suspended, as well as the medical examination for the arrivals from French ports, ordered with the Circular dated 20th January, A.C., No. 366, and the sanitary observation of twenty-four hours ordered with the Circular dated 10th February, No. 726, for the arrivals from East Indies.

The present Order is applicable also to vessels arrived from these countries and now undergoing the prescribed observation of five days.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Notice respecting quarantine issued by the Italian Government, viz.:—

1885. ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH, No. 1. Cholera being officially known to have entirely ceased in Algeria:

The Minister of the Interior decrees:

ART. 1. The quarantine imposed by Ordinance No. 45 of December 17th, 1884, against arrivals from Algeria, is revoked from this day forth for vessels with clean bills and without sickness on board; they will receive pratique after a medical inspection.

ART. 2. From this day forth the importation of rags, tatters, old unwashed clothes, used bedding, lint, and selfages from Algeria, will be regulated by the order in the first line of Article 8 of the Ministerial Decree of December 17th, 1884.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at the Hague, reporting that Notifications, signed by the Minister of the Interior, have been published in the Official Gazettes of the Netherlands of the 20th and 21st instant, to the effect that, in con-

sequence of the cessation of Asiatic cholera in Spain, Tunis, and Algiers, the resolutions, dated respectively the 5th of September and 22nd of November of last year, by which the harbours of those countries were declared to be infected, ceased to be in force on and after the 19th instant; and further, that cholera having ceased to prevail epidemically in Europe, the resolutions of the 5th of September, the 10th of November, and the 22nd of December last, whereby the importation or transit in the Netherlands of rags, clothing that had been worn, and unwashed body and bed linen were prohibited, will cease to have effect on and after the 23rd instant.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer.

Aston Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Aston Union, in the county of Warwick;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers and Assistants to Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Aston Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows:

“The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination Officer such Salary or remuneration, and such only, as the Local Government Board may direct or approve, whether for ordinary duties or for occasional services; and such salary or remuneration may be increased or reduced as that Board may from time to time direct or approve.”

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said

Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Aston Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said Aston Union, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso:

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer or Assistant Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker:—

Hereford Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Hereford Union, in the County of Hereford;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Hereford Union, it is required that certain accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Hereford Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Union for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to Our consent, or be removed by Us, or be proved to be insane by evidence which We may deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to Us of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with Our assent appoint a person or persons to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker, for a limited period only.

ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the accounts termed respectively the “Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account” and the “Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account.”

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the “Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account” and the “Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account.”

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V, submit to him the Stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Order dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
